At 8:00 a.m., Chairman Klose called the mid month meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, David Schwartz, Craig Neys (by speaker phone) and Mark T. Klose answered roll call.

Jim Fettig, Courthouse Maintenance Supervisor, reported on elevator repairs that were necessary at the Memorial Building. The \$7,541.54 estimated cost could be shared with the Vets Club. Fettig provided a history of past repairs and the amount of costs that were paid by the Vets Club. A motion was made by Marks seconded by Schwartz to proceed with the elevator repairs and to authorize Commissioner Marks to negotiate cost sharing for the elevator repairs with the Vets Club. Roll call vote – Ova, Marks, Schwartz, Neys and Klose voted aye.

Chairman Klose opened the hearing for consideration of approving up to \$50 million in Solid Waste Disposal Revenue Bonds for Dakota Spirit AgEnergy LLC for the purpose of financing the construction, acquisition and installation of equipment to be used for solid waste disposal and functionally related facilities in connection with a biomass refinery within the industrial park located in Spiritwood Township. Scott Wegner, Bond Council, indicated that the bonds were authorized under the Municipal and Industrial Development Act (MIDA). The County was a pass through or conduit to facilitate the issuance of the bonds - there was no risk to the County - Great River Energy would have the sole responsibility and obligation for repayment of the bonds. Joe Schmitt presented a letter and 2 videos for the Commission's review. He recommended that the Commission put conditions on granting the bonds that would require Great River Energy to mitigate the negative impact of the project to address the damage to roads and other infrastructure. Connie Ova spoke in favor of the project. She outlined the future plans of the proposed facility – a 60 Million Gallon corn based bio-refinery with a possible addition of an 8 to 12 Million Gallon cellulose ethanol plant. The company had a 30 year contract to provide steam to Cargill Malt and they would employ 34 people in good paying jobs. Gene Allen spoke in favor of the project by pointing out that the corn production is already transported on the road system – now it will go to Spiritwood instead of going to other facilities outside of the County. Schwartz made a motion seconded by Neys to approve the resolution authorizing the bonds. Roll call vote - Marks, Schwartz, Neys, Klose and Ova voted aye.

Al Christianson, Manager, ND Business Development & Governmental Affairs for Great River Energy (GRE), requested approval of a resolution to create a special assessment district to pave three miles of Spiritwood Township roads from County Highway 62 to their property. Only property owned by GRE would be included and assessed for the concrete road. The special assessment district would spread the \$3.5 million cost over several years and it would enable the company to take advantage of the favorable bond interest rates. Ova made a motion seconded by Schwartz to approve the resolution creating the special assessment district. Roll call vote – Schwartz, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks voted aye.

The hearing was held on the tax abatement request to reduce the 2010 true and full value from \$135,500 to \$35,000 on Jamestown parcel #74-1810240. Darrel Wollen, Jamestown City Assessor, reported that the property had flood damage since 2009. The basement had extensive water and mold damage. He recommended approving the abatement request. Toni Hible, County Tax Director, concurred. Ova made a motion seconded by Marks to approve the request. Roll call vote – Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks and Schwartz voted aye.

Connie Ova, CEO-JSDC, presented a request for up to \$70,000 in Flex-PACE interest buy down for the Jamestown Regional Airport Authority for their \$2.1 million FAA terminal renovation project. The money would be repaid and had a USDA guarantee. Schwartz made a motion seconded by Ova to approve the request of \$14,000 in County funds. Roll call vote – Klose, Ova, Marks, Schwartz and Neys voted aye.

Ms. Ova requested a Tier 1 funding request for \$25,000 from the North Dakota Trade Office (NDTO) to match \$44,000 in dues for local companies who have benefited from working with the NDTO. The money would assist in the continuing effort to open new overseas markets to local and statewide businesses. Marks made a motion seconded by Neys to approve \$5,000 in County funds to be designated for assistance for local business and for NDTO to document what local companies had received the assistance. Roll call vote – Ova, Marks, Schwartz, Neys and Klose voted aye.

