

## Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission – April 7, 2020

At 4:00 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Ramone Gumke (via phone), David Schwartz, Steven Cichos (via phone), and Mark Klose answered the roll call.

Ova made a motion, seconded by Schwartz, to approve the minutes of the March 2020 meetings. Motion carried.

Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney, presented his monthly report.

Fremgen, wanted to discuss the Telecommuting Policy, that was on the agenda with the commissioners as he had an employee teleworking and wanted additional employees to telework. Nicole Meland, Auditor/COO, indicated that departments were allowing employees to work from home without Board approval. Stutsman County does not have a Telecommuting Policy in place for people to telecommute and work from home. The drafted policy would keep employees accountable and employees would know what to expect from department heads. Shannon Larson, Human Resource Specialist, presented the draft Telecommuting Policy. If Stutsman County employees or their families needed to quarantine, this would allow them to work from home. Approval of teleworking would need to be approved by the department head and Auditor/COO. Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Ova, to approve the Telecommuting Policy as drafted, subject to review as needed. Roll call vote: Ova, Gumke, Schwartz, Cichos and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.

Josh Smaage, IT Director, requested possible approval of purchasing soft-phone licensing for the telephone system to allow employees to answer/make calls from their computers if employees are required to work from home. It would cost approximately \$13,000 for the licensing. Gumke suggested waiting to approve any purchase unless it became necessary for employees to work from home.

Phillip Hofmann, Peterson Township, and Casey Yunck, St. Paul Township, attended the meeting via conference call and discussed township road issues and FEMA concerns. The FEMA representative is on a no-travel order by the State of North Dakota. It was discussed that our FEMA representative needs to view the damaged sites to complete project worksheets in order to determine which sites qualify for funding. With the no-travel order, the county is unsure when the FEMA representative will be able to complete the work.

Beer and liquor licenses for Lazy Fish, LLC were presented. A motion to approve the presented licenses was made by Schwartz, seconded by Ova. Motion carried.

Meland presented information regarding the First Street Bridge within the City of Jamestown. Stutsman County donated the bridge to the City of Jamestown in 1997, but the City denies accepting ownership. There is currently an issue regarding the inspection costs for the bridge and who will be responsible for paying the cost of the inspections. When the First Street Bridge was rebuilt in 2004, the City of Jamestown signed a Cost Participation and Maintenance Agreement with the North Dakota Department of Transportation (DOT). As part of the agreement, the City agreed to pay for maintenance of the bridge. At this time, the City has not agreed to pay for the bridge inspections. DOT considers bridge inspections a maintenance item and if no one agrees to pay for the bridge inspection, it will need to be shut down and closed. Meland suggested sending a letter to the City of Jamestown on behalf of the Stutsman County Commission. A motion was made by Schwartz, seconded by Gumke, to send the City of Jamestown a letter stating that the County does not accept responsibility for the First Street Bridge. Roll call vote: Gumke, Schwartz, Cichos, Klose and Ova voted aye. Motion carried.

The Families First Coronavirus Response Act Policy was presented. The act assists employees affected by the COVID-19 outbreak with job protected leave and emergency paid sick leave. The rules pertaining to the Emergency Family and Medical Leave Expansion Act and Emergency Paid Sick Leave Act are outlined in the policy. A motion to approve the Families First Coronavirus Response Act Policy was made by Ova, seconded by Schwartz. Roll call vote: Schwartz, Cichos, Klose, Ova and Gumke voted aye. Motion carried.

Meland discussed reimbursements made to the Stutsman County Road Department by other county departments. The road department helps other county departments on their downtime. All of the departments in Stutsman County help each other out when needed and available and reimbursements do not occur. Mickey Nenow, Road Superintendent, agreed that it was unnecessary to reimburse the road department when helping other departments as they receive items from other departments that are not reimbursed. Schwartz made a motion for the road department to continue to document the work being done for other departments but not to reimburse the costs, seconded by Ova. Roll call vote: Cichos, Klose, Ova, Gumke and Schwartz voted aye. Motion carried.

A request to purchase a fuel trailer was made by Nenow. Nenow budgeted \$25,000 for the fuel trailer along with a welder. At this time, Nenow will be purchasing the fuel trailer only in the amount of \$21,400. A motion to approve the presented request was made by Cichos, seconded by Schwartz. Roll call vote: Klose, Ova, Gumke, Schwartz and Cichos voted aye. Motion carried.

