At 8:00 a.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, Doug Kaiser, Craig Neys, and Mark T. Klose answered roll call.

Steve Steinborn and Jason Bitz, Insure Forward, presented the insurance renewal for the County's insurance as follows: Business Auto - \$42,500; Liability - \$44,009; Inland Marine - \$12,769; Boiler - \$5,528. The premiums increased \$993 due primarily to a \$377,000 increase in coverage for Inland Marine. The conferment was up from \$17,017 to \$25,480. Overall cost was down \$7,470.11. Neys made a motion that was seconded by Kaiser to renew the insurance. Roll call vote – Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose voted aye.

A motion was made by Ova seconded by Marks to approve \$170.00 in taxable meals. Roll call vote – Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose and Ova voted aye.

A motion was made by Ova seconded by Neys to pay the mid-month bills. Roll call vote – Kaiser, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks voted aye.

Steve Thompson, Interstate Engineering, presented the memorandum of agreement for mitigation acres between the County and the NDIR Team that allows the County to proceed with the four grade raises that would be bid in July at the Department of Transportation. The Cleveland grade raise was also covered under this agreement. There are approximately 17 acres in the mitigation site. These projects would be using 11.81 acres. The County needs to be in agreement with the land owner and the NDIR team by September 30, 2010 and work to restore the wetlands must be completed by Oct 31, 2011. The County is responsible for all costs involved with restoration. A motion to accept the memorandum of agreement was made by Kaiser and seconded by Marks. Motion carried.

Thompson presented the construction engineering services agreement for the six small projects not to exceed \$28,000. Expenses are reimbursable 80/20 with ER. A motion to approve the agreement was made by Kaiser and seconded by Neys. Roll call vote – Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks and Kaiser voted aye.

Mike Zimmerman, County Highway Superintendent, stated that there needs to be a joint powers agreement between Barnes County and Stutsman County to share equipment. Zimmerman would have the State's Attorney address the issue.

The hearing for the organization of the Woodworth Rural Fire Protection District was held. Klose reviewed the procedure to establish the rural fire protection district. All steps had been completed up to the point of final organization and the establishment of the board of directors. The board must consist of at least seven directors because of the size of the district. Nominees to the Board were: Jason Struxness, Jerome Koenig, Brent Kuss, Codi Kuss, Wes Leapoldt, Jim Odenbach and Steven Hochhalter. Voting freeholders present at the hearing voted to elect the nominees to the Woodworth Rural Fire Protection District Board of Directors. The elected Board must meet to elect a president, vice president and secretary-treasurer. Johnson reminded the Board that they would need to submit a budget for the taxing district.

Tracey Trapp, Law Enforcement Administrator, requested out-of-state travel permission for his maintenance staff to attend a maintenance training workshop in Moorhead, MN on June 8, 2010. Kaiser made a motion seconded by Ova. Motion carried.

Warren Tobin, Veterans Service Officer, requested out-of-state travel permission to attend a national training session in Bloomington, MN from June 6 – June 11, 2010. The travel expense is in the budget and Rita Morris would be available to cover his office. Neys made a motion seconded by Ova to approve the out-of-state travel. Motion carried.

Johnson reviewed a request from Homer Township for a special assessment district. The Hidden Valley Road in Homer Township had been paved and is currently in poor condition. The residents along the road would like to pay for the road being repaved. Costs estimate for this project is about \$72,000. There are two options available: the first is to create a special assessment district to levy and collect assessment from the improvement district to pay for the improvement. Homer Township would be the sponsoring agent for this project, use their funds to pay for the project and then use the special assessment to repay the funds. The problem lies in the fact that the Township does not have the funds available to pay for the project. The second option available would be to petition to the County Commission. The Commission could use their bonding authority to finance the project. The finance costs – Engineering and Consulting, Bond Council, Bond Rating, Bond Registration and Publication – could run 30% to 35% or more of construction costs. An alternative to the Commission financing the project would be for the County to loan the funds to the Township and then the Township would fund the project and create the special assessment district for repayment. A motion was made by Marks and seconded by Kaiser to approve the funding if subsequent meetings prove that the residents are in agreement with the project. Roll call vote – Klose, Ova, Marks, Kaiser and Neys voted aye.

Ova made a motion seconded by Neys to adjourn. At 8:38 a.m. the mid-month meeting of the Stutsman County Commission was adjourned.
