

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission

April 5, 2011

At 4:00 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, David Schwartz, Craig Neys and Mark T. Klose answered roll call.

Ova made a motion seconded by Marks to approve the minutes of the March 2011 meetings. Motion carried.

Jerry Bergquist, 9-1-1 Coordinator/Emergency Manager, recommended that the County make an Emergency Declaration. Water on roads and roads under water were being reported. The Auditor's Office was in the process of contacting all of the townships to get locations of roads under water or roads on the verge of going under water. This information would be posted on the County's web site. Declaring an emergency would be the first step in qualifying the road repairs for possible reimbursement pending a Presidential Disaster Declaration. Ova made a motion seconded by Schwartz to approve the emergency declaration. Roll call vote – Ova, Marks, Schwartz, Neys and Klose voted aye.

Motor grader bids (for motor grader w/snow wing) were opened as follows: RDO Equipment Company, Bismarck, ND – new 2011 JD 772G – net price of \$243,000, optional extended warranty - \$18,000, guarantee buyback of motor grader only - \$115,300, guarantee buyback of motor grader with snow wing - \$117,800, estimated delivery date 120 days; Swanston Equipment Corp, Fargo, ND – new 2011 Volvo G946 – net price of \$225,175, optional extended warranty - \$26,250, guarantee buyback of motor grader only - \$112,000, guarantee buyback of motor grader with snow wing - \$117,000, estimated delivery date 120 days; Butler Machinery Company, Fargo, ND – new 2011 Cat 140M AWD – net price of \$256,633, optional extended warranty - \$13,966, guarantee buyback of motor grader only - \$125,000, guarantee buyback of motor grader with snow wing - \$125,000, estimated delivery date 20 weeks; Butler Machinery Company, Fargo, ND – Used 2011 Cat 140M AWD with 370 hours – net price \$261,899 (includes extended warranty), guarantee buyback of motor grader only \$125,000, guarantee buyback of motor grader with snow wing - \$125,000, estimated delivery date 6 weeks. The bids were taken under advisement for review until the next meeting.

The hearing was held on the request to close the following section lines in Round Top Township: the one mile of section line between the S½ Section 11 and N½ Section 14; the one mile of section line between the E½ Section 10 and the W½ Section 11 and the one mile of section line between the S½ Section 10 and N½ Section 15 T142N R66W. The petitioner was unable to attend the meeting. No one appeared in opposition to the closing. Schwartz made a motion seconded by Neys to close the section lines. Roll call vote – Marks, Schwartz, Neys, Klose and Ova voted aye.

Commissioner Marks as a member of the James River Valley Library System Board commented that the request to authorize the purchase of a property for a new library was mute because the City had turned down the request. The purchase required approval by both Boards. Because the item was on the agenda, Commissioner Marks made a motion requesting approval of the Commission to authorize purchase of land for a proposed new library. The motion died for lack of a second.

Lindsey Larson, JSDC Marketing/Business Development Specialist, requested concurrence with the JSDC Board of Directors to authorize \$8,500 on an 80/20 City/County split to continue the Jamestown College Intern program through 2011. The interns would assist JSDC in all areas. The students would be paid \$10 per hour for up to 20 hours per week. Neys made a motion seconded by Schwartz to approve \$1,700 in County funds. Roll call vote – Schwartz, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks voted aye.

Ms. Larson presented a \$12,000 request to fund a service agreement with the I.D.E.A. Center of Bismarck. The Center would help guide JSDC through the process of designing and implementing a business incubator. A business incubator provides access expertise to various services, assistance and coaching for local businesses. The \$12,000 request would be funded 80/20 City/County. Marks made a motion seconded by Ova to approve \$2,400 in County funds. Roll call vote – Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks and Schwartz voted aye.

Connie Ova, CEO-JSDC, presented a request by Allen Enterprises, Inc for a Flex PACE interest buy-down for an expansion of Infinity Building Services. The funding was a \$100,000 Community Share (JSDC) Bank of ND Flex PACE interest buy-down and a Bank of ND \$200,000 interest buy-down grant for a total buy down incentive of up to \$300,000. The Community interest buy down dollars were 0% loan which will be paid back to JSDC once the underlying loan to BND is repaid. The proposal had "claw-back" provisions and a personal guarantee. Questions were raised regarding JSDC policies and procedures that prohibited this type of funding for retail business. If the funding provided no unfair advantage to the beneficiary, funding to a retail business was not prohibited. Any business could apply for similar funding. JSDC policies and procedures were in the process of being changed to address this specific issue. This funding had been used for retail business occasionally. Ova made a motion

seconded by Schwartz to approve the request. Roll call vote – Klose, Ova, Marks, Schwartz and Neys voted aye.

Ova made a motion seconded by Neys to authorize signing the utility relocation agreement with Stutsman County Rural Water Users for the County Highway 67 south realignment (CER 4717(068)) at a cost of \$59,400. 80% of the cost would be eligible for Emergency Relief reimbursement. Roll call vote – Ova, Marks, Schwartz, Neys and Klose voted aye.

A motion was made by Schwartz seconded by Marks to request assistance from the ND Highway Patrol to enforce weight restrictions in Stutsman County. Motion carried.