At 5:15 p.m., the Commission meeting recessed for the Stutsman County Park Board meeting.

At 5:16 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Park Board to order. Dennis Ova, Ramone Gumke (via phone), David Schwartz, Steven Cichos (via phone), Mark Klose, Jason Houge and Joan Morris (via phone) answered the roll call.

Houge made a motion to approve the minutes of the March 2020 meeting, seconded by Ova. Motion carried.

Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Houge, to approve the monthly bills. Roll call vote: Houge, Morris, Ova, Gumke, Schwartz, Cichos and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.

Mark Watne, Farmers Union President, presented a proposal for a Farmers Union summer camp at the Jamestown Reservoir. They would like to begin construction this year. Morris made a motion to pursue entering into a contract for the North Dakota Farmers Union summer camp, seconded by Schwartz. Roll call vote: Morris, Ova, Gumke, Schwartz, Cichos, Klose and Houge voted aye. Motion carried.

Karl Bergh, Park Superintendent, presented his monthly report. The Stutsman County Park Department has been busy with equipment repairs. Bergh was notified by the North Dakota Game & Fish that the Park Department cannot put in any fishing piers at this time. However, boat docks can be put in the water.

The Lazy Fish, LLC presented the following for approval: garage door replacement on garage, installation of glass garage doors on concession building, installation of countertop to outside railing along patio, installation of septic tank for camping pads (2, 3, 24, 26 and 1, 18, 20, 22), installation of flagpole, application of sanitary disposal for Lazy Fish, removal of gazebo, relocation of the volleyball court, and relocation of Cabin 1 to RV site 55. Lazy Fish, LLC will be paying for the items presented. Houge made a motion to approve all as presented, seconded by Ova. Roll call vote: Ova, Gumke, Schwartz, Cichos, Klose, Houge and Morris voted aye. Motion carried.

Ramone Gumke left the meeting.

An approval of a concessionaire contract for The Jim Marina was requested. Cichos made a motion, seconded by Ova, to approve the presented concessionaire contract with The Jim Marina. Roll call vote: Schwartz, Cichos, Klose, Houge, Morris and Ova voted aye. Motion carried.

Bergh presented quotes for re-roofing the marina building. Bergh budgeted \$9,000.00 for the project. Houge made a motion to approve the presented low quote from LP Construction in the amount of \$5,800.00, seconded by Ova. Roll call vote: Cichos, Klose, Houge, Morris, Ova and Schwartz voted aye. Motion carried.

Bergh discussed the bridge that leads to the island. The bridge is still closed and Bergh is concerned about the safety of the bridge. Discussion was held to put load restrictions on the bridge and limit it to vehicle traffic only.

Discussion of changes to the Spiritwood Lake Resort Campground Lease was tabled until the next meeting in order for Park Board members to contact Eric Nordstrom with questions regarding the changes.

Pelican Point Campground Expansion bids were opened on April 6, 2020. A motion to award the low bid to Strata Corporation for \$286,568.69 was made by Houge, seconded by Ova. Roll call vote: Klose, Houge, Morris, Ova, Schwartz and Cichos voted aye. Motion carried.

Schwartz made a motion to authorize extending rural water to the Pelican Point Campground expansion, seconded by Houge. Roll call vote: Schwartz, Houge, Houge, Morris, Ova, Schwartz, Cichos and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.

A request to set and approve boat dock permit renewal fees for \$250.00 was made. Cichos made a motion, seconded by Schwartz, to approve the presented request. Roll call vote: Cichos, Schwartz, Morris, Ova, Schwartz, Cichos, Klose and Houge voted aye.

Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Ova, to approve the Interstate Engineering contract for cabin lot surveys. Roll call vote: Ova, Schwartz and Klose voted aye. Cichos, Houge and Morris abstained. Motion carried.

Ova made a motion, seconded by Schwartz, to approve the Dakota Appraisal & Consulting contract for cabin lot appraisals. Roll call vote: Schwartz, Klose and Ova voted aye. Cichos, Houge and Morris abstained. Motion carried.

A motion to adjourn the Park Board meeting was made by Houge, seconded by Ova. Motion carried.

At 6:30 p.m., the County Commission meeting was called back to order.

Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Cichos, to approve the monthly bills. Roll call vote: Cichos, Klose, Ova, and Schwartz voted aye. Motion carried.
