

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission – April 21st, 2015

At 8:00 a.m., Chairman Klose called the mid-month meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, David Schwartz, Craig Neys, and Mark T. Klose answered the roll call.

Tyler Perleberg, Interim Tax Director, requested approval of abatement on parcel #80-1200200, in 2010 removed a mobile home from the land but was never adjusted to reflect on the tax statement. Ova made a motion, seconded by Marks to approve the abatement. Motion carried.

Deb Kantrud, South Central Dakota Regional Council, presented the board with a quarterly report held election of boards at their recent Executive Board meeting. CDBG had closed applications Friday with 4 applications and Craig Neys will be the Stutsman County representative. CDBG funds had a state review for a 5 year plan with improvements allowable to economic development. Barnes County Multi mitigation plan has been approved and will continue to work on Stutsman County’s multi mitigation plan.

Casey Bradley, Auditor/COO, tried getting a response back from ND Department of Transportation, majority of the projects were completed in 2013 but RTS Shearing has failed to close out the projects including two federal projects. Bradley is requesting approval to send a letter to RTS stating they will not be allowed to bid on any county projects until all projects are closed out. Moving forward Bradley suggests making it a requirement to have projects within a specified timeframe. Motion made by Schwartz, to send a letter of ineligibility to RTS and making it a requirement in the bidding process, seconded by Neys. Motion carried.

Mickey Nenow, Highway Superintendent, road projects, Road 44 has been completely destroyed and is requesting pulling off the alternative list and moving it to the top of the list. The 1 mile overlay would’ve been state funded but the road department will need to save the rip rap and possibly excavate 1 foot of the silt, lay fabric and build up 2 feet. Nenow will be contacting the state if they would be allowed to have the slope but should still be within the limits. The road department would like to replace the silt with clay to help stabilize the road overall. Schwartz made a motion to remove alternate seal coating and do county road 44, seconded by Marks. Motion carried.

Nenow, requested to carry over a week’s vacation to use up by the end of May. Finally at full staff so time would’ve been hard to take any leave Bradley does not see any problem allowing the carry over. The end of April is the carry over final date where it is a use it or lose it. Neys made a motion, seconded by Ova to allow the carry over.

Ova made a motion, seconded by Schwartz to approve the taxable meals and mid-month bills. Roll Call vote: Ova, Marks, Schwartz, Neys and Klose vote aye. Motion carried.
