

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission – May 1, 2018

At 4:00 p.m., Chairman Mark Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, David Schwartz, Craig Neys, and Mark Klose answered the roll call.

Chad Kaiser, Stutsman County Sheriff, discussed a part-time nurse salary for Corrections. Ova made a motion to approve hiring up to a Grade 14, Step 7, seconded by Schwartz. Roll call vote: Ova, Marks, Schwartz, Neys and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.

Connie Ova, JSDC, requested continuation of Train ND funding. Neys made a motion, seconded by Marks to approve the requested continuation of funding. Roll call vote: Marks, Schwartz, Neys, Klose and Ova voted aye. Motion carried.

A request for funding a Jamestown SBDC (Small Business Development Center) position was made by Connie Ova. Schwartz made a motion to approve the request, seconded by Marks. Roll call vote: Schwartz, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks voted aye. Motion carried.

Neys made a motion to approve paying the remaining balance of the South Central Dakota Regional Council dues if the Regional Council agrees to pay \$15,000 for the SBDC position, seconded by Ova. Roll call vote: Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks and Schwartz voted aye. Motion carried.

Ova made a motion to approve the minutes of the April 2018 meetings, seconded by Schwartz. Motion carried.

Tyler Perleberg, Director of Tax Equalization / Zoning Administrator, discussed the Adoption of Amendment to the County Zoning Ordinance pertaining to medical marijuana facilities. Updating fees for conditional use permits, amendments and variances was discussed. The fee is currently \$100.00 for each. Fees should cover the costs, but at this time, they do not. Klose would like an estimated fee schedule.

Josh Bond, Staff Appraiser, presented an application for abatement for parcels 22-0222020 and 22-0222022 due to a farm residence exemption. Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Neys to approve the presented application. Motion carried.

An application for abatement of parcel 46-2121000 was presented by Corey Genter, Staff Appraiser. Neys made a motion to approve the abatement based on Genter's recommendation of \$218,050, seconded by Ova. Motion carried.

Genter presented an application for abatement for parcel 46-3011041. Schwartz made a motion to approve the abatement based on Genter's recommendation of \$35,700, seconded by Ova. Motion carried.

Genter presented an application for abatement for parcel 46-3011011. Neys made a motion to approve the abatement based on Genter's recommendation of \$44,500, seconded by Ova. Motion carried.

Genter presented an application for abatement for parcel 78-1900010. Schwartz made a motion to approve the abatement based on Genter's recommendation of \$3,800, seconded by Ova. Motion carried.

Mickey Nenow, Highway Superintendent, presented his monthly report.

Nenow requested to use over-time as needed. Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Marks to approve the request. Motion carried.

The proposed 2019 road project was presented. Schwartz made a motion to allow design engineer for 4 miles of County Road 67 and 1 mile of County Road of 63, seconded by Ova. Motion carried.

Nancy Braun, Highway Office Coordinator, presented Wage & Benefit Committee recommendations for proposed salary and benefits for the 2019 budget year.

Absentee and early vote poll workers were presented by Nicole Meland, Auditor / COO. Neys made a motion to approve the presented poll workers, seconded by Schwartz. Motion carried.

Meland presented a memorandum regarding 2019 budget levy limits. A request that the board place a levy limit cap on all levies at a 0% increase and all departments to have budget requests that are at or below their 2018 requests, unless otherwise discussed and approved ahead of time by Meland or the board, was made. Ova made a motion, seconded by Schwartz to approve the presented requests. Roll call vote: Klose, Ova, Marks, Schwartz and Neys voted aye. Motion carried.

Parcel #86-1100200, a tax foreclosure property, was sold.

At 5:00 p.m., the Stutsman County Commission Meeting recessed for the County Park Board Meeting.

Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Houge to have the Sheriff serve a Notice of Intent to Terminate Permit if taxes are not paid within 30 days. Motion carried.

Kevin and Deb Carlson requested approval of a project application for cabin 6E. Houge approved the request, seconded by Woodward. Motion carried.

Houge made a motion, seconded by Neys, to adjourn the Park Board meeting. Motion carried.
