

June 16, 2009

At 8:00 a.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, Craig Neys, Doug Kaiser and Mark T. Klose answered roll call.

Eunice Sahr, County Extension Agent, requested renewal of the family nutrition program. The program is funded in-kind at no cost to the County other than about \$1,850 in supplies. Neys made a motion that was seconded by Ova to renew the program for another year. Motion carried.

Sahr requested support for an NDSU Extension Service Agent-in-Training Program. Stutsman County was selected as one of two counties in the state that could participate in the program by the NDSU Extension Service. There would be no cost to the County for the Family Consumer Science and 4-H position. The only possible cost could be some incidental travel expense that would come out of the department's budgeted travel expense. Ova made a motion that was seconded by Kaiser to support the NDSU Agent-in-training program. Roll call vote – Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose voted aye.

Dave Orr, County Sheriff, informed the Board that he had applied for a grant to fund a full time deputy position for 4 years. The 100% grant would fund vehicle and other employee related expenses.

Orr indicated that he had hired a new employee that had approximately 7 years of experience with the ND Highway Patrol and education in criminal justice. He had indicated to the employee that the position would start on grade 10 step 5 because of his experience. Johnson cautioned that County policy allows up to 3 steps for new employees with specific experience – any deviation from that policy required Commission approval. Kaiser made a motion that was seconded by Ova to deviate from policy and start the employee on grade 10 Step 5 because of the employee's experience and education. Roll call vote – Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose and Ova voted aye.

Orr requested starting the new employee with 500 hours of sick leave. This was the amount of leave that he had accumulated when he left his State position. He could not get paid for the leave because State policy required ten years of employment before anyone was vested in their sick leave. Johnson indicated that accumulated benefit hours did not transfer from the State to the County. Chairman Klose requested a motion to allow the sick leave hours. No motion was made.

Marks made a motion that was seconded by Neys to advertise for bids for Sheriff's Department vehicles. Motion carried.

Neys made a motion that was seconded by Kaiser to make the following appointments: Stutsman County School Reorganization Board – Terry Schwartz (Dist 3), Don Hofmann (Dist 5), Charles Axtman (Dist 1 Alternate), Ann Marks (Dist 2 Alternate) and Dwight Hofmann (Dist 5 Alternate); Central Valley Health District Board – Cindy Schaar; Jamestown City Planning Commission – Jane Trautman; and the Stutsman County Housing Authority – Wade Williams. A motion was made by Ova and seconded by Kaiser to allow Commissioner Marks to vote on the appointments. Motion carried. All Commissioners voted aye on the motion to make the appointments.

The pest control bids were opened as follows: Ecolab (only bidder) – Stutsman County Library (\$200/year), Law Enforcement Center (\$440/year), Courthouse (\$260/year) and Memorial Building-3 levels (\$432/year). Ova made a motion that was seconded by Marks to accept the bids. Roll call vote – Kaiser, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks voted aye.

Mike Zimmerman reported that he was still waiting for cost estimates to come back on all necessary road repairs. Klose stated that he wanted to see what funds expenditures would be coming out of and the balance in those funds. Klose asked if FEMA was working in the County on funding issues. Zimmerman stated that a FEMA representative was working in Eldridge Township. FEMA approved the use of clay versus pit run sand and gravel. There were concerns that some contractors were charging too much. A bridge inspector would be coming out to check out the bridges. At this time it looks like the townships would be responsible for 3% of the road repair costs. No reimbursements had been received from FEMA as of this time.

Klose said that Art Perleberg, Midway Township Supervisor, had approved fixing the culvert area on West Lakeside Road south of cabin 28. Zimmerman said that they would get it repaired.

Johnson stated that he needed to work with the State's Attorney on an agreement for the loans to the townships for road repairs.

Marks made a motion seconded by Kaiser to approve the Conditional Use Permit for Entzminger Dairy. Roll call vote – Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks and Kaiser voted aye.

Neys made a motion seconded by Ova to approve the liquor license and Sunday alcoholic beverage permit for Joey Uehran d/b/a 281 Stop. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Ova and seconded by Marks to pay \$127.50 in taxable meals. Roll call vote – Klose, Ova, Marks, Kaiser and Neys voted aye.

The Congressional Delegation would be holding a meeting on Saturday, June 20, 2009 at 11:30 a.m. in the lower level meeting rooms for the LEC to discuss flooding issues.

Marks made a motion to approve the mid-month bills. Ova seconded the motion. Roll call vote – Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose voted aye.
