

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission

June 7, 2011

At 4:47 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, David Schwartz, Craig Neys and Mark T. Klose answered roll call.

Marks made a motion seconded by Schwartz to approve the minutes of the May 2011 meetings. Motion carried.

Connie Ova, CEO-JSDC, requested approval of the revisions to JSDC policies and procedures regarding the use of the Bank of ND Flex PACE Interest Buy-Down Program. The revisions would clear up questions regarding who could qualify for the funds. The program would be “open to all businesses”. The economic developments funds were a loan that was available provided qualifying criteria was met. The program was another tool to create jobs. Marks made a motion seconded by Neys to approve the policy change. Roll call vote – Ova, Marks, Schwartz, Neys and Klose voted aye.

Requests for proposals were reviewed for the County Highway 67 realignment project one mile south of Cleveland – CER-4717(068). Interstate Engineering was the only firm to provide a proposal for construction engineering services. Ova made a motion seconded by Schwartz to hire Interstate Engineering for construction engineering for the project. Roll call vote – Marks, Schwartz, Neys, Klose and Ova voted aye. Steve Thompson provided a cost estimate of \$47,289.01 for the services.

Mickey Nenow, County Highway Superintendent, reported that work on 2 of the 4 emergency grade raises would begin next week. Border States would be paving the Gavilon road sometime after July 4th. Border States was requesting approval of a haul road agreement. They would agree to overlay and maintain that part of County Road 40 from 281 East to the section line road that leads to their Asphalt plant. In exchange, they requested permission to haul the same loads that are allowed on US281 on the approximately 1,000 feet of road from their plant road to the US281 bypass. Schwartz made a motion seconded by Marks to approve the haul road agreement. Roll call vote – Schwartz, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks voted aye.

Ova made a motion seconded by Marks to approve the resolution to award the low bid of \$320,966.63 from Guthmiller Earthmoving, Inc. for CER-4717(068) – the realignment of County Highway 67 one mile south of Cleveland project. Roll call vote – Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks and Schwartz voted aye.

Fritz Fremgen, State’s Attorney, presented the escrow agreement between Gavilon Grain and Stutsman County. Gavilon Grain would deposit \$800,000 in an escrow account to guarantee payment of the cost of paving the access road to their plant in Midway Township. Neys made a motion seconded by Schwartz to approve the escrow agreement. Motion carried.

Fremgen presented his monthly report. He reported that a fraud policy had been developed for compliance with Audit requirements, and that the State had developed a model wind ordinance. The termination appeal of Margo Haut was at the State level and the ND Insurance Reserve Fund attorneys were handling the case on behalf of Stutsman County. Assistant State’s Attorney Heitkamp was working on the policies for Title VI compliance.

Larry Hauger and Dan Schneider representing Colonial Life Benefits reintroduced themselves and their company as another company that provided deferred compensation products for employees similar to AFLAC.

Schwartz made a motion seconded by Neys to make the following Board nominations: School Reorganization Committee – Ruth Urdahl and Beverly Brunsch; Housing Authority – Allen Falk and Tonya Perkins (unexpired term); Joint Library Board – Dale Marks; and Central Valley Health District Board – Dennis Ova. Motion carried.

Ova made a motion seconded by Schwartz to approve the raffle permit applications of Buffalo City Gun club and the Anne Carlsen Center. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Neys seconded by Schwartz to approve the gaming site authorizations for the Knights of Columbus at Sportsman Bar, Windsor Bar, Ypsilanti Bar & Grill and the Hitching Post. Motion carried.

Ova made a motion seconded by Neys to approve the following liquor licenses and Sunday alcoholic beverage permits. Liquor licenses/Sunday alcoholic beverage permits: Wayne and Hilda Kuntz d/b/a Sportsman Bar, Sandra Norquist d/b/a Ypsilanti Bar & Grill, Carmel Demaray d/b/a Windsor Bar, Ronald Davis d/b/a Cuz’n Rons Saloon, Judy Ganser d/b/a Anchor Bar, Joey Uehran d/b/a 281 Stop and

Shawndell Gudmestad-Moore d/b/a Hitching Post. Liquor license: Krewzer's Dream, Inc. (Krissi & Robert Wenzel) d/b/a Buchanan Bar. Motion carried.

At 5:19 p.m., the Commission meeting was recessed for the Park Board meeting.

Jack Uehran requested approval of an assignment of his lease for the campgrounds at Spiritwood Lake. He was assigning his interest for the remaining 8 years of his lease of the land for the campgrounds to Ken Getz d/b/a Getz's Shady Cove Campgrounds. Schwartz made a motion seconded by Marks to approve the Assignment and Assumption Agreement. Roll call vote: Woodward, Ova, Marks, Schwartz, Neys, Klose and Schlecht voted aye.

