

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission – April 21, 2020

At 4:00 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Ramone Gumke (via phone), David Schwartz, Steven Cichos (via phone), and Mark Klose answered the roll call.

Tyler Perleberg, Tax Director, requested a zoning change from agricultural to commercial for Clark Agronomy, Inc. The location would involve commercial resale of agricultural chemicals and fertilizer and would need a zoning change to comply with regulations. Ova made a motion, seconded by Schwartz, to approve the presented zoning change from agricultural to a commercial zoning district. Roll call vote: Ova, Gumke, Schwartz, Cichos and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.

Perleberg requested a property tax exemption for improvements to a residential building for Parcel #: 11-1621020. Schwartz made a motion to approve a 3-year exemption on the residential improvements at 100% for Parcel #: 11-1621020, seconded by Gumke. Roll call vote: Gumke, Schwartz, Cichos, Klose and Ova voted aye. Motion carried.

Cichos made a motion to appoint the presented 2020 Primary Election workers, seconded by Schwartz. Roll call vote: Schwartz, Cichos, Klose, Ova and Gumke voted aye. Motion carried.

A motion to extend FMLA (Family and Medical Leave Act) for Mickey Nenow, Road Superintendent, until the first commission meeting in June of 2020, was made by Schwartz, seconded by Cichos. Roll call vote: Cichos, Klose, Ova, Gumke and Schwartz voted aye. Motion carried.

Dave Schwartz, Commissioner, presented photos regarding ER funded grade raises. Federal guidelines must be followed if we choose to receive federal funding. Mike May, Interstate Engineering, came up with the total cost of \$5,789,000.00 for the four grade raises presented. The County share would be 20%, with a cost of approximately \$968,557.00. We may be able to reduce some of the wetland mitigation to lower the cost slightly. Schwartz thinks Stutsman County can address these sites through use of the emergency fund and not ER funding. If the County fully funds the projects, the costs would be brought down considerably. Since Stutsman County has some time to determine the funding source, Schwartz would like to solicit quotes on 3 sites. Schwartz made a motion to solicit quotes on site 47-01 (Streeter CR #37), 47-04 (Paris Township CR #67) and 47-05 (Round Top Township CR #42), seconded by Ova. Roll call vote: Klose, Ova, Gumke, Schwartz and Cichos voted aye. Motion carried.

A request to award a wheel loader bid was made by Mickey Nenow, Road Superintendent. This wheel loader would replace the 2009 model the Road Department currently has. Schwartz recommended awarding the low bid to Titan Machinery in the amount of \$154,869.00 for the

821 G Model with a 5-year warranty included. Cichos made a motion, seconded by Gumke, to approve the recommendation. Roll call vote: Ova, Gumke, Schwartz, Cichos and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.

Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Ova, to approve the presented taxable meals and mid-month bills. Roll call vote: Gumke, Schwartz, Cichos, Klose and Ova voted aye. Motion carried.
