Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission – May 15, 2018

At 4:37 p.m., Chairman Mark Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, Dave Schwartz, Craig Neys, and Mark Klose answered the roll call.

Nicole Meland, Auditor/COO discussed the pasture grazing permit for Ron Holzwarth who leases County owned pasture land. He needs to repair a fence and is wondering if the Commission would be willing to extend his lease that currently ends in 2020 to 2023. A motion was made by Marks and seconded by Neys to extend the lease agreement for three years. Motion carried.

Meland requested approval of poll workers for the Primary Election on June 12th. There are still a couple spots open in the rural precincts. Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Neys, to approve the poll workers presented and give Meland permission to appoint two additional workers. Motion carried.

Jason Bitz, Insure Forward, presented the renewal figures for Stutsman County's insurance policies. The total cost is up about \$17,500 from last year. Ova made a motion to accept the 2018 insurance figures, seconded by Schwartz. Marks, Schwartz, Neys, Klose, and Ova voted aye. Motion carried.

Mickey Nenow, County Highway Superintendent, requested to award the bid for construction engineering for the Hwy 39 road project. Only one bid was submitted and it was from Interstate Engineering. Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Neys, to approve the construction engineering agreement. Motion carried. Nenow also presented a bid from Border State Paving for the road work. A motion was made by Marks, seconded by Ova to approve the bid. Schwartz, Neys, Klose, Ova, and Marks voted aye. Motion carried.

Nenow requested approval to purchase a gravel truck. This was budgeted for in 2018. Schwartz made a motion to approve purchase of a truck within the budget, seconded by Marks. Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks, and Schwartz voted aye. Motion carried.

Dave Schwartz gave an update on the 2019 road project. At the last meeting the Commission approved a double project of Hwy 67 (4 miles) and Hwy 63. They since found that Hwy 63 does not qualify for federal funding. Hwy 67 could still be done but would not utilize all of the federal funds. Another option would be to do Hwy 42 (5 miles) west of Buchanan which would use all of the funding. Schwartz recommended changing the road project from Hwy 67/63 to Hwy 42 west of Buchanan. Neys made a motion to change the 2019 road project to Hwy 42, seconded by Ova. Motion carried.

Jessica Alonge, Deputy Auditor/Recorder, presented a request to approve a special assessment for the property owned by Janice Harr (Parcel #35-2741011). The road department cleaned up this property and the total cost was \$6,288.57. A notice that the Board would consider the special assessment was advertised in the paper for two consecutive weeks as required by Century Code. After approval, an additional notice of placement of the special assessment will be placed in the paper for two consecutive weeks. A motion was made by Schwartz, seconded by Neys to add the special assessment to the tax rolls. Klose, Ova, Marks, Schwartz, and Neys voted aye. Motion carried.

Schwartz made a motion to approve the bills, seconded by Ova. Ova, Marks, Schwartz, Neys, and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.
