

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission

April 6, 2010

At 4:00 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, Doug Kaiser, Craig Neys and Mark T. Klose answered roll call.

Noel Johnson, County COO, presented the resolution for ratifying an intergovernmental agreement between Great River Energy (GRE), McLean County and Stutsman County. The agreement would authorize McLean County to issue \$141,000,000 in Municipal Industrial Development (MIDA) Bonds on behalf of McLean County and Stutsman County. The bonds include a maximum of \$50,000,000 for the improvement of real estate located at Spiritwood Station for the construction, installation and equipping of solid waste facilities that would be part of a lignite-based power plant owned by GRE. The bonds were secured by the project. There was no risk for the Counties, and they did not reduce any of the Counties' bonding authority. A motion was made by Ova seconded by Kaiser to approve the resolution. Roll call vote – Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose voted aye.

Robin Iszler, Unit Administration and Coralynn Dallmann, Accountant for Central Valley Health District, presented a proposal to refinance the Central Valley Health Bond issue. Two companies had submitted refinance proposals – Dougherty & Co., LLC and Public Financial Management (PFM). PFM's proposal would save the District a net present value of \$27,414.54 compared to Dougherty's projected savings of \$18,962.95. Kaiser made a motion seconded by Neys to approve the resolution to refinance the bonds with PFM and to authorize the Call for Redemption of the current bonds. Roll call vote – Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose and Ova voted aye.

Lindsey Larson, JSDC Marketing/Business Development Specialist, presented the revised ordinance that was under consideration by the City of Jamestown for the 1% Economic Development Sales Tax. ½% of the sales tax would be dedicated for economic and jobs development. The other ½% would be dedicated to payment of the city's share of special assessments on city public works projects within the city including the current debt service for the wastewater treatment plant. The changes would be in effect until December 31, 2018.

Steve Thompson, Interstate Engineering, presented quotes for the Ypsilanti Bridge project. Marks made a motion seconded by Ova to accept the low bid (\$4,045) of Western Plains Consulting, Inc. for wetlands delineation; the low bid of Beaver Creek Archaeology (\$1,100) for cultural resources; and the low bid of Braun Intertec (\$6,120) for boring. Roll call vote – Kaiser, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks voted aye.

Thompson reported that a meeting was held with the NDIRT team about the possible site for mitigation acres. For the Emergency Relief (ER) projects, mitigation acres would not have to be acquired prior to the bid letting and construction. Four project concept reports had been submitted for review with a projected July bid letting.

Mike Zimmerman, County Highway Superintendent, gave his monthly report. He requested permission to rebid six ER projects. There were no bidders on these projects last fall. Neys made a motion seconded by Kaiser to rebid the projects. Motion carried.

Zimmerman reported on the road damage south of Cleveland. A replacement office assistant had been hired and last years' part time person would assist with FEMA project paperwork. Crews were currently crack sealing. A motion was made by Marks seconded by Kaiser to allow private contractors that were in good standing with the Road Department to access gravel from the County's gravel pits to finish FEMA work. Motion carried.

Jerry Bergquist, 9-1-1 Coordinator/Emergency Manager, indicated that the County was under an emergency declaration for preventative measures only. There would likely be another declaration to assist with costs for damages. Current projections for pool elevations at Pipestem Dam were 1,477 feet and 1,447 feet at the Jamestown Reservoir.

Gary Carlson, County Resident, expressed concerns over plans to recycle Old Highway #10. He commented that this was the heaviest traveled road in the county, and the current traffic was not just construction workers. After recycling, it would be difficult to keep the road in good condition with that much traffic, especially in certain weather conditions. The road brings revenue to Jamestown, more than any other county road. The Commission responded that the cost to rebuild the road was over \$1million per mile.

A motion was made by Ova seconded by Neys to approve the minutes of the March meetings. Motion carried.

Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney, gave his monthly report. He presented an opinion that a joint powers agreement between the county and townships could be used to expend revenue from a county levied property tax and/or county imposed sales tax on improvements or maintenance of a township road(s) provided the agreement was made prior to any improvements and/or maintenance. The funds could not be used to pay township debt if the debt existed prior to the agreement. He also presented a 1984 opinion from State's Attorney Charles Gilje to County Commissioner Oliver Graves concerning the County's 1972 road plan. Commissioner Graves expressed concerns that the 1972 costs of \$18,000 to \$23,000 per mile had increased to a point that the current 5 mill levy could not pave and maintain the 208.5 miles listed within the plan. Gilje opined that the Commission could follow the plan as a general guideline, and pave and/or maintain only those roads that the Commission deemed appropriate.

