

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission

July 24, 2007

At 8:00 a.m. the Stutsman County Commission meeting was called to order by Chairman Klose. Roll call was answered by Douglas Kaiser, Craig Neys, Dennis Ova and Mark T. Klose. Dale Marks was absent.

A motion was made by Ova and seconded by Neys to nominate Dr. Philip Jystad to fill the unexpired term of Dr. Laura Archuleta to the Central Valley Health District Board. Motion carried.

Neys made a motion that was seconded by Kaiser to approve the gaming site authorization for the Knights of Columbus at the Pub & Grub in Courtenay. Motion carried.

Jerry Bergquist, 9-1-1 Coordinator/Emergency Manager, presented a request for designation of an applicant agent and a request for public assistance. These requests were requirements of the Presidential Disaster Declaration. The declaration would provide 85% funding to repair damage to township roads. A motion was made by Kaiser and seconded by Ova to designate Mickey Nenow as applicant agent for the FEMA projects. Roll call vote - Ova, Kaiser, Neys and Klose all voted aye.

The bids for the restroom renovation project at the Memorial Building were opened. Also present was Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney. The bids were as follows: Hillerud Construction, Inc, Jamestown - Base Bid \$81,925, Alt #1 \$2,595, Alt #2 \$2,650, Alt #3 \$6,860; Nill Construction, Inc, Jamestown - Base Bid \$83,746, Alt #1 \$2,200, Alt #2 \$2,634, Alt #3 \$5,771; Scheer Construction Company Inc, Valley City - Base Bid \$99,800, Alt #1 \$2,300, Alt #2 \$2,500, Alt #3 7,500. A motion was made by Ova and seconded by Neys to table the bids for further review. A committee of Ron Frydenland, Jim Fettig and Noel Johnson would review the bids and bring back a recommendation to the Commission.

Neys made a motion that was seconded by Kaiser to enter into executive session for attorney consultation related to reasonably predictable civil litigation and/or pending civil litigation regarding damages to Highway 30 aka County Road 68 and Don Hofmann. Roll call vote - Kaiser, Neys, Klose and Ova all voted aye. The legal authority for closing this portion of the meeting was NDCC 44-04-19.1(5) and (9).

At 8:20 a.m. the executive session began and was attended by Commissioners Klose, Ova, Kaiser and Neys, and by Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney, Mickey Nenow, Road Forman, and Noel Johnson.

A motion was made by Ova and seconded by Neys to adjourn the executive session. Motion carried. At 8:37 a.m. the meeting continued in open session and the public was invited back to the meeting.

Kaiser made a motion that was seconded by Neys to authorize the State's Attorney to offer to settle the law suit with Don Hofmann for \$9,500 under Rule 68 authority. Roll call vote - Neys, Klose, Ova and Kaiser all voted aye.

Warren Tobin, Veterans Service Officer, reported on the National Certification Training he attended in Milwaukee. He presented statistics on the geographic distribution of veterans' benefits in North Dakota. Stutsman County had 1,770 veterans that received a total of \$5,800,000 in benefits from medical, compensation/pension, and education/vocational rehabilitation. He reported that the veterans' clinic in Jamestown was going well and that it was exceeding projected patient loads.

Ova made a motion that was seconded by Kaiser to pay the mid-month bills. Roll call vote - Klose, Ova, Kaiser and Neys all voted aye.