Mickey Nenow, County Highway Superintendent, presented two bills for final payment of the 2009 small Emergency Relief (ER) projects. Neys made a motion seconded by Marks to pay Guthmiller Construction \$476.40 and Clifford Stewart Construction \$5,888.20. Roll call vote – Marks, Schwartz, Neys, Klose and Ova voted aye.

Nenow requested adjusting the pay grades for two employees. Jim Bredahl had been promoted to a foreman position and Bill Birrenkott was not in the proper pay grade for his foreman position. Schwartz made a motion seconded by Marks to place both positions at a grade 10, step 9. Motion carried.

Nenow reported that at least 5 County roads would be or already are under water.

Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney, gave his monthly report. A member of his staff had consented to coordinate and administer Title VI to comply with Federal Highway regulations. Compliance was required or the County would jeopardize eligibility for Federal reimbursement on road projects. Ova made a motion seconded by Schwartz to add Title VI compliance duties to Assistant State's Attorney Ashley Heitkamp's duties at an annual salary of \$3,130. Roll call vote – Schwartz, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks voted aye.

Fremgen reported that the Margo Haut appeal was now in the hands of the North Dakota Insurance Reserve Attorneys.

Tracey Trapp, Law Enforcement Center Administrator, requested donated leave for Nancy Lies, a 16 year, so she could attend to a medical issue in her family. Marks made a motion seconded by Schwartz to allow donated leave. Motion carried.

At 5:09 p.m., the Commission meeting was recessed for the Park Board meeting.

#### Stutsman County Park Board Meeting

April 5, 2011

At 5:14 p.m. Chairman Klose called the Stutsman County Park Board meeting to order. Park Board members present were Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, David Schwartz, Craig Neys, Mark Klose and Bob Woodward. Mark Schlecht was absent.

Marks made a motion seconded by Woodward to approve the December 2010 minutes. Motion carried.

Neys made a motion seconded by Schwartz to pay the following bills. Roll call vote – Woodward, Ova, Marks, Schwartz, Neys and Klose voted aye.

Jack Uehran requested a transfer of his lease with the Park Board for the campground at Spiritwood Lake City to Ken Goetz. There were 8 years remaining on the lease. He offered to donate all of the hook-ups (sewer, water & electric) to the Park Board. The Board would review the proposals after his attorney had prepared the proper documents.

Neys made a motion seconded by Woodward to approve the 5 boat dock permits and set the fee at \$150 per year. Motion carried.

Dennis Lorenz, County Park Superintendent, reported on a parking lot light that had been installed at Lake Side Marina. The light would benefit the fishing dock and the boat ramp. The Park Board would pick up the \$16 per month cost.

Lorenz was working with ND Game & Fish to install a high water boat ramp at Jim River Bay. \$18,000 had been committed from ND Game & Fish and \$7,500 from the Dakota Anglers. A Garrison Diversion grant application for the remaining \$6,281 was pending. Plans were to install the ramp this fall if all the funding comes through. There would be no cost to the Park Board.

The cabins at Pelican Point would possibly need to be moved depending on water levels at the Reservoir.

A motion was made by Ova seconded by Woodward to adjourn. At 5:36 the meeting was adjourned

At 5:37 the regular Commission meeting was called back to order with all Commissioners present.

Schwartz made a motion seconded by Neys to approve the raffle permit applications of Stutsman County 4-H and Birthdays Never Grow Old Relay for Life Team. Motion carried.

Noel Johnson, County COO, reviewed two options for County General Government. The first option would be to continue business as usual with 3 full time employees in the Recorder's Office and 2 full-time plus 1 part-time employee in the Treasurer's Office. The second option would appoint a General Government Coordinator whose main responsibility would be to coordinate job sharing among the main floor General Government Departments. Questions and concerns were raised regarding the need to modify job descriptions for the individuals involved. Chairman Klose commented that he thought it was a good time to take a look at the flexibility of different options.

Judy Graves commented that the Home Rule Charter required the Commission to fill the offices of County Treasurer and County Recorder. She expressed concerns over the public having a chance to review and comment on the proposed options. She questioned the need for a General Government Coordinator. She was concerned over the potential reduction in staff. Commissioner Schwartz indicated that the only opportunity to try and change was now when there were vacancies in the department head positions. The County could revert to option one if things did not work out.

Brenda Rasmussen, part-time Treasurer's Office employee, commented that moving people into other officers had not always worked. At times, the individuals backing up the Treasurer's Office had other work and/or they were not available when needed. Karen Samek, former Recorder, commented that it takes 3 years to get trained on all of the responsibilities in the Recorder's Office. People would need to be trained before they could assist. Judy Graves commented that the Auditor, Treasurer and Recorder each had very distinctive duties. Karen Samek indicated that both Jacki Lindell and Jamie Anderson-Ruff had been thoroughly trained in all the duties of the Treasurer and Recorder respectively.

Marks made a motion seconded by Schwartz to advertise for a General Government Coordinator, Treasurer and Recorder. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Ova seconded by Marks to pay the monthly bills. Roll call vote – Ova, Marks, Schwartz, Neys and Klose voted aye.
