Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission – March 19, 2019

At 4:45 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Denny Ova, Ramone Gumke, Dave Schwartz, Steven Cichos, and Mark Klose answered the roll call.

Jerry Bergquist, Emergency Manager/9-1-1 Coordinator, discussed a Memorandum of Understanding between the County and each of the Townships. The agreement will state that the County can act on behalf of the Townships in the event of a Presidential Disaster Declaration. The County already does this, but the North Dakota Department of Emergency Services wants it in writing. Twelve documents have already been signed.

Bergquist also discussed a recent request from the Department of Emergency Services for the amount of money spent on snow removal. There is the potential for a Presidential Declaration to help with the costs of snow removal. There has only been one other year, 1997 when we had 100 inches of snow, that we have received federal funds for snow removal.

Bergquist also discussed the flood outlook for Stutsman County. The Corps of Engineers recently put out a press release stating that they will be releasing 750 cubic feet per second. The flood risk is greater south of Jamestown but still minor.

Nicole Meland, Auditor/COO recognized Shannon Larson, HR Specialist, for completing the SHRM (Society of Human Resource Managers) Certification.

Meland also discussed the North Dakota Insurance Reserve Fund's (NDIRF) feasibility study for health insurance. NDIRF is conducting the study to look into the feasibility of a health insurance association plan for political subdivisions.

Meland presented deeds for the sale of two county owned properties in Kensal. These are properties that did not sell in the 2016 foreclosure auction. Schwartz made a motion to approve the sale, seconded by Ova. Schwartz, Cichos, Klose, Ova, and Gumke voted aye. Motion carried.

Meland presented beer and liquor licenses for the Boondocks, LLC for approval. Cichos made a motion to approve, seconded by Ova. Motion carried.

Meland discussed a contract for surface rehab on a railroad crossing. There is 90% federal funding and the county is required to pay 10%. The county share would be approximately \$8,600. It is for the Red River Valley Railroad crossing over County Road 42 in the City of Buchanan. Cichos made a motion to approve the contract, seconded by Schwartz. Motion carried.

Meland discussed sending a letter to Mike Kessler, former operator of Lakeside Marina. The building needs to be cleared out and his property needs to be removed so if we obtain a new lessee they can start in a timely manner. Meland recommends giving him 30 days to remove his personal property. Schwartz made a motion to send a letter, seconded by Gumke. Motion carried.

Schwartz made a motion to approve the mid-month bills and taxable meals, seconded Gumke. Cichos, Klose, Ova, Gumke, and Schwartz voted aye. Motion carried.
