

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission

February 6, 2007

At 4:00 p.m. the regular monthly meeting of the Stutsman County Commission was called to order by Chairman Klose. Roll call was answered by Douglas Kaiser, Craig Neys, Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, and Mark Klose. Also present were Mike Zimmerman, Russel Kroshus, Chip Steckler, Dale Van Erem, Kevin Sikich, Ed Meidinger, Tyler Lamp, Harold Newman, Nellie Degen, Laurie Mosolf, and Lori Carlson.

The bids for a new motor grader with new snow wing and plow were opened. Also present for the bid opening were Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney, Mike Zimmerman, County Highway Superintendent, and Jerry Brickner, County Engineer. The bids were:

Titan Machinery, Bismarck, ND - 2006 865 DHP for \$172,576.44 less trade of \$70,750.00 for a net price of \$101,826.44 with a optional extended warranty of \$11,945.00. Guarantee buyback of \$83,000 for motorgrader only; \$84,500 for motorgrader with snow wing; and \$86,500 for motorgrader with snow wing and snow plow. Optional bid for new ripper \$6,500 and for a new packer \$15,444.

Butler Machinery Company, Fargo, ND - 2007 140H for \$216,000 less trade of \$65,000 for a net price of \$151,000 with a optional extended warranty of \$10,794. Guarantee buyback of \$85,000 for motorgrader only; \$87,000 for motorgrader with snow wing; and \$88,000 for motorgrader with snow wing and snow plow. Optional bid for new ripper \$10,952.

Sweeney Brothers, Fargo, ND - 2007 Volvo G-940 for \$195,857 less trade of \$70,000 for a net price of \$125,857 with a optional extended warranty of \$13,118. Guarantee buyback of \$85,000 for motorgrader only; \$86,900 for motorgrader with snow wing; and \$87,900 for motorgrader with snow wing and snow plow. Optional bid for new ripper \$12,000.

RDO Equipment, Bismarck, ND - 2007 JD 770-D for \$205,925 less trade \$62,270 for a net price of \$143,655 with an optional extended warranty of \$8,900. Guarantee buyback of \$99,025 for motorgrader only; \$102,525 for motorgrader with snow wing; \$105,025 for motorgrader with snow wing and snow plow. Optional bid for new ripper \$8,900 and for a new packer \$16,275.

Iron Planet, Pleasanton, CA - Outright purchase of 1992 Cat 140G with Falls wing and plow for \$60,150.

The Commission tabled the bids for further review.

Mike Zimmerman requested out of state travel for three Road Department employees to attend the Case Experience Training Center in Tomahawk, Wisconsin February 27 through March 1. Neys made a motion that was seconded by Kaiser to allow the out of state travel. Motion carried.

Zimmerman requested out of state travel to attend a pavement recycling workshop in Brooklyn Center, Minnesota on February 28. A motion was made by Ova and seconded by Neys to allow the out of state travel. Motion carried.

Zimmerman requested permission to attend the National Association of Civil Engineers (NACE) conference in Milwaukee, Wisconsin April 22nd through the 26th. Because he was a member of the executive board, the ND association would pay his conference registration fees. A motion was made by Kaiser and seconded by Marks to allow the out of state travel. Motion carried.

Zimmerman requested allowing movement to grade 9, step 5 instead of step 4 for the new shop foreman. The assistant foreman had been promoted to the foreman position. Unless the change was allowed, the new position would only pay \$0.03 per hour more than his old job. Kaiser made a motion that was seconded by Ova to authorize grade 9, step 5 for the shop foreman. Roll call vote - Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose all voted aye.

Fritz Fremgen gave his monthly report. The Stutsman County State Bank case had settled. All the entities that received bank tax funds would be asked to help pay for the attorney fees.