Toni Hible, County Tax Director, presented several properties to add to the assessment rolls as omitted assessments. Omitted assessments: parcel #39-3211011 from \$3,300 to \$53,700; parcel #03-2643040 from \$4,400 to \$61,200; parcel #41-2810000 from \$36,500 to \$86,300; parcel #18-9800040 from \$102,000 to \$128,400; and parcel #18-4600050 from \$1,700 to \$108,900. Ova made a motion seconded by Schwartz to add the properties to the 2011 property tax assessments. Motion carried.

Jacki Lindell, Interim County Treasurer, presented the following pledge of securities: (institution, total deposit, and securities pledged) Bank Forward, \$2,066,210.21, \$2,237,337.55; First Community Credit Union, \$2,600,000.00, \$3,258,000.00; Gate City, \$225,500.00, \$250,000.00; Northland Financial, \$240,000.00, \$250,000.00; Unison Bank, \$3,026,467.57, \$4,012,397.01; U S Bank, \$768,530.32, \$1,311,755.08; Wells Fargo Bank NA, \$5,644,604.53, \$5,954,993.13. Neys made a motion seconded by Ova to approve the pledge of securities. Motion carried.

Jerry Bergquist, 9-1-1 Coordinator/Emergency Manager, requested Family Medical Leave under FMLA for an employee. A motion was made by Marks seconded by Ova to approve the request. Motion carried.

Bergquist presented a mutual aid agreement with neighboring Counties. The mutual aid agreement was a FEMA requirement. Upon the State's Attorney's approval for the agreements would be brought back to the commission for approval. Mr. Bergquist also presented the 2011 Emergency management Performance Grant that helped underwrite the cost of salaries in his office. Ova made a motion seconded by Marks to accept the \$29,819 first payment of the \$59,638 grant. Motion carried.

Linda Chadduck, Interim County Recorder, requested approval of designating Cheryl McPherson as a Deputy Recorder, similar to Jamie Anderson-Ruff's position, to equalize duties and pay in the Recorder's Office. Schwartz made a motion seconded by Marks to approve the request and place McPherson on the Grade 8 step 1 pay grade for Deputy Recorder. Roll call vote – Marks, Schwartz, Neys, Klose and Ova voted aye.

Gene Allen, Alexander Township Resident, requested permission to obtain gravel from county pits. He stated that for his business it was necessary to have product come in on the township roads and to be able to have his employees make it to and from work. He was willing to haul, grade it, and put it in place on the township roads that provide access to his residence. He previously had paid for the gravel that he had hauled. He also raised an issue with the County Sheriff's Department monitoring travel on access roads to his residence. Mr. Allen also asked if he assumed liability if he does haul and place the gravel. He was willing to do the work if the townships would pay for

the product. Klose stated that the liability issue would be between him and the townships. Schwartz said that he should visit with Mickey Nenow, County Highway Superintendent, regarding access to county gravel. He said that the policy was to bill the contractor for the gravel and the contractor in turn would be responsible for billing the townships for the gravel. The townships would need to agree to the graveling.

Sheriff Kaiser responded to Allen's concern about the presence of department personnel on township roads. He stated that they respond to complaints and concerns that his office and the road department receives on any given day.

Marks reported on the water problem in Mann's Township and wondered if there was anything that could be done. Schwartz said that approval from the state and county water boards would need to be obtained before any pumping could be done. The township should visit with the county water board.

Schwartz made a motion seconded by Marks to pay \$183,745.20 to RTS Shearing for emergency grade raise work from the Emergency Fund, fund 22. Roll call vote – Schwartz, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks voted aye.

Marks made a motion seconded by Ova to pay the mid-month bills and to pay \$180.00 in taxable meals. Roll call vote – Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks and Schwartz voted aye.
