At 8:00 a.m. the mid-month meeting of the Stutsman County Commission was called to order by Chairman Klose. Roll call was answered by Craig Neys, Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, and Mark T. Klose. Doug Kaiser was absent.

Mike Zimmerman, County Highway Superintendent, reviewed the ND DOT request to designate upcoming Federal Aid road projects. DOT would respond to whether or not federal matching funds could be used for road maintenance. \$250,000 in Special Road Funds (SRF) had been requested for chip sealing the AHL (Access Highway to Lakes) roads. Federal Aid funds could possibly be used for the required \$167,000 in matching funds. There would be no road construction projects for the next few years. The County would have to build up the federal aid and local property tax funds before another project could be scheduled.

Sandy Bendewald, Social Services Administrator, requested allowing employees to donate annual or sick leave to a Social Services employee that had exhausted her leave due to illness. Ova made a motion that was seconded by Neys to approve the request. Motion carried.

Renee Valenta, County Wellness Committee member, requested permission for the County's Wellness Committee to sponsor a blood drive August 13 in the lower level of the LEC. Neys made a motion that was seconded by Marks to approve the request and to allow employees to take time off from work to donate blood. Motion carried.

Ova made a motion that was seconded by Neys to appoint Laurel Haroldson and Dr. James Torrance to the Central Valley Health District Board of Directors. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Ova and seconded by Neys to approve the off-premises alcoholic beverage permit of Judith Ganser d/b/a Anchor Bar for the Fair Grounds Beer Gardens. Motion carried.

Del Horn, Jamestown Community Corrections Director, submitted a \$15,000 request for the 2009 budget to assist with funding the Community Corrections program. The money would help defray the administrative costs associated with providing criminal offenders the Court-ordered opportunity to complete community service. Service was provided to 95 non-profit agencies. In 2007, about 10,000 service hours were provided in the County with an equivalent savings of 1,155 days of incarceration costs. A letter of support from the James River Senior Center was presented. Tracey Trapp, LEC Administrator, commented on the benefits the program had provided for his facility. The request would be included in the budget and reviewed at budget time.

Jan Thompson, County Treasurer, reviewed the pledge of securities. Marks made a motion that was seconded by Neys to approve the following pledge of securities. Institutions, deposits, and pledge of securities follows: Bank Forward, \$5,470,000.00, \$7,003,115.94; First Community Credit Union, \$1,250,000.00, \$1,387,000.00; Gate City Bank, \$25,500.00, \$100,000.00; Northland Financial, \$90,000.00, \$100,000.00; Unison Bank, \$1,389,634.33, \$1,984,265.45; US Bank, \$86,821.34, \$1,008,571.49; Wells Fargo Bank NA, \$2,415,607.17, \$9,496,356.27. Roll call vote – Ova, Marks, Neys and Klose voted aye.

Dave Orr, County Sheriff, and Jim Reuther, Jamestown Fire Chief, requested the county donate the 1970 dive bus to the City to use as a trade in for a newer bus. The fire department had raised funds for upgrading to a newer bus. When needed, the City Fire Department provided divers to the county. Ova made a motion that was seconded by Neys to donate the bus valued at less than \$1,000 to the City Fire Department. Roll call vote – Marks, Neys, Klose and Ova voted aye.

Ag Country Farm Credit Services requested a Quit Claim Deed from the County to assist with perfecting the title to an adjacent property. The chain of title was not clean. A Quit Claim Deed was an instrument that made no guarantee of any interest in a property. Research of the old records by the Auditor's office indicated that the County had no ownership interest. The County had never acquired the property through tax foreclosure. Marks made a motion that was seconded by Neys to issue a Quit Claim Deed. Roll call vote – Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks voted aye.

Ova made a motion that was seconded by Marks to approve \$135.00 in taxable meals. Roll call vote – Klose, Ova, Marks and Neys voted aye.

A motion was made by Marks and seconded by Neys to pay the mid-month bills. Roll call vote – Ova, Marks, Neys and Klose voted aye.