Harold Newman, president of The Newman Group, requested a 20 year tax exemption for the proposed 100 million gallon ethanol plant in Spiritwood Township. With Cargill Malt's expansion, Great River Energy's coal co-generation plant, and the ethanol plant, the total estimated cost of the project was around \$400 million. The 20 year tax waiver would help this plant to compete with plants in Minnesota. Minnesota had a longer growing season and they were closer to the market. The exemption was requested for all of the plant's components including the railroad spur. He estimated \$138,000 as the annual tax this facility would pay. Commissioner Marks

questioned the amount that JSDC had committed to the property. \$6 million in grant and equity funds had been committed by JSDC.

Speaking for the North Central-Spiritwood-Wimbledon-Courtenay(NCSWC) School District, Chip Steckler proposed that the Commission consider a 3 year, 100% property tax exemption, 4th year - 75% exemption, 5th year - 50% exemption, 6th year - 25% exemption and fully taxing the facility on the 7th year. He also proposed an annual revenue sharing agreement so 2/3 of the school taxes would go to the NCSWC school district and 1/3 would go to the Jamestown school district.

Connie Ova, CEO - JSDC, gave statistics on wages and the economic impact of the proposed facilities. No experience starting wages would be over \$10 per hour with wages \$60,000 to \$80,000 or higher. A 100 million gallon ethanol plant would impact the local economy by \$223 million annually and affect 1,573 jobs. It would increase household annual income by \$50 million. A \$.10 per bushel increase in corn prices would increase local farm income by \$838,000. She requested that the Commission consider the applicant - his contributions as a community leader for many years - what would the commission do to try to attract a business similar to this project.

Commissioner Klose indicated that the Commission needed to balance the new business exemption requests with infrastructure needs. The County had a history of past exemptions and their decision could impact future project applicants. Commissioner Ova made a motion that was seconded by Neys to table the request. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Kaiser and seconded by Ova to waive the notice to competitors requirement as there were no competing facilities within the county. Motion carried.

Mrs. Ova reviewed commitments for funding the transportation road study for the energy park in Spiritwood Township. City of Carrington \$2,000, McIntosh County \$500, Ransom County \$500, Steele County \$1,000, Barnes County \$3,500, Spirit Energy LLC \$5,000, JSDC \$28,000 (\$25,000 County, \$3,000 City). A \$19,000 grant from APUC was pending. A motion to obligate \$25,000 in County JSDC funds was made by Neys and seconded by Kaiser. Roll call vote - Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose and Ova all voted aye.

Marks made a motion that was seconded by Neys to de-obligate the following JSDC funds: Dakota Brands, Int. (Grant) PACE buy-down actual was less than original preliminary proposal - \$2,260.89; Agri-Cover, Inc. (Grant) PACE buy-down actual was less than original preliminary proposal - \$2,696.40; 3rd Street Road Improvement (Grant) - \$15,614.06; Industrial Park Development (Grant) - \$11,965.00. Motion carried.

Jerry Bergquist, 9-1-1 Coordinator/Emergency Manager, addressed a request by Kidder County to allow them to use 9-1-1 sign posts at 52nd Street SE and 48th Street SE at the intersection of 48th Avenue SE to attach a sign on the posts to designate the Kidder County line. Jerry Brickner, County Engineer, was opposed to the idea from an engineering viewpoint - the posts were not designed for extra wind loads and there could be potential liability issues. A motion to deny the request was made by Ova and seconded by Kaiser. Motion carried.

Ova made a motion that was seconded by Neys to nominate Natoma Buskness to the Buffalo City Tourism Board. Motion carried.

Noel Johnson, County COO, presented estimates of cost increases for employee's health insurance. ND PERS would increase the rates effective July 1, 2007. The 25% estimated increase in rates were single policy from \$258.86 to \$326.00; family policy from \$638.94 to \$784.00. When the 2007 budget was prepared, rate increases were estimated at about 12%. The projected budget shortfall for the increases was \$38,196 for 2007.

