

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission – May 21, 2019

At 4:30 p.m., Chairman Mark Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Denny Ova, Dave Schwartz, Steven Cichos and Mark Klose and Ramone Gumke answered the roll call.

Jason Bitz, Insure Forward, presented a renewal of the Stutsman County's insurance. A motion to approve the presented renewal was made by Ova, seconded by Gumke. Motion carried.

Updates and developments for the Opioid Litigation was presented by Curtis Olafson, ND Field Director for Motley Rice Law Consortium. Jonathan Novak also spoke. This topic was tabled until the next meeting.

Tyler Perleberg, Stutsman County Director of Tax Equalization, presented a Conditional Use Permit for a borrow pit/excavation for Knife River Materials. Schwartz made a motion to approve the presented permit, seconded by Cichos. Motion carried.

Corwin Township would like a relinquished their zoning rights for Medical Marijuana to the County.

An agreement between the North Dakota Department of Transportation (DOT) and Stutsman County was presented by Mickey Nenow, Road Superintendent regarding sign responsibility in DOT right-of-way. Gumke made a motion, seconded by Schwartz, to approve the presented agreement. Motion carried.

Roads into Spiritwood Lake Resort and Sandy Beach were requested to be chip sealed. There are funds in the Road Maintenance budget. Gumke made a motion to approve the request, seconded by Ova. Roll call vote: Gumke, Schwartz, Cichos, Klose and Ova voted aye. Motion carried.

Nenow presented his monthly report. Road restrictions are still on. Road Department funds were discussed with regards to the overtime budget and road projects.

Jerry Bergquist, Stutsman County Emergency Manager, updated the board on the Memorandum of Agreements with the townships regarding FEMA funding. All the townships signed and returned the agreements and copies were sent to the State, Road Department and the Auditor's Office.

Bergquist presented information from Senate Bill 2016 which provides for each township to receive \$5,000 from the State. The County Treasurer will receive the funds in June and the funds will be disbursed to the townships as part of their monthly payment in July.

House Bill 1435 was presented by Bergquist. Funding for State-wide interoperable radio networks was discussed. Bergquist updated the commission regarding the radio console replacements.

Corry Shevlin, JSDC, requested a tax reimbursement for a lot in the Bloom Ag Park. Cichos made a motion, seconded by Schwartz, to approve the request. Roll call vote: Schwartz, Cichos, Klose, Ova and Gumke voted aye. Motion carried.

Gumke made a motion, seconded by Ova, to de-obligate the ND Soy Processors New Job Training Funds awarded in 2017. Motion carried.

Cichos made a motion to approve the presented special event permits for the Corner Bar at the Boondocks, seconded by Ova. Motion carried.

Gumke made a motion to approve the taxable meals and mid-month bills, seconded by Schwartz. Roll call vote: Cichos, Klose, Ova, Gumke and Schwartz voted aye. Motion carried.
