

## Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission – February 2, 2021

At 3:30 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Ramone Gumke, Joan Morris, Steven Cichos, and Mark Klose answered the roll call.

Chairman Klose presented the 2020 Stutsman County Service Awards.

A motion to approve the January 2020 meeting minutes was made by Cichos, seconded by Gumke. Motion carried.

Brian Washburn, Juvenile Court Officer III, discussed a parking space for Youthworks. In 2019 their office was allocated monies from the Supreme Court for diversion. A contract with Youthworks was entered into for mentoring services. This is an agency that provides services to youth in North Dakota. Washburn requested approval of a parking spot for the mentor vehicle. The commission agreed to allow them to park their mentor vehicle toward the east-end of the parking lot.

A recommendation to award the motor grader bid from January 25, 2021 to RDO John Deere was made by Mickey Nenow. A motion to award the bid to RDO John Deere was made by Ova, seconded by Cichos. Roll call vote: Ova, Gumke, Morris, Cichos and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.

Gumke made a motion, seconded by Morris, to allow Nenow to request to advertise for 2021 chip sealing of roughly 16 miles. Motion carried.

Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney, presented his monthly report. Joseph Nwoga's, Attorney II, last day is February 8, 2021. Jeffery Holt, Attorney I, starts on February 5, 2021. Fremgen requested authorization to spend \$8,000.00 in unexpended attorney salary to pay a law student \$20/hour to law clerk 10 weeks in the summer of 2021. Gumke made a motion to approve the request, seconded by Ova. Gumke, Morris, Cichos, Klose and Ova voted aye. Motion carried.

Restructuring of the Communications Center operations was presented by Shannon Larson, Human Resource Director. The LEC Governing Board recommended the proposal to leave the communications support position vacant and create and hire an additional communication specialist position. Cichos made a motion to accept the recommendation, seconded by Morris. Roll call vote: Morris, Cichos, Klose, Ova and Gumke voted aye. Motion carried.

Budget adjustments for 2020 were presented by Nicole Meland. A motion to approve the budget adjustments was made by Cichos, seconded by Ova. Roll call vote: Cichos, Klose, Ova, Gumke, Ramone and Morris voted aye.

At 4:05 p.m., the Commission meeting recessed for the County Park Board meeting.

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Park Board – February 2, 2021

At 4:05 p.m., the Stutsman County Park Board was called to order. Dennis Ova, Ramone Gumke, Joan Morris, Steven Cichos, Mark Klose, Jason Houge, and Robert Martin answered the roll call.

A motion to approve the presented January 2020 meeting minutes was made by Ova, seconded by Houge. Motion carried.

Daren Peterka, Interstate Engineering, discussed survey maps for the cabin sites. Lot lines have not been finalized.

The 2020 season review was presented by Lazy Fish, LLC.

Lazy Fish, LLC presented and requested approval of 2021 proposed projects including installation of additional campsites, adding storage tanks for additional sewer sites, converting some tent area into parking and a new playground, continued remodeling to the bathhouse and replacement of cabin mattresses. Ova made a motion, seconded by Gumke, to approve the project application. Roll call vote: Klose, Martin, Houge, Ova, Gumke, Morris and Cichos voted aye. Motion carried.

There will no longer be a Park Committee. The Stutsman County Park Board will act as the committee as well.

Stutsman County Park Board discussed the NDFU permit.

Approval of cabin site permit renewals for 64W, 60W, 8W and 10E were requested. Ova made a motion, seconded by Morris, to approve the permits as presented. Motion carried.

Karl Bergh, Park Superintendent discussed 2021 grazing and hay land permits. The current renter pays \$1,500 a year for the hay-land South of the Game and Fish. In 2020, Stutsman County received \$13.50 per acre for grazing fees. The North Dakota Department of Trust says the minimum is \$12 and the maximum is \$45. The average is \$24.70. It is a rocky area that is being used as grazing land. Some landowners would like to meet as a group and go over the hay land and grazing permits and fees.

Bergh discussed Lakeside camping fees. Cabin rentals have a lodging tax. Stutsman County loses \$2.14 of revenue every time a cabin is rented out. Ft. Ransom charges \$60 a cabin. A fee of \$50 is common. Additional tax would be covered. The campground is full every weekend in the summer months.

At 5:12 p.m., Houge left the meeting.

Gumke made a motion to approve the \$50 cabin fee, seconded by Martin. Motion carried.

Cichos made a motion to approve the monthly bills, seconded by Ova. Roll call vote: Ova, Gumke, Morris, Cichos, Klose and Martin voted aye. Motion carried.
