

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission

April 20, 2010

At 4:30 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, Doug Kaiser, Craig Neys, and Mark T. Klose answered roll call.

Robin Iszler, Central Valley Health District Administrator, presented the Health District's annual report. Flooding and H1N1 flu were the major activities for 2009. The health district provided over 6,000 immunizations for H1N1 and seasonal flu. The department added a new program for Chronic Disease management that was funded by a 3 year federal grant. The district was chosen to be one of only 13 sites across the country to pilot the Public Health Accreditation Project. Three new offices were added. The district entered into collaboration with four other counties in the area to work on tobacco control efforts. The department's \$1.8 million budget was funded with 53% federal, 48.5% local, and only 1.5% state dollars. Iszler reviewed regional health factor ratings that provided insight on what health care issues needed to be addressed.

Jim Fettig, Courthouse Maintenance Supervisor, presented the bids for pest control and lawn weed/feed services. Ova made a motion seconded by Kaiser to accept the bid of EcoLab for pest control as follows - LEC \$453.20, Memorial Building (3 levels) \$445.00 and Courthouse \$268.00. Roll call vote - Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose voted aye.

Two bids were received for lawn weed/feed services as follows: Green Lawns, Inc. - Courthouse \$411.25 and Correctional Center \$200.35 (total \$611.60); and Valley Lawn Applications - \$ 448.41. A motion was made by Kaiser seconded by Ova to accept the low bid provided bid specifications were met. Roll call vote - Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose and Ova voted aye.

Ney made a motion seconded by Kaiser to approve a \$10,000 loan from the General Fund Sub-account for Chicago Township for 5 years at 5% interest to repair flood damage to the township road in SW1/4 of Section 20. Roll call vote - Kaiser, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks voted aye.

A motion was made by Ova seconded by Marks to approve a loan from the General Fund Sub-account for Homer Township for 5 years at 5% interest to repair the Homer-Hidden Valley Road. Roll call vote - Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks and Kaiser voted aye.

Steve Thompson, Interstate Engineering, presented an engineering contract from Interstate Engineering for services to establish a mitigation bank for road projects. Kaiser made a motion seconded by Marks to approve the \$12,414.46 contract. Roll call vote - Klose, Ova, Marks, Kaiser and Neys voted aye.

Thompson requested permission to proceed with the final project concept reports for four ER (Emergency Relief) projects for a July bid letting. Kaiser made a motion seconded by Marks to authorize proceeding with the ER projects. Roll call vote - Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose voted aye.

Thompson reviewed the options for the road south of Cleveland. The Commission could submit another grade raise or realign the road and go around the slough. Raising the grade again would cost about \$1.5 million while going around would cost about \$1.2 million. Local cost share amounts were \$391,000 and \$321,000 respectively. Marks made a motion seconded by Neys to select the lower cost alternative realignment option and go around the slough. Roll call vote - Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose and Ova voted aye.

David Stuflick, FEMA Intergovernmental Affairs, informed the Commission of the current disaster declaration for public assistance and the possibility of another declaration for individual assistance. He was the FEMA liaison or point of contact for the County.

Steve Hochhalter, Woodworth Fire Department, reviewed the request to create a Woodworth Rural Fire Protection District. Currently, Woodworth is a fire department that contracts with local townships. Creating a district would allow a fire protection mill levy that would not take funds from the township's general mill levy. It would also allow the department to seek grants for building a new fire hall. Jerold Hertel, Glacier Township Chairman and Tim Schuster, Walters Township Chairman requested that their townships not be included in the new district. They currently contract with the Carrington Fire Department and they want to stay with Carrington because Carrington is closer than Woodworth. Ova made a motion seconded by Kaiser to pass the resolution creating the Woodworth Rural Fire Protection District for the following: all of Lowery Township (T144N R69W); all of Conklin Township (T144N R68W); all of Wadsworth Township (T143N R68W); all of Roosevelt Township (T143N R67W); all of Strong Township (T142N R68W); all of Paris Township (T142N R67W); sections 1 - 4, sections 10 - 14, sections 23 - 25 and section 36, Gerber Township (T143N R69W); sections 1 - 23 and sections 28 - 33, Pipestem Valley Township (T143N R66W); sections 3 - 10, sections 15 - 22 and sections 25 - 36, Round Top Township (T142N R66W), all in Stutsman

County, North Dakota and to direct the County Auditor to publish notice to elect a board of directors. Roll call vote – Kaiser, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks voted aye.

A motion was made by Ova seconded by Kaiser to approve the beer license and Sunday beer permit for Speedway Concessions, Inc. at Jamestown Speedway. Motion carried.

Kaiser made a motion seconded by Ova to designate the following polling locations, poll hours and election workers for the June 8, 2010 Primary Election and the November 2, 2010 General Election. Motion carried.

Polling locations: Precinct 1 – Pingree Community Center; Precinct 2 – Kensal Memorial Hall; Precinct 5 - Medina Memorial Hall; and Precincts 3, 4 and 6 and all City of Jamestown Precincts – Jamestown Civic Center (Jamestown Vote Center).

A motion was made by Marks seconded by Neys to approve \$310.00 in taxable meals. Roll call vote – Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks and Kaiser voted aye.

Kaiser made a motion seconded by Marks to hire Gerald Brickner at \$30 per hour and John Remillong at \$33.70 per hour as temporary employees with no benefits to assist with recycling paved roads. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Marks seconded by Ova to pay the mid-month bills. Roll call vote – Klose, Ova, Marks, Kaiser and Neys voted aye.