Johnson presented the 2006 year-end financial report. The General Fund balance increased from \$1.7 million to \$1.94 million. Total County Funds increased from \$6.4 million to \$7.5 million. The County Highway 38 project would reduce reserves by about \$2 million in 2007. A motion was made by Neys and seconded by Ova to make the following year-end transfers and expenditure budget amendments. Roll call vote - Kaiser, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks all voted aye.

2006 Year End Transfers: transfer \$703.20 from 10-111-6380 to 91-000-5335; transfer \$23,439.90 from 23-000-6999 to 53-000-5999.

Expenditure Budget Amendments: Unorganized Townships 16-131-6393 from \$1,000 to \$2,000; Unorganized Townships 16-132-6393 from \$2,000 to \$4,200; City County Health 19-000-6810 from \$250,000 to \$252,000; Employee's Hospital Insurance 30-000-6211 from 740,000 to \$742,000; LEC Commissary 37-000-6397 from \$100,000 to \$119,000; Road & Bridge Building 54-000-6680 from \$0 to \$5,500; Bond Forfeiture 56-000-6312 from 10,000 to \$11,000; County Extension 57-124-6263 from \$800 to \$3,100; Emergency Human Services 58-000-6999 from

\$335,590 to \$359,000; FY2004 Grant 62-000-6999 from \$0 to \$11,100; Weed Board Grant 64-400-6360 from \$0 to \$7,000; Central Valley Health Bond 69-000-6490 \$0 to \$1,000; County Fair 71-000-6810 from \$24,200 to \$25,400; District Court Remodeling Grant 91-000-6700 from \$0 to \$10,500.

At 5:13 p.m. the Commission meeting was recessed for the Park Board meeting.

Also present were Nellie Degen, Connie Ova, Harold Newman, Larry Kuntz, Bureau of Reclamation, Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney and Dennis Lorenz, County Park Superintendent.

A motion was made by Woodward and seconded by Ova to approve the minutes of the December 2006 meeting. Motion carried.

Kaiser made a motion that was seconded by Marks to approve the bills. Roll call vote - Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose, Schlecht and Woodward all voted aye.

Dennis Lorenz, County Park Superintendent, requested consideration of the 2007 camping rates, holidays and discounts. By consensus, the Board left the rates the same as they were in 2006, and approved the holidays and discounts as follows for 2007: Holidays - May 27 and 28, July 1- July 4, September 2 and 3. Normal rates for Friday, Saturday and Holidays are \$20 per night. Off-peak rate for Sunday thru Thursday is \$18 per night. Golden Access and Golden Age Passports will only be honored on "off-peak" nights and will only be accepted for the site at which the card bearer is staying. Last summer there were situations in which the card bearer tried to pay for several sites. The Golden Access and Golden Age Passport discount is 50%.

The Park Improvement Committee was appointed. Members are Mark Schlecht, Doug Kaiser, Dennis Lorenz, Sandy Eckelberg and Noel Johnson.

Ova made a motion that was seconded by Woodward to authorize payment of \$11,000 to Marge Grosulak for the mobile home and shop building at Pelican Point Landing upon receipt of the title and a proper bill of sale. Motion carried.

Mr. Lorenz requested permission to advertise for the Pelican Point Landing campground. Word needed to get out about the new name and new phone number. Kaiser made a motion that was seconded by Ova to authorize advertising. Motion carried.

Mr. Lorenz indicated that he had the new signs for the campground and that they would be installed when the weather permitted. The "Polar Plunge" was scheduled for February 17th. The hole in the ice would be marked and signed after the event.

A motion to adjourn was made by Neys and seconded by Kaiser. At 5:35 p.m. the February, 2007 Park Board meeting was adjourned.

At 5:36 p.m. the Stutsman County Commission meeting was called back to order with all Commissioners present.

Neys made a motion that was seconded by Ova to pay the monthly bills. Roll call vote - Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose voted aye.
