

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission – June 21st, 2016

At 8:00 a.m., Chairman Klose called the mid-month meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, David Schwartz, Craig Neys, and Mark T. Klose answered the roll call.

Clint Otto from the Northern Prairie Wildlife Research Center brought a requested a support letter from Stutsman County & Stutsman County Weed Board to do honeybee research in Stutsman County. The USDA grant application is due in the first week of July & he must submit the letter of support with the application. Enhancements would be made to rural gravel roads & maintained prairie roads to increase the flow for bee population. Schwartz made a motion to write a letter of support for the research, seconded by Marks. Motion carried.

Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney, informed the commission of a federal lawsuit filed against Stutsman County & other parties. The ND Insurance Reserve Fund has been contacted in regards to the lawsuit.

Ova made the motion, seconded by Neys to approve the retail fireworks license for Bigtop Fire Works. Motion carried.

Howie Peuser, LEC Maintenance, requested to replace 80 sprinkler heads in the LEC building. There is money in the budget for the replacements. Ova made a motion to accept the bid from NOVA fire protection at \$44,800, seconded by Schwartz. Roll call vote: Marks, Schwartz, Neys, Klose and Ova all vote aye. Motion carried.

Mickey Nenow, Highway Superintendent, presented the recertification of township roads with no major changes. Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Marks to approve the township road certification as presented. Motion carried.

Jerry Bergquist, Emergency/911 Manager, requested putting an advertisement to hire a replacement dispatcher. One of the current dispatchers gave notice to go back to school at the end of July. Schwartz made a motion to approve the advertisement, seconded by Ova. Motion carried.

Bergquist presented a draft of an Open Burning Ordinance he would like to have for Stutsman County. The Local Emergency Planning Committee subcommittee researched & put together an ordinance that would cover the entire county except the cities that have their own ordinance such as the City of Jamestown. The Local Emergency Planning Committee met last Friday to approve the draft & to take it to the County Commission for consideration. The board authorized sending the draft to State's Attorney Fremgen for review and to be formatted into an ordinance to be presented for formal consideration.

Corry Shevlin, Jamestown Stutsman Development Corp., requested the Spiritwood Road which is one mile north of exit 269 which was initially approved by JSDC in 2012 & is now half the cost. Shevlin stated the cost came in at \$146,337 with a 90/10 City & County split. Neys made a motion, seconded by Ova to approve the Spiritwood Road upgrade. Roll call: Schwartz, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks voted aye. Motion carried.

Shevlin presented the commission with a Pace Funding request JSDC received from JEDS, LLC at \$125,000 with an 80/20 City & County split pending the 2% interest rate. Schwartz made a motion to approve the Pace Funding as presented, seconded by Neys. Roll call: Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks and Schwartz all vote aye. Motion carried.

Shevlin informed the commission that JSDC had an interested party to lease part of their building. The rent would be \$750 per month and increase \$25 each year on a 3 year lease. Ova made a motion, seconded by Marks to approve the proposed lease as presented. Motion carried.

Casey Bradley, Auditor/COO, updated the commission that there were no findings of conflict of interest on Elizabeth Martin's application for the Stutsman County Housing Authority Board. Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Marks to appoint Elizabeth Martin to the Stutsman County Housing Authority Board. Motion carried.

Bradley presented the commission with the preliminary budget and recommended setting a levy limit cap

at 3%, which will apply to all external entities that certify a levy request to the commission. The Wage & Benefit committee has not met regarding the health insurance and wages recommendations. Budget requests will be sent out in the beginning of July and due by August 19<sup>th</sup>, 2016 and will be brought to the commission meeting September 6<sup>th</sup>, 2016. Schwartz made a motion to approve setting the levy limit cap at 3%, seconded by Ova. Motion carried.

Bradley received a request of leave payout from IT Director Josh Smaage for 200 hours of annual leave. Smaage was without an IT Assistant for 8 months and was unable to take time off due to being on call. The request was also given to the Personnel Committee which also approved the request. Mark Klose abstained from discussion due to conflict of interest. Ova made a motion, seconded by Neys to approve the leave payout. Roll call vote: Ova, Marks, Schwartz & Neys vote aye, Klose abstained. Motion carried.

Stutsman County has reached another settlement agreement with the Aspen Construction project for \$172,875.78 with 20% being paid by the county and the other 80% coming from the North Dakota Department of Transportation. The county will pay an additional \$25,355.25, making the total county costs the same as the original agreement that had been received last year but rejected by Federal Highway. Schwartz made a motion to approve the settlement and pay contingent upon signed paperwork by all interested parties, seconded by Marks. Roll call: Ova, Marks, Schwartz, Neys and Klose all vote aye. Motion carried.

Spiritwood Lake city council reviewed a building permit submitted by Eric Nordstrom to renovate a bathhouse, remove & replace a garage. Stutsman County is the landowner and must authorize any permits for the land. Schwartz made a motion to approve both building permits, seconded by Ova. Motion carried.

Motion made by Marks, seconded by Ova to approve taxable meals and mid-month bills. Roll call: Marks, Schwartz, Neys, Klose & Ova all vote aye. Motion carried.
