

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission

January 5, 2010

At 4:00 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, Doug Kaiser, Craig Neys and Mark T. Klose answered roll call.

A motion was made by Kaiser seconded by Ova to approve the minutes of the December 2009 meetings. Motion carried.

The Commission reorganized for 2010. Noel Johnson, County COO, requested nominations for chairman. A motion was made by Ova seconded by Kaiser to nominate Mark Klose for chairman. Marks made a motion seconded by Neys to cease nominations and cast a unanimous ballot for Mark Klose. Motion carried.

Klose chaired the remainder of the meeting.

Kaiser made a motion seconded by Neys to nominate Dennis Ova for Vice-chairman. Motion carried.

Lindsey Larson, JSDC Marketing/Business Development Specialist, requested \$9,600 on a 80/20 City/County split to continue funding the internship program with Jamestown College. Kaiser made a motion seconded by Ova to approve \$1,920 in County funds for the program. Roll call vote – Ova – aye, Marks – nay, Kaiser – aye, Neys – aye and Klose – aye. Motion carried.

Ova made a motion seconded by Kaiser to reduce the mileage reimbursement rate from \$0.55 to \$0.50 per mile to follow the same rate reduction made by the State. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Ova seconded by Kaiser to approve the following 2010 automatic transfers and 2010 bills to be paid upon demand. Roll call vote – Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose and Ova voted aye.

Marks made a motion seconded by Neys to approve the following 2009 fund transfers. Transfer from Fund 10 - \$325,770.75 to Fund 23 - \$105,000.00 and to Fund 52 - \$220,770.72; from Fund 11 to Fund 53 - \$100,000.00; from Fund 14 to Fund 23 - \$114,600.00; from Fund 15 - \$13,100.00 to Fund 52 - \$5,600 and to Fund 54 - \$7,500.00; from Fund 23 to Fund 41 - \$50,000.00; from Fund 32 - to Fund 15 - \$1,300,000.00; from Fund 43 to Fund 39 - \$20,000; from Fund 46 to Fund 30 - \$340,000.00; and from Fund 58 to Fund 18 - \$390,000.00. Roll call vote - Kaiser, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks voted aye.

Darrell Wollan, Jamestown City Assessor, presented an abatement application by Richard and Donna LeFevre. The abatement requested a true and full value reduction on PCL # 74-4245000 from \$93,100 to \$77,200 for 2008. In January 2009, the Lefevre's had requested a property review. Wollan had lowered the property value for 2009. The City recommended denying the application. Donna LeFevre commented that they had owned the property for 10 years; the property was an older home that had some deficiencies; and the property value had increased almost every year. After receiving their 2008 tax statements, they felt that the value was higher than what they could sell their home for so they requested the reevaluation. After their request, the property value was decrease by 17%. Noel Johnson, County Director of Tax Equalization, recommended denying the application. Johnson stated that no appraisal or other information was presented to support the request; property assessments are uniform and may be above or below market value as long as they are within a reasonable variation. Ova made a motion seconded by Neys to concur with the City and deny the application. Motion carried.

Max Wetz, Partnership Specialist – Denver Regional Census Center, presented information on the upcoming decennial census. In mid-March, a short form questionnaire would be sent out. \$400 billion of Federal aid was allocated to local governments based on census information. In North Dakota, the amount was about \$10,000 per individual. A joint City-County complete count committee was requested. The committee would help disseminate information to stress the importance of census participation. The Commission would solicit volunteers for the committee.

Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney, gave his monthly report. If the Commission passed a fuel tax ordinance, the State Tax Department could not assist with collection. The County would have to create enforcement rules. Enforcement and collection of the tax could be difficult without a mechanism to ascertain where the fuel was coming from and where it was being sold and to whom. An Attorney General's opinion indicated that if the County passed an overweight ordinance, the County could not keep the overweight fines. The ND Association of Counties could be asked to assist with legislation that would allow keeping fines, and they could be asked to work on legislation for a statewide fuel tax for the benefit of all Counties. Fremgen indicated that one of the individuals responsible for the Parkhurst shelter vandalism had proposed paying half the damages.

Steve Thompson, Interstate Engineering, reported that there were no more wetland mitigation acres available from ND Department of Transportation for replacing filled wetlands on County highway projects. The five County grade raise projects that would be bid this spring had about 6 acres of wetlands. The projects could not be bid before acquisition of mitigation acres. The County would have to purchase land and build or restore wetlands to US Fish and Wildlife specifications or seek private land owners willing to restore wetlands for a fee.

Mike Zimmerman, County Highway Superintendent, gave his monthly report. ND DOT indicated that there would likely be additional federal stimulus funds. Potential use of the \$300,000 to \$400,000 would be thin-lift asphalt overlays, chip sealing or bridge repair/replacement. Zimmerman would work with Interstate Engineering and prepare options for the Commission.

Zimmerman presented a snow removal agreement between the City of Jamestown and the County. The agreement modified a prior agreement that defined the roads that would be cleared by the City and the roads that would be cleared by the County. Ova made a motion seconded by Marks to approve the agreement. Motion carried.

Jerry Bergquist, 9-1-1 Coordinator/Emergency Manager, requested a snow emergency declaration. The three day snow event December 24, 25 and 26 exceeded the 3 day snow record and the \$100,000 plus cost incurred by local Cities, Townships and the County exceeded the \$70,763 cost threshold so federal disaster funds may be available. If there was a Presidential disaster declaration for the State, 85% of the snow removal cost would be reimbursed. A motion was made by Kaiser seconded by Ova to declare a County snow emergency. Motion carried.

Daphne Drewello, Acting Library Director, updated the Commission on the activities of the James River Valley Library System (combined County/City library). She reviewed the budget modifications. Both facilities would continue to be open for now. The County facility was being automated.

Karen Samek, County Recorder, requested appointing a Deputy Recorder to fill the vacancy created by the retirement of Dorothy Robyt. Marks made a motion seconded by Kaiser to appoint Jamie Anderson-Ruff as Deputy Recorder and to move her to the salary system pay for the position (grade 8 step1). Motion carried.

Neys made a motion seconded by Ova to transfer \$175,000 from the Weed Control Fund (Fund 24) to the Weed Board Capital Improvement Fund (Fund 49). Motion carried.

A motion was made by Ova seconded by Neys to approve the gaming site authorization request of Rice-Deede Post 205 at Stubs Pub in Woodworth. Motion carried.

At 5:42 p.m. the County Commission meeting was recessed for the County Park Board meeting.
