

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission – May 7, 2019

At 4:00 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Ramone Gumke, David Schwartz, Steven Cichos, and Mark Klose answered the roll call.

Gumke made a motion, seconded by Ova, to approve the April 2019 meeting minutes.

Fritz Fremgen, State’s Attorney, presented his monthly report. Reimbursement for witness fees from the Attorney General’s Office was discussed. Nicole Meland, Auditor/COO, recommended purchasing refundable airfare for witnesses who must fly. It would help mitigate any loss to the County, in her opinion.

A preliminary 2020 budget memorandum was presented by Meland. Schwartz made a motion not to exceed a 2% increase for outside agencies and levies, seconded by Gumke. Roll call vote: Ova, Gumke, Schwartz, Cichos and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.

Stutsman County will make personal contact to the chairman of Barnes County assuring them that Stutsman County has no issue continuing to house Barnes County inmates.

Mayor Grimm and Auditor Krapp, Spiritwood Lake City, discussed the water quality at Spiritwood Lake.

An abatement for parcel #72-1100160 was presented by Josh Bond, Appraiser. Bond recommended agreeing with the City of Cleveland and denying the abatements for 2017 and 2018 as the condition of the property was unknown at that time but approving the 2019 abatement as a review was completed. Schwartz made a motion to approve the recommended request, seconded by Ova. Roll call vote: Ova, Gumke, Schwartz, Cichos, Klose and Ova voted aye. Motion carried.

Corry Shevlin, JSDC, requested a new jobs funding request for MAINSAVER (North Central, Inc.). A motion to approve the presented request was made by Cichos, seconded by Gumke. Roll call vote: Schwartz, Cichos, Klose, Ova and Gumke voted aye. Motion carried.

At 4:48 p.m., the County Commission meeting recessed for the County Park Board meeting.
