

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission – March 17, 2020

At 4:00 p.m., Chairman Klose called the official meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Ramone Gumke, David Schwartz, and Mark Klose answered the role call. Steven Cichos joined via phone.

Connie Ova, JSDC, discussed the legal fees for the North Dakota Soy vs. SEPA lawsuit. They have paid \$200,000 in legal fees through SEPA cash rent. There is \$108,314.41 remaining. The county would be responsible for 10% which is \$10,831.44. This would cover all legal fees incurred through the end of February. Any additional fees will be requested at a later time. The JSDC board unanimously recommended the payment. Schwartz made a motion to approve the request, seconded by Gumke. Ova, Gumke, Schwartz, Cichos, and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.

Corry Shevlin, JSDC, discussed a new Workforce Recruitment program. This is a career builders reimbursement program for companies in Jamestown that would use matching funds from the State. It focuses on occupations and degrees that are emerging and in high demand in the state. Companies would supply the match and JSDC would reimburse them up to 25%. Companies can use this to recruit graduates. JSDC is requesting \$100,000 which could fund up to 48 positions. Gumke made a motion to approve the funds, seconded by Ova. Gumke, Schwartz, Cichos, Klose, and Ova voted aye. Motion carried.

Nicole Meland, Auditor/COO discussed the FEMA Recovery Scoping Meeting scheduled for March 24, 2020 with the township officers. They are still planning on holding the meeting in person. Townships should designate one delegate to come to the meeting and precautions will be taken.

Meland discussed an Emergency Declaration regarding the COVID-19 virus. This would be necessary to access any future federal disaster funding. The federal government and the state of North Dakota have declared emergencies. Robin from Central Valley was present to discuss the virus. North Dakota has 1,000 tests and has used about 200 of them. The hospitals and clinics are preparing for increased patient loads. They are prioritizing N-95 masks to have some in each community. Jerry Bergquist said they are working on a virtual Emergency Operations Center. If there is a positive case in Stutsman County, Central Valley would contact everyone who that person has interacted with. Schwartz made a motion to approve the Health Emergency Declaration, seconded by Cichos. Schwartz, Cichos, Klose, Ova, and Gumke voted aye. Motion carried.

Meland discussed office policies regarding COVID-19. The LEC basement has been locked and people must call to be let in. The public has been encouraged to call instead of visiting the Human Service Zone office. Some department heads have VPN access to work remotely, but it would be difficult to get access and computers for everyone to work from home. There is a Federal House bill in progress that would require employers to provide additional sick leave for COVID-19 related reasons. Meland presented example policies from McLean County and DHS regarding employee travel. There is federal legislation in the works that would require employers to offer two weeks of additional leave if employees are required to stay home for reasons related to COVID-19. Meland will work on putting together notices to close the first floor of the courthouse for two weeks and a policy regarding employee travel. Work-related travel out of state will be stopped, except when absolutely necessary. Employees that travel out of state for essential

work-related reasons will self-quarantine for seven days with full pay and not have to use leave. Elective travel out of state will require the employee to use leave for seven days after returning. Ova made a motion to approve the policies discussed, seconded by Schwartz. Cichos, Klose, Ova, Gumke, and Schwartz voted aye. Motion carried.

Schwartz discussed an emergency drain permit north of Cleveland. Fish and Wildlife Service and the State Water Commission have approved the permit. We should be able to begin work on the drain tomorrow. This will lower the water in the areas where roads are covered, and grade raises are taking place. Ova made a motion to approve the temporary drain, seconded by Schwartz. Motion carried.

Meland discussed stickers for local businesses to distribute for the census. 75,000 stickers were ordered which cost \$1,200. This will be fully funded by the State census committee.

Meland discussed absentee applications for the upcoming elections. Early voting for the Primary would start on May 26th and the election is on June 9th. Meland would like to mail out absentee applications to voters. This would encourage voters to vote by mail and hopefully reduce people coming into the vote centers. Gumke made a motion to mail applications to all active voters, seconded by Schwartz. Klose, Ova, Gumke, Schwartz, and Cichos voted aye. Motion carried.

A beer license was presented for The Jim located at the marina and beer and liquor licenses for the Anchor bar. Schwartz made a motion to approve, seconded by Ova. Motion carried.

Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Gumke, to approve the taxable meals and mid-month bills. Ova, Gumke, Schwartz, Cichos, and Klose voted aye.
