

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission

April 15, 2008

At 8:00 a.m. the mid-month meeting of the Stutsman County Commission was called to order by Chairman Klose. Roll call was answered by Douglas Kaiser, Craig Neys, Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, and Mark T. Klose.

Sandy Bendewald, Social Services Administrator, requested permission to review space needs for her department and the Extension Service at the Memorial Building. Bendewald, Eunice Sahr, County Extension Agent, and Jim Fettig, Maintenance Supervisor, had consented to work on a task force. The Commission consented to explore options and Commissioners Ova and Marks would serve on the committee.

Steve Thompson, Interstate Engineering, requested approval of the Construction Engineering Agreement for the Gackle Grade Raise, Project CER-4717(062). The engineering was about 15% of the contract price. ND Department of Transportation had indicated that the fees were reasonable considering the contract was for such a small project. Neys made a motion that was seconded by Kaiser to approve the \$26,372.13 contract. Roll call vote – Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose voted aye.

A motion was made by Ova and seconded by Marks to appoint Harold Bensch, Duane Andersen, Brian Amundson and Ryan Odenbach to a four year term on the Stutsman County Zoning Board. Motion carried.

Kaiser made a motion that was seconded by Neys to appoint the following as election workers for the June 10, 2008 primary election. Motion carried. A motion was made by Ova and seconded by Neys to establish the salaries for the 2008 primary election workers at \$8.00 per hour for clerks and judges and \$9.00 per hour for inspectors. Roll call vote – Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose and Ova voted aye.

Kaiser made a motion that was seconded by Marks to accept the following pasture bids: Parcel One (Corwin Township) – Leon and Mary Jane Westerhausen at \$559.00/year, Parcel Two (Hidden Township) – Ron Holzwarth at \$550.00/year. Roll call vote – Kaiser, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks voted aye.

Noel Johnson, County COO, reviewed the feed lot applications of Mark Kruger and Robert Froehlich for conditional use zoning permits. Kruger was requesting a permit for 941 animal units of beef cows, calves and replacements heifers at 7499 28th St SE, Buchanan in SW1/4 23-141-65, Hidden Township. Froehlich was requesting a permit for 750 animal units of beef cow/calf feeders at 5145 94th Ave SE, Montpelier in NW1/4 23-137-63, Manns Township. The applications had been approved by the Stutsman County Zoning Board and the ND Department of Health. The applications were in compliance with all zoning requirements.

Marks made a motion that was seconded by Ova to approve the conditional use permit application of Mark Kruger. Roll call vote – Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks and Kaiser voted aye.

A motion was made by Neys and seconded by Kaiser to approve the conditional use permit application of Robert Froehlich. Roll call vote – Klose, Ova, Marks, Kaiser and Neys voted aye.

Kaiser made a motion that was seconded by Ova to approve \$305.00 in taxable meals. Roll call vote – Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose voted aye.

Ova made a motion that was seconded by Neys to pay the mid month bills. Roll call vote – Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose and Ova voted aye.

Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney, requested approval of the Resolution Authorizing Intergovernmental Agreement and the Intergovernmental Agreement between McLean County, Mercer County and

Stutsman County to allow McLean County to issue up to \$101 million in Municipal Industrial Development Act (MIDA) Bonds to assist Great River Energy with refinancing and financing of the costs of solid waste improvements at Stanton Station, Coal Creek Station and Spiritwood Station. Ova made a motion that was seconded by Kaiser to approve the resolution and agreement. Roll call vote – Kaiser, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks voted aye.

Kaiser made a motion that was seconded by Neys to allow flex hours for County employees from mid-May to mid-September provided normal business hours were maintained by all departments. Motion carried.

Mike Zimmerman, County Highway Superintendent, requested permission to allow employees to work overtime to catch up with spring work. Road portfolio holders Kaiser and Marks would review and approve the requests.

Ova made a motion that was seconded by Kaiser to adjourn. At 8:45 a.m., the mid-month meeting of the Stutsman County Commission was adjourned.
