

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission

May 1, 2007

At 4:00 p.m. the regular monthly meeting of the Stutsman County Commission was called to order by Chairman Klose. Roll call was answered by Douglas Kaiser, Craig Neys, Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, and Mark T. Klose.

A motion to approve the minutes of the April meetings was made by Neys and seconded by Kaiser. Motion carried.

Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney, reviewed the Municipal Industrial Development Act (MIDA). MIDA bonds were available to 501C3, non-profit corporations for financing projects and were also available to for-profit corporations for specific public good issues. The bonds were issued at no risk to the county. Community Action Region VI was seeking \$627,000 in MIDA bond financing to purchase a building. Their application was through LaMoure County, but they were asking Stutsman County to be the host jurisdiction. A motion to pass the resolution to serve as host jurisdiction for the MIDA bonds was made by Kaiser and seconded by Ova. Roll call vote - Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose all voted aye.

Dell Horn, Jamestown Community Corrections, updated the Commission on a legislative change that would provide revenue for his programs. Community services supervision fees paid by offenders and state funds for matching grants should off-set the loss in funding from the State Department of Corrections.

Steve Thompson, Interstate Engineering, presented the numbers for Phase I of the SC-4736(053) County Highway 38 reconstruction project. The low bid was \$2,030,294.08 by Gowan Construction from Oslo, Minnesota. The bid was \$300,000 below estimates and \$178,000 below the next lowest bidder. Noel Johnson, County COO, reviewed the funds available. \$1.62 million in County funds and \$1.375 million in Federal funds were available for 2007. The 2007 projected ending balance plus projected 2008 county and federal funds would provide \$1.54 million in resources for phase II or the paving portion of the project. Estimates for phase II were about \$2.0 million plus engineering expenses. The 2008 funds would not be adequate for phase II unless the county could get an advance on their 2009 federal funds or unless the county borrowed from their reserves. A motion was made by Kaiser and seconded by Marks to pass the resolution authorizing acceptance of the bid for Phase I and authorization to proceed with the project. Roll call vote - Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose and Ova all voted aye.

Kaiser made a motion that was seconded by Marks to approve the construction engineering services agreement with Interstate Engineering, Inc. for an amount not to exceed \$245,153.39 for Phase I of the County Highway 38 (SC-4736(053)) project. Roll call vote - Kaiser, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks all voted aye.

Warren Tobin, Veteran Service Officer, requested permission to attend accreditation training sponsored by the National Association of County Veterans Service Officers (NACVSO) in Waukesha, Wisconsin June 2 - 4, 2007. Mr. Tobin had received one of only five national scholarships to attend the training. The scholarship and funds from local veterans organizations would underwrite some of the cost. A motion was made by Marks and seconded by Ova to allow the out-of-state travel request. Motion carried.

David Orr, County Sheriff, requested that the Commission consider buying out Holiday Hours in his department. Two years ago, the County policy for carrying over holiday hours was changed. 300 hours is the maximum an employee can now carry over in any combination of vacation and holiday hours. The employee's total vacation and holiday hours have to be reduced to 300 by the end of the year or they lose the hours. Prior to the policy change, there was no limit on the number of holiday hours an employee could accumulate. Several of Sheriff Orr's employees cannot use up their hours by years' end without imposing a staffing hardship for his department. The Commission would consider a buy out and other options at budget time.

Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney, presented his monthly report. Ova made a motion that was seconded by Neys to enter into executive session for attorney consultation related to reasonably predictable civil litigation and/or pending civil litigation regarding damages to Highway 30 aka County Road 68 and Don Hofmann. Roll call vote - Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks and Kaiser all voted aye. The legal authority for closing this portion of the meeting was NDCC 44-04-19.1(5) and (9).

At 4:45 p.m. the executive session began and was attended by Commissioners Klose, Ova, Marks, Kaiser and Neys, and by Fritz Fremgen, Mike Zimmerman, County Highway Superintendent and Noel Johnson.

At 5:06 p.m. Kaiser made a motion that was seconded by Marks to adjourn the executive session. The meeting continued in open session, and the public was invited back to the meeting. Motion carried.

Kaiser made a motion that was seconded by Neys to deny the offer of \$6,000 by Hofmann's attorney to settle the law suit stemming from the damages to County Highway 68 north of Medina. Roll call vote - Klose, Ova, Marks, Kaiser and Neys all voted aye.

A motion was made by Neys and seconded by Kaiser to grant a Special Sunday Alcoholic Beverage Permit to the Buchanan Bar for May 20, 2007. Motion carried.

Ova made a motion that was seconded by Kaiser to grant a raffle permit to the Anne Carlson Center for Children. Motion carried.

Nellie Degen, Jamestown Reservoir cabin owner, thanked Johnson for organizing a meeting to resolve the septic system issues at the Reservoir.

At 5:11 p.m. the Commission meeting was recessed for the Park Board meeting.

Nygaard, Steve Thompson (Interstate Engineering), Jim Michael (Environmental Health Practitioner), and Jeffrey Seher.

A motion was made by Neys and seconded by Marks to approve the minutes of the April meeting. Motion carried.

Woodward made a motion that was seconded by Schlecht to approve the bills. Roll call vote - Woodward, Schlecht, Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys, and Klose all voted aye.

Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney, gave a report on the situation at Spiritwood Lake City. He had met with Jack Uehran and Ted Steckler. The goal was to resolve the issues within two years. Jack Uehran indicated that he was against requiring the permanent mobile homes to be moved off. His attorney would be making an offer to the Board. Paul Folmer questioned why the mobile homes had to be moved off as a non-public use when Ted Steckler could own a private bar/restaurant on the same property. Mr. Fremgen offered to visit with Mr. Folmer and share his prior opinions on the topic.

Johnson summarized the results of a meeting that was held to resolve some of the septic system compliance issues at the Reservoir. Representatives of the Park Board, Bureau of Reclamation, ND Department of Health, Interstate Engineering, Central Valley Health and cabin owners met to resolve questions about the requirements for sewer inspections. Bill Gunnerson, ND Department of Health, offered four criteria used by the State of Minnesota. The criteria were safety, water tight septic tank, septic treatment system (drainfield), and visible seepage or bubbling (system failure).

These criteria and an inventory of all systems at the Reservoir would satisfy the permit requirements.

A qualifying inspection must be filed with the Park Board. Inspections would have to be completed by a professional engineer and signed by the County Environmental Health Practitioner. Costs could vary depending upon the system. Existing systems would continue to be allowed provided they were not failing.

Nellie Degen, cabin owner, thanked Johnson for having the meeting on the septic system issues. She indicated that financial programs may be available to assist with the septic system compliance costs.

Dennis Lorenz, County Park Superintendent, gave his monthly report. Garrison Diversion had awarded a \$2,000 grant for picnic tables. The campgrounds and docks were ready to go for the season. A fuel tank had been purchased. He requested permission to purchase a new rotary mower for \$2,650. The item was in his 2007 budget. Ova made a motion that was seconded by Kaiser to allow the purchase. Roll call vote - Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose, Woodward, Schlecht and Ova all voted aye.

A motion to adjourn was made by Woodward and seconded by Schlecht. At 5:40 p.m. the May 1, 2007 Park Board meeting was adjourned.

At 5:41 p.m. the Stutsman County Commission meeting was called back to order with all Commissioners present.

Ney's made a motion that was seconded by Kaiser to pay the monthly bills. Roll call vote - Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose voted aye.
