

May 19, 2009

At 8:00 a.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, Craig Neys, Doug Kaiser and Mark T. Klose answered roll call.

Steve Steinborn and Nancy Fuchs, Insure Forward, presented the insurance renewal for the County's insurance as follows: Business Auto - \$42,857; Liability - \$43,980; Inland Marine - \$11,448; Boiler - \$5,528.11. The premiums increased \$1,575 based upon a few minor rate increases. The conferment was down from \$38,429 to \$17,017. The conferment was a premium refund that was dependent upon company profits and losses. Neys made a motion that was seconded by Ova to renew the insurance. Roll call vote – Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose voted aye.

Brian Carlson and Richard Welding, Gavilon Grain, LLC d/b/a Peavey Elevator, presented a 10 year payment in lieu of taxes exemption request for a proposed 40,000 ton bulk fertilizer facility that would be located at their existing facility in Midway Township. With their request, the company would pay taxes on the new improvements, but their taxes would go to the county for road improvements to their facility. The new plant would provide wholesale fertilizer to local retailers. Johnson pointed out that the statutes do not allow in lieu payments to go to only one entity. The in lieu payments must be apportioned to all taxing authorities – school, county, township and fire district. Cost estimates to pave or upgrade the access roads from the Interstate by-pass to the plant would be developed and a follow up special commission meeting would be held to act on the exemption request.

Lindsey Larson, Communications Coordinator, presented a JSDC request to update the marketing materials used to promote economic development. The \$50,000 would be an 80/20 City/County split. Ova made a motion that was seconded by Kaiser to approve the \$10,000 of County jobs development funds. Roll call vote – Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose and Ova voted aye.

Connie Ova, CEO-JSDC, presented a request for all City funds to provide up to 70% of the capital construction project cost not to exceed \$25,000 to abate water leakage issues at the Goodrich II building located at the airport. The building is owned by JSDC and leased to Goodrich. Larry Nohrenberg, Facilities Project Manager – Goodrich Cargo Systems, indicated that the facility had a history of water problems due to a high water table. Drain tile would be installed to prevent any potential mold or other sick building issues. Neys made a motion that was seconded by Marks to approve the request. Roll call vote – Kaiser, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks voted aye.

Ms. Ova presented a recommendation by the JSDC Board of Directors to use 100% City funds not to exceed \$42,000 to pay for the engineering costs to upgrade 3<sup>rd</sup> Street SE from the BNSF railroad crossing east to the Bloom road. The City would be using \$950,000 in Federal stimulus funds for the project, but stimulus funds could not be used to pay for engineering projects. Commissioner Klose questioned the expenditure and referenced a legal opinion by the JSDC attorney, Joe Larson. Mr. Larson opined that the expenditure did not meet the objectives and criteria for funding as set forth in JSDC's Bylaws, Policies and Statement. Marks made a motion that was seconded by Ova to deny the request. Roll call vote – Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks and Kaiser voted aye.

A motion was made by Ova and seconded by Neys to approve the site authorizations for Knights of Columbus at Hitching Post Bar, Ypsilanti Bar & Grill, Sportsman Bar and Windsor Bar. Motion carried.

Mike Zimmerman, County Highway Superintendent, reported that he was gathering information for a study on the culvert sizing along the creeks and other water sheds in the County. Many areas have had reoccurring problems with roads and culverts washing out. There were some FEMA funds available, but these funds would only partially underwrite the cost. Ken Dalsted, attorney for the Stutsman County Water Resource Board, indicated that a 30 day notice to the Board was required before resizing of any culvert. Joe Schmidt stated that the County had statutory authority to request the State Engineers office to do the study.

Zimmerman requested permission to hire a temporary employee to assist when an employee goes on maternity leave. He and Johnson would work out the details.

Zimmerman reported that the high water on the grade raise on County Highway 67 south of Cleveland would prevent the road from being paved this year. The 80/20 paving funds could be redirected to another grade raise. A 3' grade raise would cost over \$400,000. A concrete rip-rap blanket to prevent wave erosion would cost about \$172,000. Kaiser made a motion that was seconded by Marks to survey the elevations of the inlets and outlets on the basin wetland south of Cleveland that County Highway 67 crosses. Motion carried.

Zimmerman estimated the cost to fix the roads damaged by flooding at \$7 to \$8 million. 80/20 ER funds were available. He would get options for fixing the roads.

Zimmerman had obtained cost estimates to grind up 10 miles of pavement. The estimate was \$80,000 plus mobilization. This did not include the County's cost to relay, grade and gravel the recycled pavement. A new grinding machine could be lease/purchased for \$77,000 per year. The Commission requested information regarding patching costs on individual roads.

Karen Samek, County Recorder, requested moving an employee from 75% time to full time. Assistance from the Treasurer's office would no longer be available due to a retirement. Marks made a motion that was seconded by Neys to approve the full time employment.

Jan Thompson, County Treasurer, reported that Gayle Lange would be retiring the end of May. The full time position would be reduced to seasonal employment, as needed. Ova made a motion that was seconded by Marks to appoint Jacki Lindell as Deputy Treasurer. Motion carried.

Marks made a motion that was seconded by Ova to use the \$4,156.60 under – run funds from the 2007 FEMA reimbursement for a FEMA approved site. Motion carried.

Johnson gave a financial report. Flood related expenses to date were about \$450,000. Employee health insurance premiums would increase 35% July 1 for an added cost of \$150,000 to the County. An estimate of \$450,000 would be committed to township loans. There was approximately \$1 million in reserve funds for repairing roads – no other funds were available. Spending that amount would deplete all general fund sub account funds, all highway aid funds, and all road funds. Most reimbursements for flood related road repairs would be 80/20 or 20% County expenses. At an estimated repair cost of \$7 to \$8 million, the County's share would be \$1.4 to \$1.6 million.

Kaiser made a motion that was seconded by Marks to accept the bid of Morris Sealcoat and Trucking in the amount of \$184,632.84 for the chip sealing projects #'s STM-SC-4718(059) and STM-SC-4718(058). Motion carried.

Joe Schmidt commented on the out-of-state workers at the Great River Energy construction site in Spiritwood Township. He voiced his concerns that these workers were not paying temporary vehicle registration fees and/or state income tax as required by statute. There was a lack of enforcement by state and local officials.

A motion was made by Ova and seconded by Marks to pay \$85.00 in taxable meals. Roll call vote – Klose, Ova, Marks, Kaiser and Neys voted aye.

Ova made a motion that was seconded by Marks to pay the mid-month bills. Roll call vote – Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose voted aye.