Fremgen reviewed the ballot language for the proposed 15 mill farm-to-market levy and ½% increase in the county-wide sales tax. The County's Home Rule Charter had a mill levy maximum of 115 mills. Unless the ballot language addressed increasing the cap, passage of the proposal would raise the total county mills to within 1.33 mills of the maximum. Marks made a motion seconded by Kaiser to draft language to include in the funding proposal authorization to raise the maximum mill levy from 115 mills to 130 mills. Roll call vote – Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks and Kaiser voted aye.

At 5:35 p.m. the County Commission meeting was recessed for the County Park Board meeting.

Stutsman County Park Board Meeting

April 6, 2010

At 5:40 p.m. Chairman Klose called the Stutsman County Park Board meeting to order. Park Board members present were Bob Woodward, Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, Doug Kaiser, Craig Neys and Mark T. Klose. Mark Schlecht was absent.

Woodward made a motion seconded by Ova to approve the minutes of the March 2010 meeting. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Ova seconded by Marks to approve payment of the monthly bills. Roll call vote - Woodward, Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose voted aye.

Ney made a motion seconded by Woodward to approve the four 2010 Boat Dock Permits. Motion carried.

Gene Van Eckhout, Fisheries Supervisor with ND Game and Fish, requested permission to control Cormorants within the Little Britches area at the Jamestown Reservoir. The Game & Fish Department had a permit to harass and kill the Cormorants so they needed the Park Board's permission to discharge fire arms at the Reservoir. Marks made a motion seconded by Ova to allow the Game & Fish Department to discharge firearms at the Reservoir for Cormorant control. Motion carried.

Dennis Lorenz, County Park Superintendent, gave his monthly report. Estimates were being acquired for repair of the damages caused by moving the Marina. The Pelican Point concession building was progressing. Work was continuing on the rest room at the Marina campground and rural water was being installed. Ova made a motion seconded by Woodward to allow the purchase of a 350 engine from Dakota Engine Builders for replacement in the one-ton truck. Roll call vote – Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose and Woodward voted aye.

Lorenz indicated that the cabins at Pelican Point Landing and fish cleaning station had been moved due to the high water. Boat docks had been moved at five mile corner for lake access. The proposed boat dock at Jim River Bay had been approved – 75% funding from ND Game & Fish and 25% funding from the Dakota Anglers.

The Park Board expressed their appreciation of the continued support from the Dakota Anglers, and they expressed their appreciation for the support from the Jamestown Rural Fire Department for donating \$1,600 to be used for dock maintenance.

The Board reviewed the State's Attorney opinion that a new lease for up to 20 years could be drafted for the Park Board's land and facilities at Spiritwood Lake City, but the existing lease could not be assigned.

A motion to adjourn was made by Neys seconded by Woodward. At 6:01 p.m. the April 2010 County Park Board meeting was adjourned.

At 6:02 p.m. the regular Commission meeting was called back to order with all Commissioners present.

Ova made a motion seconded by Kaiser to approve the raffle permits of the Good Samaritan Club and the Jamestown Gymnastics Club. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Neys seconded by Ova to approve the gaming site authorizations of the ND Buffalo Foundation, Inc. at Buchanan Bar, 281 Stop, Anchor Bar and Cuz'n Ron's Saloon. Motion carried.

Kaiser made a motion seconded by Neys to change the beer license for the Hitching Post from a partnership to a single applicant in the name of ShawnDell Gudmestad-Moore. Motion carried.

Johnson requested approval of an early voting precinct and an absentee precinct at the Stutsman County Courthouse for the 2010 primary and general elections. Marks made a motion seconded by Kaiser to approve the early voting and absentee precincts. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Ova seconded by Kaiser to allow payment of FEMA related bills out of the Emergency Fund. Motion carried.

Kaiser made a motion seconded by Neys to approve the monthly bills. Roll call vote – Klose, Ova, Marks, Kaiser and Neys voted aye.
