

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission

February 3, 2009

At 4:00 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular monthly meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, Doug Kaiser, Craig Neys and Mark T. Klose answered roll call.

A motion to approve the minutes of the January, 2009 meetings was made by Ova and seconded by Marks. Motion carried.

The Commission opened and reviewed the plumbing parts and labor bids. Bob's Plumbing and Heating Inc: labor - \$55 per hour, parts – cost plus 10%; Arneson Plumbing Heating and Air Conditioning: labor - \$50 per hour, parts – cost plus 20%. Ova made a motion that was seconded by Kaiser to accept both bids and to allow the maintenance supervisors to select the firm that would be in the best interest of the County on a project by project basis. Motion carried.

The Commission opened and reviewed the electric parts and labor bids. Scott's Electric: labor - \$42 per hour, parts – cost plus 10%; Curtis Electric: labor - \$39 per hour, parts – cost plus 10%. A motion was made by Neys and seconded by Kaiser to accept both bids and to allow the maintenance supervisors to select the firm that would be in the best interest of the County on a project by project basis. Motion carried.

Ova made a motion that was seconded by Kaiser to place the following persons in nomination for the Stutsman County/Jamestown Joint Library Board. Nominees are: Judy Brueske, Char Freeberg, Margaret Harding, LaRae Jorgensen, Lynn Krueger, Ann Osborne and Becky VanErem. The nominees would be asked to attend the next meeting so the Commission could acquaint themselves with all of the nominees. Motion carried.

Jerry Bergquist, 9-1-1 Coordinator/Emergency Manager, presented a resolution that would declare a snow emergency within Stutsman County. The declaration would free up County emergency funds and it would qualify the County for possible inclusion in the State's program to assist local governments for snow removal costs. Marks made a motion that was seconded by Ova to pass the resolution declaring a snow emergency. Roll call vote – Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose voted aye.

Bergquist reviewed the Governor's program to assist those Counties that have had snow removal costs exceeding 400% of their normal amount. The program would reimburse 50% of snow removal costs since January 1, 2009 on all costs that exceed 200% of the five year average costs. A motion was made by Kaiser and seconded by Neys to submit a letter to request that Stutsman County be included in the program. Roll call vote – Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose and Ova voted aye.

Mike Zimmerman, County Highway Superintendent, gave his monthly report. The total Township debt to the County for snow and road maintenance was now over \$800,000. He was having difficulty getting the Townships to return the maps that would designate the roads they wanted the County to continue to maintain for snow removal. Guthmiller Construction was done pushing back the built up snow along the County roads. As of now, there was no Presidential disaster declaration. Marks made a motion that was seconded by Kaiser to designate Mickey Nenow as applicant agent for any potential disaster declaration. Motion carried.

Charles Block, resident of Sharlow Township, voiced his concerns over the lack of snow removal by the Township. Commissioner Klose reviewed the County Road policy for snow removal that requires the Townships to designate the roads that the Township wants plowed and the Townships tell the County when to plow the designated roads – the County contracts with the Townships. Mr. Block indicated that

his children had missed school and his wife was staying in town so she could get to work. He requested that he be included in the Township's snow route. Zimmerman responded that the Township had contacted a contractor to assist with snow removal.

Zimmerman requested permission to advertise for gravel crushing bids. Ova made a motion that was seconded by Neys to advertise for gravel crushing bids. Motion carried.

Richard Brown, Chairman, Sharlow County Township Board, commented on the statements made by Mr. Block and stated that he and the other members of the Township Board and neighbors have done everything they can to help them get in and out of their residence.

Zimmerman updated the Commission on potential legislation that would mandate 105,500 pound weight limits on all County roads. A motion was made by Kaiser and seconded by Marks to allow Zimmerman to testify on behalf of the County and to strongly oppose the bill. Motion carried.

The Commission discussed traffic counts on County roads. Obtaining new counts could cost \$20,000 to \$30,000. It could be up to 10 years before the County could afford to do a major project. By then, any counts done today would be obsolete.

Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney, gave his monthly report. He presented his annual statistical report. Misdemeanors were down, mental health cases remained about the same, and felonies were up. Prescription drug abuse was the most current reoccurring problem. He reviewed legislative issues on wind farms, home rule counties, indigent defense and electronic monitoring of prisoners.

A motion was made by Kaiser and seconded by Marks to nominate Jane Trautman for the Buffalo City Tourism Foundation Board. Motion carried.

Ova made a motion that was seconded by Neys to approve the raffle permit of Union Local 7-0953. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Kaiser and seconded by Marks to request the ND Department of Transportation to prepare plats and deeds to Stutsman County for all that part of the road right of way along old Highway #10 that was not previously deeded to the County. Motion carried.

Kaiser made a motion that was seconded by Neys to pay the monthly bills. Roll call vote – Kaiser, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks voted aye.
