

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission

June 17, 2008

At 8:00 a.m. the mid-month meeting of the Stutsman County Commission was called to order by Chairman Klose. Roll call was answered by Douglas Kaiser, Craig Neys, Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, and Mark T. Klose.

Eunice Sahr, County Extension Agent, requested approval of the annual renewal of the Family Nutrition Program. The program is funded in-kind and it provides assistance for individuals that qualify for food stamps and children that qualify for reduced meals. Marks made a motion that was seconded by Neys to renew the program for another year. Motion carried.

Ova made a motion that was seconded by Kaiser to appoint: Dr. Philip Jystad to the Central Valley Health District Board, Katherine Meidinger to the Library Board, Ruth Urdahl and Beverly Brunsch to the School Reorganization Committee, and Charles Purdy to the Jamestown City Planning Commission. Motion Carried.

A motion was made by Neys and seconded by Ova to approve the liquor licenses and Sunday alcoholic beverage permits of Wayne & Hilda Kuntz d/b/a Sportsman Bar, Carmel Demaray d/b/a Windsor Bar, and Judith Ganser d/b/a Anchor Bar; and to approve the beer license of Casey Dodgson d/b/a Buffalo Lanes, Inc. for the Stutsman County Fairgrounds beer garden. Motion carried.

Connie Ova, JSDC-CEO, and Donna Zimmerman, Buffalo City Tourism Board President, requested approval of continued funding for the Buffalo City Tourism Foundation (BCTF) from the County Jobs Development fund for another four years. Also present were Harley Trefz, Jane Trautman, Pam Phillips, Bob Lulay and Nina Sneider. The \$797,400, four year request, would continue funding BCTF on an 80/20 City/County split or \$159,400 in County funds. The four-year contract would align with the 2012 expiration of JSDC's 1% sales tax. The City had amended the original contract to stipulate that any request for funds from BCTF that exceeded \$2,000 would have to be approved by the City. A motion was made by Ova and seconded by Kaiser to approve the funding request without the City's amendment Roll call vote – Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose voted aye.

Ms. Ova reviewed three resolutions that had been forwarded to the Commission from the Jamestown City Council. The first resolution would change the JSDC policy and procedures to allow an applicant the ability to appeal a rejected funding application. The policy would allow the City and/or the County to modify and approve funding requests that had been rejected by JSDC. Ova commented that the policy was in place to take the political pressure off the elected boards. Commissioner Marks favored the idea of giving the applicant another opportunity for funding. Commissioner Klose questioned the respective Boards ability to judge the merits of an application without the insight of the professionals on the JSDC Board. Kaiser made a motion that was seconded by Neys to reject the amendment and leave the policy as is. Roll call vote: Marks – nay, Kaiser – aye, Neys – aye, Klose – aye and Ova – aye. Motion carried.

The second resolution would amend the JSDC by-laws. The change would eliminate the City and County at-large positions on the JSDC Board. Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney, questioned whether or not the City and or County had the authority to change the by-laws of JSDC as it was a private Corporation. Commissioner Klose stressed the importance of adequate representation on the JSDC Board regardless of consenting or dissenting opinion by the respective representatives. Ova made a

motion that was seconded by Kaiser to reject the proposed amendment. Roll call vote – Kaiser, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks voted aye.

The third resolution would amend the JSDC policies and procedures to provide that where only Stutsman County funds were being expended, only the Stutsman County Commission would need to approve the request, and similarly, where only City funds were being expended, only the City would need to approve the request. Marks made a motion to approve the amendment. Motion died for lack of a second.

Ms. Ova reviewed the draft proposal of the 2009 JSDC budget. The administrative expense cost for the County would decrease from \$70,500 to \$68,000.

Mike Zimmerman, County Highway Superintendent, presented the preliminary engineering contracts for paving the Cleveland and Gackle grade raises. ND Department of Transportation had reviewed the contracts and they had indicated that the \$4,928.31 cost for each project was appropriate. Kaiser made a motion that was seconded by Marks to approve the Interstate Engineering contracts. Roll call vote – Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks and Kaiser voted aye.

Ova made a motion that was seconded by Marks to certify 1,755 miles of organized township roads and 40 miles of unorganized township roads for 2008 to the ND State Treasurer. Roll call vote – Klose, Ova, Marks, Kaiser and Neys voted aye.

Zimmerman reported that he had depleted his budget for crack sealing and that about 50 miles of crack sealing did not get completed. Hard decisions would have to be made to not overspend this year's budget.

Commissioner Neys shared a complaint about the commercial haulers using jake brakes on the hill adjacent to the livestock sales barn. Jake brakes were a DOT approved safety device. The County had posted signs, but the County had no noise ordinance.

Jerry Bergquist and Dianne Nygaard, representing the County Employees Association, presented policies for grievance, personnel, newsletter and wage & benefits committees as authorized by the Commission. The policies outlined the purpose and duties of the committees and procedures for representation, appointment and terms of office. Kaiser made a motion that was seconded by Neys to approve the policies. Motion carried.

Jerry Bergquist, 9-1-1 Coordinator/Emergency Manager requested approval of the Qwest contract to renew T-1 phone line service. The options were to renew for three years at \$480 per month, to renew for 5 years at \$430 per month or to pay \$1,100 on a month to month basis. Ova made a motion that was seconded by Marks to renew the contract for five years. Motion carried.

Bergquist presented a joint powers agreement between Stutsman County and the City of Jamestown for the digital mapping of Jamestown. The County would pay for an accuracy standard similar to the mapping of the current 9-1-1 system. The City would pay for any enhancement to the accuracy standard beyond the accuracy required for 9-1-1 purposes. A motion was made by Neys and seconded by Kaiser to enter into the joint powers agreement. Roll call vote – Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose voted aye.

Bergquist reviewed the photo ID system that was being developed to identify emergency responders. The ID would identify individuals qualified to assist at emergency or disaster situations.

Kaiser made a motion that was seconded by Neys to appoint Lance Brower, Wayne Fylling, Sue Lunde, Robyn Phillips and Andrew Schneider to the LEPC (Local Emergency Planning Committee). Motion carried.

A motion was made by Ova and seconded by Kaiser to accept the bid of Ecolab for pest control – LEC \$430.40, courthouse \$260.00, Memorial Building \$420.00, and County Library \$196.00. Roll call vote – Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose and Ova voted aye.

Ova made a motion that was seconded by Marks to approve \$122.50 in taxable meals. Roll call vote – Kaiser, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks voted aye.

A motion was made by Neys and seconded by Kaiser to pay the mid-month bills. Roll call vote – Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks and Kaiser voted aye.
