

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission - January 4th, 2012

At 4:00 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, David Schwartz, Craig Neys, and Mark T. Klose answered the roll call.

The commission reorganized for 2012. Ova made a motion seconded by Marks to nominate Klose for Chairman. Roll call vote: Ova, Marks, Schwartz, Neys, Klose, voted aye.

Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Neys to nominate Ova for Vice-Chairman. Roll call vote: Klose, Ova, Marks, Schwartz, Neys, voted aye.

There was discussion on the sub-committee appointments for 2012. It was consensus of the board to leave it the same. Neys brought up a question as to why we don't have a representative on the Stutsman County Fair Board. Information will be gathered and brought back to the next meeting.

Mickey Nenow, County Highway Superintendent, reported that they are doing rocking on the county roads and that they are working with various FEMA projects. Superintendent Nenow also reported that he is interviewing a person for the open shop foreman position on January 4, 2012.

Auditor/COO Bradley informed the board that there were three applicants with varying levels of experience for the County Highway Superintendent Position. Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Ova to interview the internal candidate, Mickey Nenow, first. Roll call vote: Schwartz, Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks, voted aye. The interview will take place at 3:30 p.m. Tuesday, February 7, 2012.

Neys made a motion, seconded by Schwartz to approve the minutes of the December 2011 meetings. Motion carried.

Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney, presented his monthly report. Most of the items had been discussed previously. There was a question as to how many signatures were needed for an initiated measure on The Home Rule Charter. Attorney General's opinion was requested by Hoveland regarding initiated measures or amendment repeals on the Home Rule Charter. Initiated measure means it comes from the people. A taxpayer purchased a mobile home from Green Tree and was trying to move it before the end of the year because he would have to pay taxes on it again. He has not had a chance to look at this thoroughly. State's Attorney Fremgen also stated that his staff has been working on Title VI and he is currently working seven days per week because of the upcoming trials. Unfortunately, he has not had a chance to fully review the Turnkey Contract.

Jerry Bergquist, 911/Emergency Manager, informed the board that Stutsman County received a Homeland Security Grant in the amount of \$54,405.00. The grant requires a 7% match that will come from the 911 monies in the amount of \$4,095.00 for a grand total of \$58,500.00. This grant will be used to narrow band approximately 450 portable and mobile radios within the county. FCC is requiring Stutsman County to change their radios to narrow band or they will lose

the radio licenses. This needs to be accomplished by the end of 2012. Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Neys to accept the Homeland Security Grant. Motion Carried.

With the approval of the Communications Center agreement, it was always assumed that the Police Department were the supervisors. With the acceptance of the agreement, it was agreed that the Jamestown Police Department will provide assistance and not have a supervisory role. The Communications Department needs two additional Communication Specialist III positions that have supervisory capabilities. Jerry Bergquist is asking for consideration to have two Communication Specialists II, Christi Jarland and Scott Cebula, move to a Communication Specialist III position which would cost an estimated \$738.00 for the year. Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Marks to approve the request to move two Communication Specialist II positions to a Communication Specialist III position. Roll call vote: Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks, Schwartz, voted aye.

Emergency Manager Bergquist also mentioned that the Bureau of Reclamation closed the gate at the Jamestown Reservoir. They have a bypass open which is an underground 10" pipe. It is running at 13 cfs –down from 60 cfs. We are close to equilibrium.

Neys made a motion, seconded by Ova to approve the following 2011 Year End Transfers, the 2012 Automatic Transfers and the 2012 Payments on Demand. Roll call vote: Klose, Ova, Marks, Schwartz, Neys, voted aye.

Auditor/COO Bradley presented information on a request for proposal for inmate meals. Currently, the jail at year end is operating \$378,000 in the red and is seeing ten less paying customers per day right now. In trying to find more savings, Tracey Trapp and Casey talked with Airmark Food Service and they sent in a proposal. Currently the jail can produce meals for approximately \$4.37 per meal in 2011 and projected that it will cost \$4.51 per meal in 2012. We did receive a proposal from a contractor which wasn't competitive, but estimated they could make meals for approximately \$2.63 per meal based on the same volume. This would save roughly \$125,000.00 over our current method. When the proposals do come in we are hoping that the savings will be more competitive and result in even higher savings. We will be having a walk through tour on January 18th, January 26th is the due date for any addendums, February 2nd the request for proposals are due, and February 7th the proposal will be presented for approval. The committee to review the proposals will be Tracey Trapp, Chad Kaiser, Casey Bradley, and Ashley Heitcamp.

TurnKey Corrections will provide vending and commissary services for the jail. This will alleviate workload pressures on the staff. They have a smartcard service where inmates or families could put money on the card for the inmates to use. Stutsman County would receive 17% proceeds from all vending and commissary services. We also would be able to have video visitation which would cost approximately \$1,000.00 per terminal. We would need four or five terminals. The only cost to Stutsman County would be the power and data lines. A motion was made by Ova, seconded by Schwartz to approve the TurnKey Contract. Roll call vote: Ova, Marks, Schwartz, Neys, Klose, voted aye.

Ova made a motion, seconded by Neys to approve the Individuals Motorcycle Club Charity Permit 281 Stop Poker Tournament. Motion Carried.

Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Ova to approve the Beer License Application and the Annual Sunday Beer Permit for Speedway Concessions, Inc. Motion Carried.

Auditor/COO Bradley presented information on the Jail Roof Contract. Stutsman County had multiple issues with the architect firm that is overseeing the jail roof. The architect firm failed to get insurance certification from the contractor and they took it upon themselves to change the completion date of the project from October 1 to January 15th without any change orders. The completion date may have been negotiated but was never agreed upon by the County Commission Board formally. Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Ova to approve the amended contract with the change of the completion date from October 1st, 2011 to January 15th, 2012. Motion Carried.

Ova made a motion, seconded by Neys, to approve the 2011 Accounts Payable and the 2012 Monthly Bills. Roll call vote: Marks, Schwartz, Neys, Klose, Ova, voted aye.
