

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission

February 2, 2010

At 4:00 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, Doug Kaiser, Craig Neys and Mark T. Klose answered roll call.

A motion was made by Marks seconded by Neys to approve the minutes of the January 2010 meetings. Motion carried.

Marks made a motion seconded by Ova to appoint Char Freeberg to a 3 year term on the Stutsman County/City of Jamestown Joint Library Board. Motion carried.

Noel Johnson, County COO, presented the 2009 year end Expenditure Budget Amendments. A motion was made by Marks seconded by Kaiser to approve the following 2009 expenditure budget amendments: Fund 10 - \$2,531,889 to \$2,681,889; Fund 16 - \$8,000 to \$28,300; Fund 19 - \$248,000 to \$260,000; Fund 22 - \$92,100 to \$1,610,000; Fund 23 - \$2,252,606 to \$2,307,606; Fund 30 - \$1,010,900 to \$1,120,900; Fund 31 - \$4,000 to \$5,000; Fund 40 - \$140,000 to \$170,000; Fund 52 - \$0 to \$61,000; Fund 53 - \$155,867 to \$185,867; Fund 54 - \$100 to \$10,000; Fund 57 - \$4,950 to \$13,950; Fund 63 - \$0 to \$52,000; Fund 64 - \$0 to \$11,000; and Fund 69 - \$36,000 to \$41,000. Roll call vote – Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose voted aye.

The public hearing was held to consider adoption of a resolution and zoning ordinance amendment that would allow participation in the National Flood Insurance Program. Jerry Bergquist, 9-1-1 Coordinator/ Emergency Manager, and Johnson reviewed the ordinance. The Stutsman County Zoning Board recommended adoption. Nellie Degen spoke in favor of adoption so homeowners would have the opportunity to purchase flood insurance. Jim Weight, Building Inspector-City of Jamestown, spoke in favor of adoption - the City's one mile extra-territorial zoning would be similar to the rules within City limits. Ova made a motion seconded by Neys to adopt the zoning amendment. Roll call vote – Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose and Ova voted aye.

Jim Fettig, Courthouse Maintenance Supervisor, presented the plumbing parts and labor quotations and the electrical parts and labor quotations. Plumbing Bids: Arneson Plumbing, Heating & Air Conditioning - Labor - \$50.00/hour/man (Time ½ after hours), Materials - Cost + 20%; Bob's Plumbing & Heating Inc. - Labor - \$55.00/hour/man, Materials - Cost + 10%. Electrical Bids: Curtis Electric – Labor - \$40.00/hour/man, Materials - Cost + 10%; Scott's Electric - Labor - \$42.00/hour/man, Materials - Cost + 10%; Advantage Electric Inc. – Labor - \$40.00/hour/man, Materials - Cost + 10%. Ova made a motion seconded by Marks to accept both plumbing bids with preference to the low bid. Roll call vote – Kaiser, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks voted aye. Kaiser made a motion seconded by Neys to accept all three electrical bids with preference to the low bids. Roll call vote – Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks and Kaiser voted aye.

Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney, reviewed his monthly report. The Vet's Club lease was still in effect even though the term of the lease had expired.

Steve Thompson, Interstate Engineering, presented the \$25,000 preliminary engineering contract for the bridge on the Valley Road south of Ypsilanti. The contract would prepare plans up to the structure selection report. Kaiser made a motion seconded by Marks to approve the contract. Roll call vote – Klose, Ova, Marks, Kaiser and Neys voted aye.

Mike Zimmerman, County Highway Superintendent, gave his monthly report. He indicated there was a possibility that enough stimulus funds may be available to pay for almost all the Ypsilanti bridge project. Because this was only a possibility, he recommended proceeding with engineering plans to seal coat County Highway 68. The plans were good for three years and could be updated after that if necessary.

Zimmerman requested permission to advertise for one replacement employee and two potential replacement employees. A motion was made by Kaiser seconded by Ova to advertise for one Equipment III Operator position and two Equipment II Operator positions.

The ER projects were on hold until wetland mitigation acres were acquired. Zimmerman would contact other Counties about possibly getting acres from them and replacing the acres later. Johnson would contact NRCS for a list of landowners with drained wetlands that could be contacted to solicit possible purchase of their wetlands. An article in the newspaper and advertising would be pursued to inform the public of the County's desire to purchase wetlands from private land owners.

Zimmerman presented the Federal Aid Certification for signature. The County had accumulated \$900,000 in Federal road construction funds the past two years. The annual allocation would be decreasing by at least 25% for the foreseeable future. Because of the high cost of construction, most

future projects would require staged construction. Kaiser made a motion seconded by Neys to approve the certification. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Ova seconded by Kaiser to approve out-of-state travel for two Road Department employees to attend the Titan Machinery training facility in Tomahawk, Wisconsin. Motion carried.

The County could install rumble strips on County roads that connected to State Highways at a reduced cost. The work would be done when the State was installing the strips on their highway. Zimmerman would check out the cost.

Zimmerman recommended a road planning committee comprised of Commissioner Kaiser, Commissioner Marks, Johnson, Zimmerman and Steve Thompson from Interstate Engineering. The committee would formulate work plans for the road department including identifying roads for possible recycling. The meetings would be scheduled and advertised to allow public comment. Kaiser made a motion seconded by Marks to form the committee. Motion carried.

Dave Orr, County Sheriff, requested permission to advertise for a replacement pickup. The cost had been budgeted. Kaiser made a motion seconded by Ova to advertise for vehicle bids. Motion carried.

At 5:15 p.m. the County Commission meeting was recessed for the County Park Board meeting.

A motion was made by Ova seconded by Woodward to approve payment of the monthly bills. Roll call vote - Woodward, Schlecht, Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose voted aye.
