At 8:00 a.m. the Stutsman County Commission meeting was called to order by Chairman Klose. Roll call was answered by Douglas Kaiser, Craig Neys, Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, and Mark T. Klose.

Steve Steinborn and Nancy Fuchs, Insure Forward, presented the rates for renewal of the County's insurance for 2007; Business Auto \$44,222.00, General Liability \$43,807.00, Inland Marine \$8,769.00, Hartford Steam \$5,181.05 less a conferment benefit of \$35,816.00 for a total insurance cost of \$66,163.05. The cost increases were mostly premium endorsement changes. Most of these increases were offset by an increase in the conferment reimbursement. Neys made a motion that was seconded by Ova to approve the insurance renewal. Roll call vote - Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose all voted aye.

Jay C. Grotrian, President of Duratech Industries International, Inc., presented a request for a 5 year, 100% property tax exemption for a 20,000 square foot engineering, service and shipping building expansion. They were projecting adding 20 to 30 new employees. Kaiser made a motion that was seconded by Ova to waive the notice to competitors requirement as there were no competing businesses in the County and to approve the exemption request. Roll call vote - Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose and Ova all voted aye.

Ova made a motion that was seconded by Kaiser to approve the raffle permit of Union Local 7-0953 at Sportsman's Bar and Café. Motion carried.

Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney, requested reconfirmation of Stutsman County hosting the agreement for MIDA bonds for Community Action Region VI. The agreement had been approved at the last Commission meeting, but approval of the resolution by LaMoure County had been delayed. Kaiser made a motion that was seconded by Marks to approve the resolution for Stutsman County to act as the host county for MIDA bond financing through LaMoure County for Community Action Region VI. Roll call vote - Kaiser, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks all voted aye.

Neys made a motion that was seconded by Ova to approve the gaming site authorizations of Knights of Columbus at Windsor Bar, Sportsman Bar, and Hitching Post Bar from July 1, 2007 to June 30, 2008. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Neys and seconded by Ova to approve \$112.50 in taxable meals. Roll call vote - Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks and Kaiser all voted aye.

Jim Boyd, JSDC Board, gave a presentation entitled "Jets for Jamestown". Also present was Johnny Klingenberg, Regional Airport Board member. Mr. Boyd was spearheading an effort to convince Northwest Airlines to provide jet service to Jamestown. Northwest Airlines had recently acquired Mesaba. Mesaba had the essential air service contract, but they were providing prop jet service, only. Area businesses were being surveyed to acquire numbers on potential passengers for the improved service at the airport assuming the fares would be competitive with Bismarck and Fargo. Northwest would require an average of 35 passengers per day. Mr. Klingenberg indicated that Jamestown had 10,000 boardings per year 30 years ago before they downsized the aircraft. The flights were here, but people were not using the service.

Steve Thompson, Interstate Engineering, presented the construction engineering contract for Phase II of the County Highway 38 (Ypsilanti road) reconstruction project. The engineering would be 10.5% of the project cost payable only as the work was completed. Kaiser made a motion that was seconded by Marks to approve the contract. Roll call vote - Klose, Ova, Marks, Kaiser and Neys all voted aye.

Mr. Thompson reported that right of way stakes had been dug under along a segment of the project. The property owner would be notified for possible reimbursement for the cost of re-staking the segment.

Mike Zimmerman, County Highway Superintendent, requested permission to advertise to replace a full time/seasonal employee that had resigned. Ova made a motion that was seconded by Marks to allow filling the vacancy. Motion carried.

Karen Samek, County Recorder, and Eric Godel, County Computer Support Specialist, requested permission to replace a reader/copier with a Scan Pro 1000 at a cost of about \$8,000. The current machine was purchased used over 10 years ago and it had been repaired a couple of times and has continued to cause problems. Kaiser made a motion that was seconded by Neys to approve the purchase. Roll call vote - Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose all voted aye.

Marks made a motion that was seconded by Ova to pay the mid-month bills. Roll call vote -Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose and Ova all voted aye.
