

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission

August 3, 2010

At 4:00 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, Craig Neys, Doug Kaiser and Mark T. Klose answered roll call.

A motion to approve the minutes of the July meetings was made by Ova, seconded by Kaiser. Motion carried.

Dan Buchanan, Attorney at Law, presented two petitions that would amend the County's Home Rule Charter. One petition would amend Article 6 by creating a public board of directors to provide oversight for the Stutsman County Road Department. The other petition would amend Article 8 and create a new section that would require an annual appropriation of 2% of the taxable valuation of the County to the Farm to Market and Federal Aid road program. Buchanan stressed that the petitions were amending the Home Rule Charter so the procedure in NDCC 11-09.1 should be followed and not the procedure outlined in the memorandum by Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney. Fremgen cautioned that the Commission would be setting a precedent by allowing the petitions on the ballot. Commissioner Klose questioned why the format recommended by Fremgen was not followed. Judy Graves indicated that it was principal, they have the right to petition our government and it did not require a sponsoring committee. The County Auditor's Office would review the petitions for signature compliance by the August 17th meeting.

Mike Zimmerman, County Highway Superintendent, presented an update on the ER (Emergency Relief) projects. Four grade raises south of Cleveland on County Roads 67, 38 and 68 had been bid. Total cost was \$1.63 million – the 20% County share was \$326,000. The bids did not include repaving. Eleven additional sites were pending approval. Estimates for these projects were \$5.74 million – the County share of the cost would be 20% or \$1.15 million. The road crews were graveling in the north half of the county. Chip sealing of the AHL roads should be completed next week.

Steve Thompson, Interstate Engineering, presented a \$10,000 engineering contract for hydraulic studies on ER sites 5 and 15. Kaiser made a motion seconded by Marks to approve the contracts. Roll call vote – Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose voted aye.

A motion was made by Ova seconded by Kaiser to approve the following construction engineering contracts: CER 4742(059) - \$38,498.87, CER 4717(066) - \$36,808.19, CER 4717(067) - \$42,281.57 & CER 4711(051) - \$54,475.20. Roll call vote – Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose and Ova voted aye.

Zimmerman reported that his department, since the recycling project, has done very little patching with asphalt. They have been digging the hole out and filling it back in with recycled material. The trucks have been hauling chips over Highway 42 and there are a few spots that are breaking up and they would need to be fixed. These would be repaired with the recycled material. Ken Daugs stated that he just wanted to be sure that the areas would be fixed.

Ova made a motion seconded by Kaiser to authorize COO Johnson to negotiate the purchase of approximately 20 acres from Ryan Odenbach to use for wetland mitigation on county road projects. Roll call vote – Kaiser, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks voted aye.

A motion was made by Neys seconded by Kaiser to approve the raffle permit application of the Pingree Rural Fire Protection District. Motion carried.

Marks made a motion seconded by Neys to allow the County Wellness Committee to sponsor a blood drive August 18, 2010 in the lower level of the Law Enforcement Center. Motion carried.

At 5:25 p.m. the County Commission meeting was recessed for the County Park Board meeting.

Dan Lisko requested an easement that would allow crossing the Park Board property (tree nursery) in the NE1/4 of Section 2, Midway Township. Lisko would like to cross the property to get access to his adjacent property so he could build a new house. The Park Board Committee would review the request and bring back a recommendation to the full Board.

Bill Steinmetz requested permission to develop a bike and walking trail on the east side of the Reservoir. Twelve miles of trails on four different sites would be developed: Proposal "A" Section 1-west of the ND Game & Fish headquarters building, Proposal "A" Section 2 – north of the ND Game & Fish Building, Proposal "B" Section 1 - east of the Little Britches fishing pond, and Proposal "B" Section 2 - north of the swimming beach. There would be no ground disturbance other than a few posts. The grass on the trails would be mowed. The Bureau of Reclamation had no issues provided there was no ground disturbance. Marks made a motion seconded by Woodward to grant permission for Proposal "A" Section 1 and for Proposal "B" Section 2. Motion carried. Park Board Superintendent Lorenz would work with Steinmetz on the layout of the other proposed sites.

Ova made a motion seconded by Marks to approve the transfer of Lot 10 Eastside from Bryan and Trish Miller to Benjamin and Brenda Kirkeby. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Ova seconded by Marks to grant a special use permit to the Addiction Counselors Association for a sobriety walk at the Jamestown Reservoir. Motion carried.

Dennis Lorenz, County Park Superintendent, presented his monthly report. The rip rap work at the Marina was nearing completion. Mike Kessler, Marina Concessionaire, indicated that he would be open next week and would provide limited services. The concrete work around the Marina was not complete which limited access to the building.

A motion to adjourn was made by Schlecht and seconded by Woodward. At 6:13 p.m. the August 2010 County Park Board meeting was adjourned.

At 6:14 p.m. the regular Commission meeting was called back to order with all Commissioners present.

Ova made a motion to approve and pay the monthly bills seconded by Marks. Roll call vote – Neys, Klose Ova, Marks and Kaiser voted aye.