Jack Wagner, Secretary/Treasurer of the Medina Sportsman Club, requested liability insurance coverage under the County's policy for a boat dock at the Southwest corner of Bader Lake off of the Matt Rau property. Gene Van Eeckhout, ND Game and Fish Department, indicated that other clubs had acquired coverage as a rider under other County's insurance policies. Van Eeckhout also stated that insurance coverage would be a requirement in the future for assistance from Game and Fish. Lorenz stated that keeping maintenance records was a must for liability purposes. The County would check with their insurance company to explore the possibility. A motion was made by Schwartz seconded by Schlecht to authorize the campground committee to make a decision on the request. Motion carried.

Marks made a motion seconded by Woodward to transfer Lot 46 West Side Jamestown Reservoir from Gerald Sande to David and Anne Richter. Motion carried.

Dennis Lorenz, County Park Superintendent, reported on the cost and financing of installing rural water at Pelican Point Landing. The Bureau would be able to assist in the cost and Stutsman Rural Water

District could possibly be receiving a grant that could help with the cost. Johnson questioned who would be responsible for necessary easements. Geneva Kaiser, Manager of Stutsman Rural Water District, stated that they would be able to take care of the easements and obtain necessary signatures. The estimated cost of the project was in the \$80,000 range. The Bureau would match 50/50 (\$40,000). Johnson reviewed the expenditure budget for County Park. The budgeted amount for the Jim River Boat Club ramp, \$60,000, was funded 100% by a grant so the money that had been budgeted for that project would be available to fund this project. Johnson said that this was the next logical project at Pelican Point Landing. Nick Grosulak may also contribute to the project. Ova may a motion seconded by Woodward to proceed with the project with the line diameter dependent on Grosulak's participation and continued funding from the Bureau. The project would need to be bid. Roll call vote: Ova, Marks, Schwartz, Neys, Klose, Schlecht and Woodward voted aye.

Lorenz requested permission to purchase a 20' full-tilt tandem trailer. He reviewed the quotes and trailer specs that he had obtained and recommended purchasing the trailer from PJ Trailer for \$5,600. Schwartz made a motion seconded by Schlecht to approve the purchase. Roll call vote: Marks, Schwartz, Neys, Klose, Schlecht, Woodward and Ova voted aye.

Lorenz reported that he had ordered trees from Lincoln Oakes Nursery and he also received trees from Game and Fish to replant into the nursery. Every fall trees are pulled out to transplant around the park. Water level was still an issue at Pelican Point Landing so would be awhile before it can open. Marks reported that the Ypsilanti Park washed out again.

Woodward reported that a letter regarding dogs-at-large needs to be sent to an individual. Ova made a motion to send the letter and Marks seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Woodward questioned if lease payments could be reduced due to the high water the last three years. Schlecht stated that unfortunately everyone has the same situation.

A motion was made by Ova seconded by Woodward to adjourn. At 6:13 p.m. the County Park Board meeting was adjourned.

At 6:17 p.m., the regular Commission meeting was called back to order with all Commissioners present.

Chairman Klose presented ideas on how to proceed with advertising for the COO/Auditor's position. He suggested that he and Commissioner Schwartz, Commission members on the County Personnel Committee along with Bob Toso, Superintendent from Jamestown Public Schools could meet as a committee to get the job description in order, write the ad, select the target area and get the ad published. Once applications are in, all commissioners would be part of the interview committee. Johnson said that he had prepared the CPQ previously and that he wanted the position created the way the Commission wanted it. The salary range would be the biggest issue. The other positions that Johnson was responsible for would need to be farmed out to other individuals within the County. Johnson said that it would most likely be August/September before this person could be on staff. One of the largest jobs was budgeting – it's easy to spend it but you have to know where the money was coming from. This person should be involved with the budget process, the County has had very good budget compliance and we need to maintain that. Johnson stated that he was trying to make a smooth transition for the Commission and that he was willing to stick around to help in the process. He also iterated that there was a good support staff. Ova made a motion seconded by Marks to forward the COO/Auditor CPQ to the consultant for classification on the County pay scale and to advertise for the COO/Auditor Position. Motion carried.

The position of Staff Appraiser was open and it was already a classified position within the County pay scale. Schwartz made a motion seconded by Neys to advertise for the Staff Appraiser position. Motion carried.

The bills were presented for review and approval with an additional bill payable to Jamestown Rural Fire Department for \$1,262.00. Klose questioned the bill for \$324.99 from Gun and Reel for gun repair. A motion was made by Ova, seconded by Marks to approve the bills for payment with the exception of the Gun and Reel bill. Roll call vote: Ova, Marks, Schwartz, Neys and Klose voted aye.
