Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission – June 19, 2018

At 4:30 p.m., Vice-Chairman Denny Ova called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Denny Ova, Dale Marks, Dave Schwartz, and Craig Neys answered the roll call. Mark Klose was absent.

Sam Seafeldt, Jamestown Regional Airport Director, presented a resolution authorizing commitment of Stutsman County for payment of any deficiency of Facility Passenger Fee Revenue Bonds to finance the construction of a passenger parking lot mill and overlay. The parking lot rehab will increase capacity from 130 to 200 spots. The resolution states that if the passenger facility funds do not cover the payment, the county is required to use the airport's levy to pay the remainder due. Neys made a motion to approve the resolution, seconded by Schwartz. Schwartz, Neys, Ova, and Marks voted aye. Motion carried.

Jerry Bergquist, Emergency Manager/9-1-1 Coordinator, presented an update on the 9-1-1 system and radio console equipment. Barnes County recently left the shared 9-1-1 system and joined the system operated by the state. This leaves Stutsman and Richland Counties on the shared system. The servers should have been replaced in December 2017 but they have been working with the vendor to extend the warranty until April 2019. The counties share a call-logging system and dispatch abilities. Bergquist would like to replace the equipment in 2019. The radio console system is 12 years old and is also in need of replacement. Motorola will stop servicing these systems in December of 2018. The state ITD system is working on an integrated state-wide system but it is not clear when the system will be ready. This makes budgeting for 2019 difficult. Bergquist plans to use the fund balance to cover the increased costs in the 2019 budget if both systems need to be replaced in the same year.

Connie Ova, JSDC, presented the 2019 proposed budget. JSDC will not exceed the allocation for the economic development funds. Schwartz made a motion to approve the preliminary budget, seconded by Neys. Neys, Ova, Marks, and Schwartz voted aye. Motion carried.

Ova also presented a request to replace the flooring in the lower level of the office building. The lowest bid is \$4,300.00 with a County share of \$430.00 to replace carpet in the entry and hallway. Schwartz made a motion to approve the request, seconded by Marks. Ova, Marks, Schwartz, and Neys voted aye. Motion carried.

Nicole Meland, Auditor/COO presented a request to add Jessica Alonge as a signor for the credit card accounts. Ova made a motion, seconded by Schwartz to approve the addition. Motion carried.

Meland also requested to increase the number of signors required to add credit card accounts. Currently only one signor is required, and she would like to increase it to two to ensure best practice. Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Marks to increase the required number of signors on credit card accounts. Motion carried.

Meland also presented a request to move the July 3, 2018 Commission meeting to July 10, 2018 at 4:00 p.m. Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Marks, to re-schedule the meeting. Motion carried.

Meland discussed concerns about the election regarding obtaining workers in the rural locations, issues receiving the memory card from the Kensal location on election night, and people not showing up for training. Meland wants the commission to think about closing some rural polling locations and possibly charging other entities for election costs.

Mr. Brown was present to discuss culverts in Sharlow Township that that County Commission declined to pay to maintain in 1997. Mr. Brown indicated the Commission had previously told him they would maintain the culverts when they replaced the wooden bridges. He discussed with the township officers as well, who talked with the state. He made a map of all the wooden bridges in the township that were replaced with culverts. The township has paid \$16,000 on culverts already this year. Schwartz said that the county is responsible for bridges but the rules on culverts are unclear. He recommended they do some more research and re-address the issue later.

Marks made a motion to approve the taxable meals and mid-month bills, seconded by Schwartz. Marks, Schwartz, Neys, Ova voted aye. Motion carried.
