

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission

April 7, 2009

At 4:00 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, Craig Neys, Doug Kaiser and Mark T. Klose answered roll call.

Nellie Degen, Cabin Owner, thanked the County for sending out sand and sandbags when they were needed. Also wanted to thank Mike Zimmerman and his crew for working the weekend to deliver sand and help out. She also stated that Jerry Bergquist has also been outstanding in his assistance. She hoped that things could be put in place to get FEMA insurance and mapping in place in order to get flood insurance. She would like to have the Commission's support in order to get flood insurance. She wanted to thank everyone for volunteering, she had over 100 volunteers to help sand bag over the weekend.

Mike Zimmerman, County Highway Superintendent, reported on the grade raises engineering bids and chip sealing bids. Interstate Engineering was the only company that submitted a proposal for the four projects – two grade raises and 2 chip seal projects. Ova made a motion that was seconded by Kaiser to forego the interview process, hire Interstate Engineering and recommend DOT negotiate with Interstate Engineering for consulting engineering services. Roll call vote: Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose voted aye.

Zimmerman presented the resolution for the paving projects for the grade raises - project # CER-4717(064) and # CER-4717(065). The estimate for the projects was \$366,600. Border States submitted the low bid of \$321,366. Kaiser made a motion seconded by Marks to enter into an agreement with the DOT for the paving projects. Roll call vote: Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose and Ova voted aye.

Zimmerman reported that the state would also consider the snow removal costs for the month of March for townships. Township balances were down to about \$550,000. At the township officers meeting, the townships asked about road weight enforcements. Some townships mentioned that they would like to go along with the County if the County decides to initiate a weight ordinance. This would be an individual basis, if all townships participate with the ordinance, it would be easier for the Sheriff's department to enforce it. They would also like to be included with the ordinance prohibiting the pushing and piling of snow across from a driveway on roads.

Zimmerman stated that he had a request from Morlock Heavy Hauling to haul in a 220,000 pound crane into Cleveland. He told them they had to wait until road restrictions were off. He doesn't think the road could handle that amount of weight at this time.

Zimmerman reported that he had a request from a Sydney Township resident to sign County Road 38 at the US Highway 281 intersection restricting jake brake usage. Commission consensus was to try the signage at the intersection.

Jerry Bergquist, 9-1-1 Coordinator/Emergency Manager, reported that the elevation forecasts for 2009 would surpass the 1997 record elevation. At the Pipestem Dam the current forecast would exceed the record pool level of 1487'. The Jamestown Dam spillway elevation is 1454'. The Corps of Engineers had revised the prediction to 1455'. The Corps of Engineers was working with the City of Jamestown on the potential for extra measures to be able to flow more water to the community. The current plans are to flow up to 1800 cfs from the Jamestown dam. The press release on Friday, April 3, 2009 reported possible releases up to 3400 cfs combined from Jamestown and Pipestem. To obtain more accurate predictions, crests are needed at Grace City and Pingree. He stated that we do not want the

water to reach the spillway level (glory hole), because if it does it would then be an uncontrolled release. The spillway at the Jamestown Dam has never been used.

Johnson requested that the Commission consider granting Bergquist and/or Johnson authority to deliver sand and/or sandbags to the communities of Ypsilanti and Montpelier if necessary. Neys made a motion seconded by Ova to grant authority to take necessary action as required. Motion carried.

Marty Richman, CEO, and Bill Kennedy, Marketing Director, for Jamestown Hospital presented information regarding the hospital. Mr. Richman reported that Thomson Reuters, a world-wide organization that reviews hospitals, had selected Jamestown Hospital as one on the top 100 hospitals in the United States for 2008. Richman read briefly a letter from Dr. Robert Wells, Hospital Chief of Staff and a MeritCare Physician, regarding the shortage of physicians nationally and the need to recruit and retain quality physicians, and the need of a state of the art facility to attract quality physicians to Jamestown. Jamestown Hospital had applied to USDA for loans. One part of the application was a direct loan for approximately \$8 million at 4.6% and also a loan guarantee program for the project at 7 – 7.5%.

Kennedy reviewed the current plans for the new hospital. The architects had created plans from information obtained from the doctors, nurses, housekeeping and every part of the hospital to develop a facility for the people that work in it every day. The facility would also include a helipad.

Richman reported that the construction project was \$40 million with projections going down. The equipment had already dropped about a million. The total projection of cost was \$50,500,000. During the two year duration of construction approximately 300 tradesmen would be employed. Funding for the project would come from hospital reserves, the foundation and loans.

Benefits to the community: adjacency to surgery, labs and diagnostics and doctors. A state of the art facility would aid in the recruitment of new medical staff and specialists.

Kennedy reported that representatives of Lutheran Social Services (LSS) had contacted the hospital regarding the purchase of the building. LSS was interested in remodeling the hospital for low income senior housing.

Kaiser made a motion seconded by Marks to approve the certificate of significant community support for Jamestown Hospital. Roll Call vote: Kaiser, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks voted aye.

At 5:32 p.m. the meeting was recessed.

At 5:36 p.m. the County Commission meeting was called back to order.

Neys made a motion to approve the minutes of the March meetings. Marks seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Noel Johnson, County COO, requested permission for the State's Attorney's office for out-of-state travel for Joan Halvorson, Victim Witness Advocate, for training that was fully paid for by a grant. Ova made a motion seconded by Kaiser to approve the out-of-state travel request. Motion carried.

At 5:40 p.m. the County Commission meeting was recessed for the County Park Board meeting.

April 7, 2009

At 5:40 p.m. Chairman Klose called the Stutsman County Park Board meeting to order. Park Board members present were Bob Woodward, Dennis Ova, Dale marks, Doug Kaiser, Craig Neys and Mark T. Klose. Absent was Mark Schlecht.

Kaiser made a motion to approve the minutes from the March meetings. Woodward seconded the motion. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Ova, seconded by Marks to approve the payment of the bills. Roll call vote: Woodward, Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose voted aye.

The campground at Pelican Point Landing was an issue with the flood conditions. A committee of Ova, Neys, Lorenz, Johnson and Sandy Eckelberg would meet with the Concessionaires to discuss issues and work with them for the upcoming season.

A motion to adjourn was made by Neys and seconded by Woodward. At 5:51 p.m. the April 2009 County Park Board meeting was adjourned.

At 5:52 p.m. the regular Commission meeting was called back to order with all Commissioners present.

Ova made a motion, seconded by Neys, to approve the beer application and Sunday beer permit for Speedway Concessions. Motion carried.

Kaiser made a motion that was seconded by Neys to approve payment of the monthly bills. Roll call vote: Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks and Kaiser voted aye.
