

February 20, 2007

At 4:00 p.m. the Stutsman County Commission meeting was called to order by Chairman Klose. Roll call was answered by Douglas Kaiser, Craig Neys, Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, and Mark T. Klose.

Kim Murray, SCDRC Executive Assistant, opened the public hearing to obtain citizen views and to respond to proposals and questions related to: the proposed CDBG application for removal of architectural barriers in the Veterans Memorial Building; Community development and housing needs, including the needs of very low and low income persons, as well as other needs in the community that might be addressed through the CDBG program; and the performance of the County in carrying out its community development responsibilities. The South Central Dakota Regional Council (SCDRC) had awarded \$80,000 in grant funds to renovate the bathrooms in the lower level of the Memorial Building. The County would oversee the financials and the All Vets Club would provide the matching funds in quarterly installments. There were no comments from those present at the hearing. Ova made a motion that was seconded by Neys to adopt the resolution of sponsorship, assurance certifications, citizen participation plan, code of conduct, and the community development needs assessment for the CDBG grant project. Roll call vote - Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose all voted aye.

Jim Fettig, Courthouse Maintenance Supervisor, requested that the Commission approve the selection of MJBA (Michael J. Burns Architects, Ltd.) as architects for the Memorial Building project. An architect for the project was a requirement of the CDBG grant. The architect would prepare a bid specification book, solicit bids, conduct a final inspection and sign off on the ADA compliance form. This firm had provided the project cost estimates for the grant application, and they were the architects when the new elevator was installed in the building. The estimated cost for their services was \$5,000 to \$6,000. A motion was made by Neys and seconded by Kaiser to engage MJBA as architects for the Memorial Building lower level bathroom renovation project. Roll call vote - Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose and Ova all voted aye.

Christina Wiederrich, JSDC Resource Development Specialist, presented a request from Duratech Industries International, Inc. for \$125,000 PACE interest buy down and \$60,000 in new jobs training funds. The interest buy down was a 0% loan structured over a period not longer than ten years. The new jobs training funds would be at 1% interest loan amortized over ten years based on adding 18 jobs within two years. A motion was made by Kaiser and seconded by Marks to authorize the funding on a 50/50 City/County split. Roll call vote - Kaiser, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks all voted aye.

Ms. Wiederrich presented the funding request for the County's share of the 2007 dues for the South Central Regional Dakota Council (SCRDC). By prior agreement, the \$26,612 in dues would be split 63/37 City/County and these funds would be taken out of economic development funds. A motion to authorize payment of \$9,846.44 was made by Ova and seconded by Marks. Roll call vote - Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks and Kaiser all voted aye.

Neys made a motion that was seconded by Kaiser to de-obligate \$2,000 of committed funds for Jamestown Marble. Motion carried.

Fort Seward requested a letter of support for a \$12,000 grant through the North Dakota Department of Commerce. The funds would be used for the Flags Across America project. A motion was made by Ova and seconded by Neys to endorse a letter of support for the grant application. Motion carried.

Ms. Wiederrich presented an audit report for the Jamestown Civic Center for the Commission's review.

The gravel crushing bids were opened. Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney, noted that Zircon Construction, Inc. failed to provide a bidders bond. A motion was made by Kaiser and seconded by Ova to reject the bid of Zircon Construction, Inc. Motion carried.

The acceptable gravel bids were: Atlas Inc., Bismarck, ND \$2.72 for 3/4" msm (maximum size material) and \$2.57 for 1" msm; Gravel Products, Inc, Minot, ND \$3.41 for 3/4" msm and \$3.17 for 1" msm; and Sundre Sand & Gravel Inc., Minot, ND \$3.50 for 3/4" msm and \$3.25 for 1" msm. A motion to accept the bid of Atlas Inc. as the primary contractor and to accept the bid of Gravel Products, Inc. as secondary contractor to be used if the primary contractor fails to perform was made by Kaiser and seconded by Marks. Roll call vote - Klose, Ova, Marks, Kaiser and Neys all voted aye.

Mike Zimmerman, County Highway Superintendent, reviewed the motor grader bids. A motion was made by Kaiser and seconded by Marks to accept the bid of Titan Machinery for a 2006 865

DHP Case with wing, plow and ripper at a total cost of \$120,271.44 and at a net cost of \$33,771.44 after the guaranteed buy back. Roll call vote - Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose all voted aye.

Mr. Zimmerman requested allowing Marlowe Miller to be classified as an equipment operator(EQ) III. He was currently classified as an EQ II, but he had been doing the duties of an EQ III. A motion was made by Kaiser and seconded by Marks to move Mr. Miller within the classification system from an EQ II to an EQ III. Roll call vote - Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose and Ova all voted aye.

Steve Koehn requested that the Commission allow him to access the county's gravel pits so he could load his own loads when contract hauling for private individuals. He could provide better service if he didn't have to wait until the county moved into a pit. Mr. Zimmerman indicated that there had been problems in the past and that was why the current policy required County employees to load private haulers. Jerry Brickner, County Engineer, added that the royalty payments to pit owners were based on the pile as measured after a contractor had completed crushing. It was important for the County to have control so we could monitor the number of loads. A motion was made by Marks and seconded by Kaiser to deny Mr. Koehn's request. Motion carried.

Robin Izler, Administrator, Central Valley Health District, updated the Commission on Central Valley Health's recent activities. She reviewed several issues that were before the legislature. She had been proactive at the legislature seeking additional state funding for their programs. Only 2% of their budget was funded by the state. A proposed bill would allow the Health Authority employees to qualify for ND PERS health insurance. A pandemic influenza seminar and a "Lunch and Learn" presentation would be conducted in March.

The Commission reviewed the engineering firms that had submitted proposals for updating the security system at the Law Enforcement Center. Proposals were received from Prairie Engineering, P.C. of Bismarck, Ulteig Engineers of Bismarck, and Erickson Ellison & Associates, Inc. of St, Paul, MN. Doug Kaiser, John Grabinger, Tracey Trapp, Noel Johnson, Howie Peuser and Darron Goter would review the proposals and make a recommendation to the LEC governing authority.

Neyns made a motion that was seconded by Kaiser to appoint Natoma Buskness to the Buffalo City Tourism Board. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Kaiser and seconded by Neys to approve the raffle permits of the Spiritwood Betterment Club and the Ypsilanti 125th Anniversary Committee. Motion carried.

Jerry Bergquist, 9-1-1 Coordinator/emergency Manager, requested approval of a NDACo/NDLC training and exercise contract. National Incident Management (NIMS), full disaster emergency exercise and a table top disaster emergency exercise training would be the scope of the contract. The \$25,692.52 cost would be paid by 2005 and 2006 homeland security grant funds. Kaiser made a motion that was seconded by Ova to approve the contract. Roll call vote - Kaiser, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks all voted aye.

Ova made a motion that was seconded by Marks to pay \$115.00 in taxable meals. Roll call vote - Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks and Kaiser all voted aye.

A motion to pay the mid-month bills was made by Kaiser and seconded by Marks. Roll call vote - Klose, Ova, Marks, Kaiser and Neys all voted aye.
