Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission – June 20, 2017

At 4:35 p.m., Vice-Chairman Denny Ova called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Denny Ova, Dale Marks, Dave Schwartz and Craig Neys answered the roll call. Mark T. Klose was absent.

A request for approval of Retail Fireworks License for WT Fireworks was made. Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Marks to approve the presented license. Motion carried.

Mickey Nenow, Highway Superintendent, presented his monthly report. They began doing blade patching again. Graveling was started. Chip-seal on 20 miles North and South of 62 and East of Spiritwood is complete. Gravel crushing will start at the end of June or beginning of July. The Road Department is still replacing culverts for some of the townships and ones for the County. County Road 43, Wimbledon cut-across, will be started sometime in July. County Road 44, North of Woodworth, is planned to begin at the end of July or beginning of August.

Sand was hauled to Pelican Point. The County shop brought in 6 loads. The plan is to level out the sand. Tom Perleberg has sand for \$2.00 per yard, which is about a 20 mile round trip, and Border States Paving is at the same price. Another option is to go up to Walters Township where Jim Mitchell has sand for \$1.00 per yard, but would be a 57 mile round trip. The commissioners originally approved 1,000 yards and only have 108 yards to spread, at the moment. Commissioner Neys inquired about Highway 10.

Corey Genter, Staff Appraiser, presented an abatement request for parcel ID #16-4000740 and parcel ID #16-4000750 for Darrel Wagner. These are located in Eldridge Township. On May 17, 2017, Mr. Wagner filled out an abatement request stating the house was unlivable with a very poor structure. The shop was overvalued, because it did not have a concrete floor in it. The values were lowered. The application was presented to the township board and they approved the request of \$531,017.00. Mr. Genter's recommendation is to approve the abatements as presented. Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Neys to approve the abatements as requested. Roll call vote: Neys, Ova, Marks and Schwartz voted aye. Motion carried.

Raymond Hofmann proposed a cattle guard on 26th Street on the West side of Pearl Lake in Chase Lake Township. Currently, the road is closed. Mr. Hofmann would like the cattle guard put in place in case the road is ever open again. The road may or may not ever come out of water. Schwartz suggested issuing a permit from Stutsman County. Schwartz made a motion to allow Mr. Hofmann to do a cattle guard with a permit, seconded by Neys. This project is Wetland Trust funded. There is no expense to the County. Roll call vote: Ova, Marks, Schwartz and Neys voted aye. Motion carried.

It came to Mr. Hofmann's attention that the cemetery plot, St. Mary's Catholic Cemetery, has never been taken off of the tax roll. They are side by side, but that acre was never taken off. There is 33 feet that was given to the church by Mr. Hofmann's dad. It was given to the church in the late 20's.

He has spoken with Tyler Perleberg, Tax Director, but stated nothing has been done. Mr. Perleberg stated, "For valuation purposes, since we go by land use, we negate all of the cemeteries out, so he's not being taxed on it." Mr. Hofmann is listed as the owner of it. The Bagan family had given the land to the church.

Correy Shevlin, JSDC, presented the JSDC Strategic Plan update request for funds. The total request was \$3,200.00 and the County's split would be \$640.00. Marks made a motion to approve the request for funds, seconded by Schwartz. Roll call vote: Marks, Schwartz, Neys and Ova voted aye. Motion carried.

Mr. Shevlin requested permission to start the process of relocating the section line on the East half of Section 28 in Spiritwood. The land to the north and south of the section line is currently owned by JSDC. They would like to re-locate public access to the West edge of Section 28. Commissioner Ova has been out there to look at it and thinks it would be simple move. Marks made a motion, seconded by Neys to approve the request. Roll call vote: Schwartz, Neys, Ova and Marks voted aye. Motion carried.

Neys made a motion to approve the mid-month bills and taxable meals, seconded by Marks. Roll call vote: Neys, Ova, Marks and Schwartz voted aye. Motion carried.
