

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission

June 21, 2011

At 8:00 a.m., Chairman Klose called the mid month meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, David Schwartz, Craig Neys and Mark T. Klose answered roll call.

Chairman Klose opened the hearing for the request to annex 18 Sections of land in Pingree Township and the City of Pingree from the Jamestown Rural Fire Protection District into the Pingree Rural Fire Protection District. The petition requirements had been met with well over 60% of the residents signing the request. Jamestown Rural Fire did not oppose the request. Don Perleberg spoke in favor of the request. The Pingree Rural Fire Department was in the process of getting their own fire hall. Almost all of the calls within the petition area were already going to the Pingree Fire Department. No one spoke in opposition to the request. Ova made a motion seconded by Neys to approve the request. Roll call vote – Ova, Marks, Schwartz, Neys and Klose voted aye.

A motion was made by Schwartz seconded by Neys to approve the Liquor License and Sunday Alcoholic Beverage Permit Applications of the Jamestown Country Club. Motion carried.

Jim Trautman voiced his concerns over the Leafy Spurge problem in the County. In the past 15 years the problem had gotten worse. The County Weed Board needed to set an example and they were not getting the job done. The Weed Board should work with the ND Ag Department and Federal authorities to get authorization for chemicals that would eradicate the spurge and not simply control the spurge. He questioned why the County sprayed Interstate I-94 and State Highway Right of Way when they had plenty to do on the County and Township Roads. Ron Manson, County Weed Control Officer, indicated that there was a new chemical coming out and that test plots using the chemical had good results. His crew had to control spurge, thistle and wormwood. There were 2,500 miles of road right of ways that the County tries to get over at least 2 times per year. The best time for spraying was in the fall when his part time help was no longer working. The past few years weed densities had been reduced by 40%. The County could only use those chemicals that were approved by the State and EPA. Manson also reported that they do a lot with biological control. The Commission encouraged Mr. Trautman to attend a meeting with the Weed Board. Any input on the problem was appreciated.

Al Christianson, Manager, ND Business Development & Governmental Affairs, and Scott Wegner, Arntson Stewart Wegner PC, presented a request to schedule a hearing on sponsoring \$50 million in MIDA bonds for solid waste facilities for the proposed Dakota Spirit AgEnergy facility in Spiritwood Township. The County would serve as a pass through for the tax exempt bonds. The debt and repayment would be the sole responsibility of Great River Energy. A motion was made by Neys seconded by Schwartz to approve the resolution to schedule a hearing on the proposal on July 19, 2011 at 8:00 a.m. Motion carried.

Chad Kaiser, County Sheriff, reviewed a gun repair bill. The gun had been damaged when in the County's possession in the evidence room. The County's insurance policy would pay for the repair. He announced that Troy Kelly, a 14 year employee had resigned to take a BCI (Bureau of Criminal Investigation) position in Valley City. Mr. Kelly was an exemplary employee that would be difficult to replace. The position was funded by grants. Ova made a motion seconded by Marks to advertise to fill the position. Motion carried.

Kaiser reviewed the first six months since he was elected Sheriff. He reported that over \$50,000 in grants had been received to date. Equipment type grants received were the Competitive Grant for \$21,416 and the Pipeline Safety Grant for \$21,000. The Underage Drinking Grant for \$1,100; the Seatbelt Grant for \$1,500; and the DUI Saturation Grant for \$7,275 were grants received to help in paying the overtime required to conduct these projects. They had also received the Boat Safety Grant for doing boat patrol, which is a 50/50 match grant, in the amount of \$4,300 (total \$8,600). Kaiser had also applied for the Ballistics Vest Grant for \$720.

Kaiser requested consideration for 3 step raise to the same pay as the former Sheriff. Johnson indicated that the entire Sheriff's Department was being reviewed by the County's wage consultant to ensure that compensation for the Sheriff and Deputies was competitive with other law enforcement agencies. The Commission would wait for the Consultant's recommendation on wages for the department.

Neys made a motion seconded by Schwartz to make the following appointments: School Reorganization Committee – Ruth Urdahl and Beverly Brunsch; Housing Authority – Allen Falk and Tonya Perkins (unexpired term); Joint Library Board – Dale Marks; and Central Valley Health District Board – Dennis Ova. Roll call vote – Marks, Schwartz, Neys, Klose and Ova voted aye.

Jim Nowatski, Library Foundation Chairman, reported that he would meet with the Library Board and make a report to the City Council and County Commission on the happenings of the Library Foundation. He announced that he would resign from the Foundation next month.

Ova made a motion seconded by Schwartz to approve the raffle permit application of the Jamestown Hospital Foundation. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Schwartz seconded by Marks to approve a \$10,000 loan for 5 years at 5% annual interest to Fried Township for the County's General Fund Sub-Account. Roll call vote – Schwartz, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks voted aye.

Marks made a motion seconded by Ova to pay the mid-month bills, to pay \$324.99 to Gun & Reel from 10-116-6380, and to pay \$265.00 in taxable meals. Roll call vote – Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks and Schwartz voted aye.
