

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission – July 18, 2017

At 4:41 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dale Marks, David Schwartz, Denny Ova, Mark T. Klose, and Craig Neys answered the roll call.

Bill Kennedy and Joe Rector addressed the commission representing the James River Valley Library System requesting a letter of support to renovate the Alfred Dickey Library. The library's centennial is coming up in 2019 and they would like to do some renovations including foundation work, a new sign, LED lights, carpet, wall coverings, and paint to help preserve the historic building. The project is estimated to cost \$550,000.00. They are fundraising to help defray the costs. No county funds are being requested; however, a signed certification of significant community support is required to apply for a grant, which would cover fifteen percent. A motion was made by Neys, seconded by Marks to sign a letter of support to fulfill a grant requirement which would help defray costs of the renovations to the Alfred Dickey Library. Motion carried.

Corry Shevlin, Jamestown Stutsman Development Corporation (JSDC), presented the board with a request to fund an Airport Business Park for industrial and aeronautical use lots. The project would be split between the City and the County, with the County's share being \$284,750.28. A motion was made by Marks, seconded by Schwartz to approve the request to fund an Airport Business Park as presented. Roll call vote: Schwartz, Neys, Klose, Ova, and Marks voted aye. Motion carried.

Connie Ova, Jamestown Stutsman Development Corporation (JSDC), provided JSDC's proposed 2018 budget, which includes a 0% increase from last year as requested by the commission. A motion was made by Schwartz, seconded by Neys to approve JSDC's 2018 budget as presented. Roll call vote: Neys, Klose, Marks, Schwartz voted aye. Ova recused himself from voting due to a conflict of interest. Motion carried.

Connie Ova requested a relocation of public access for a section line where ND Soy is going to be located. In order to relocate the public access road, the commission must hold a public hearing on authorizing the closure of the road. Ova made a motion, seconded by Schwartz to hold a public hearing for relocating the public access road as presented. Motion carried.

The Rail Infrastructure Loan through the Bank of North Dakota was discussed. This project has been in the works for about one year now. The loan would cover the cost of new rail needed for ND Soy, construction of a frontage road, utility box culvert, and improvements to existing roadway. A government entity must apply for the loan and Stutsman County would enter into an agreement with SEPA for repayment. A motion was made by Neys, seconded by Ova to allow staff to apply for the BND Infrastructure Loan. Motion carried.

Casey Bradley, Auditor/COO requested permission to have staff work with Interstate Engineering to start work on bid packages for the rail and road projects if the BND Infrastructure Loan is approved. A motion was made by Schwartz, seconded by Neys to allow staff to work with Interstate Engineering on bid packages. Roll call vote: Ova, Marks, Schwartz, Neys, and Klose vote aye. Motion carried.

Jessica Alonge, Treasurer, presented the Pledge of Securities as of June 30, 2017. Alonge informed the commission of a change in legislation with Senate Bill 2296 that after this year the commission will not need to approve the Pledge of Securities. The county is overprotected at all of the banks. Marks made a motion, seconded by Ova to accept the Pledge of Securities as presented. Motion carried.

Treasurer Alonge requested to cancel uncashed warrants and treasurer's checks that are over one year old as of June 30th. Each individual has received at least three letters. Alonge will send another letter to the recipients informing them their money will be sent to unclaimed property for the State of North Dakota. Ova made a motion, seconded by Schwartz to approve the cancellation of uncashed

warrants and treasurer's checks as presented. Motion carried.

Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney presented the board with a Resolution to impose a \$25.00 Victim Witness Fee in all crimes that have a possibility of imprisonment as a potential consequence in accordance with House Bill 1003 that became effective July 1, 2017. Marks made a motion, seconded by Schwartz to approve the Resolution to impose a \$25.00 Victim Witness Fee as presented. Roll call vote: Marks, Schwartz, Neys, Klose, and Ova voted aye. Motion carried.

Jerry Bergquist, Emergency Manager/9-1-1 Coordinator, requested approval of the annual grant to subsidize wages in his department. The grant awarded is \$63,447.00, which is \$1,085.00 more than last year. Ova made a motion to accept the grant, seconded by Schwartz. Motion carried.

Mickey Nenow, County Highway Superintendent, addressed the commission to request awarding the motor grader to RDO, as they were the only bid received. The motor grader will be for the Kensal area and was budgeted for this year. The bid came in under budget. Schwartz made a motion to award the motor grader bid to RDO, seconded by Marks. Roll call vote: Schwartz, Neys, Klose, Ova, and Marks voted aye. Motion carried.

Nenow requested permission to adopt the updated County Road Policy as discussed in a previous meeting. Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Ova to adopt the updated County Road Policy as presented. Motion carried.

Nenow requested permission to get quotes for new doors and windows for his department. It was the consensus of the board to allow Nenow to get quotes for new doors and windows for the office.

Nenow presented his monthly report where crushing has started as well as patching bumps on Highway 10.

Nicole Meland, Deputy Auditor/Recorder, presented the board with a Safe Bed contract for July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2019 with the North Dakota Department of Human Services, a Business Associate Agreement with the North Dakota Department of Human Services for July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2019, and a HIPAA Business Associate Tracking Form for July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2019. A motion was made by Ova, seconded by Schwartz to approve the Safe Bed contract for July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2019 with the North Dakota Department of Human Services, a Business Associate Agreement with the North Dakota Department of Human Services for July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2019, and a HIPAA Business Associate Tracking Form for July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2019 as presented. Motion carried.

A brief discussion was held regarding the hiring process for Auditor/COO. With the County in the middle of the budget process it was proposed to hold off on the formal hiring process until October 2017 and in the interim make temporary adjustments in personnel currently on staff, which would include transitioning Nicole Meland to Auditor/COO, Jessica Alonge, to Deputy Auditor/Recorder, Jessica Moser to Treasurer, and leave the Deputy Recorder position that Jessica Moser vacates open as a stop gap. This proposal would save the County \$9,869.95 per month. A motion to hold off on the formal hiring process until October 2017 and temporarily transition personnel currently on staff was made by Schwartz, seconded by Neys. Roll call vote: Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks, Schwartz voted aye. Motion carried.

Meland requested permission to update bank accounts, removing Casey Bradley from all accounts and add Jessica Moser to bank accounts and Jessica Alonge to the credit cards effective August 4, 2017. A motion to remove Casey Bradley from all bank accounts and add Jessica Moser to bank accounts and Jessica Alonge to the credit cards effective August 4, 2017 was made by Ova, seconded by Schwartz. Motion carried.

Ova made a motion, seconded by Marks to approve the mid-month bills and taxable meals. Roll call vote: Klose, Ova, Marks, Schwartz, and Neys voted aye. Motion carried.
