

At 4:00 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, David Schwartz, Craig Neys, and Mark T. Klose answered the roll call.

Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Neys to approve the minutes of the July 2015 meetings. Motion carried.

Ova made a motion to remove Erin Kummer from the employee list to perform wedding ceremonies, seconded by Marks. Motion carried.

Nellie Degen updated on the Fraternal Order of Police, NDPERS retirement system, May 15, 2015 which was attended by Ova. NDPERS has a policy for law enforcement, Degen states the policy allows Law Enforcement Officers to retire at an earlier age but further clarification needed before moving forward. Degen implicated that would not cost the county any money but it would increase the employee's share.

Casey Bradley, Auditor/COO, presented personnel policy updates to the commission, amendment 5 addresses the on-call standards for Social Service Department. On-call time does not apply towards normal hours work but is a stipend. Schwartz made a motion to approve amendment 5 to personnel policy, seconded by Ova. Motion carried.

Amendment 6 applicant policy, issue presented during VSO hiring process, mandates that you have a competitive scoring and ranking system added into the personnel policy. Neys made a motion, seconded by Schwartz to approve. Motion carried.

Public Hearing for Section Line closing in Rose Township, request submitted to close section line along with statute. If section line is closed it becomes private property to the adjoining land owner. Kevin Szarkowski states the section line has not been used for 50 years and is not readily accessible to public use. Made the request to clean up the land and plant trees and the adjoining land is owned by the individual making the request, Kevin Szarkowski. All requirements have been met to move forward with closing the section line. Rose Township has some concerns regarding closing the section, Beth Dooley addressed all of the reasons listed on the letter that was submitted by Szarkowski. Beth passed out a response letter from the township board; the township would like to leave the section line open for options to improve the land disputes that the section line has been traveled in the past 10 years. Suggestion made to send it back to the township to do further research and bring it back to the commission with an opinion.

Mickey Nenow, County Highway Superintendent, gave his monthly report, crew has been patching for the past couple of weeks, graveling and placing culverts. Paving in Spiritwood started today 1 mile through Spiritwood and add a lift. End of next week Border States will start patching north of Gackle on 67. Montpelier shop is almost complete, wiring has been started, and plumbing and sewer will begin during the fall. Woodworth is approximately half done and will be completed soon. Old storage building leaks and Klose suggested setting money aside to fix down the road. Attended the State meeting for 2016 state money in Fargo last week and received approval for state money.

The South Central Dakota Regional Council will be submitting an increase in their annual dues; Klose and Bradley attended the JSDC meeting and decided to bring to the commission for discussion. Last year commission would not entertain the idea of an increase for dues. Gary Rife in attendance from JSDC stated we are the largest county within the Regional Council and he understands the recent setbacks. Hazard mitigation plan took extra time and effort to finish ensuring the county would not lose the grant money to complete the project because of the council's action. CDBG block grants can be allocated by communities and cannot deny the communities from applying for the grants. No action was taken.

A gun range proposal located in Midway Township next to the County shop made to the Commission. With the closing of the gun range, city was looking at going between two lagoons but the cost was too high. Nenow brought up a possibility of the land near the county, with road department aiding in the dirt work to help cut the cost down. Next step would be to meet with interstate engineering and the city would also supply crew help to do dirt work. Would still be publicly owned and the city, county and highway patrol would all have access for use. Neys made a motion, seconded by Ova to approve moving forward with the gun range. Ova, Marks, Schwartz, Neys, and Klose all vote aye, motion carried.

Bradley stated during work on the upcoming budget there is a need to add a Capital Fund 046 and has already received State Auditor's Office approval. Ova made a motion to add Fund 046 for the Sheriff's Department, seconded by Schwartz. Motion carried.

Sheriff Chad Kaiser updated the commission with his monthly report, requesting to send a letter to Agri-cover for donating roll-up covers on the last 2 pickups to express the County's appreciation. Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Ova to send a letter of appreciation. All aye, motion carried.

Chad Jackson, Jail Administrator, asked permission to renew the contract with Turnkey with few changes going from 36 months to 48 months contract and commission from 17 to 19% with a new service included to text message. Jackson made the recommendation to approve. Ova made a motion, seconded by Marks to approve the renewal with Turnkey. Motion carried.

Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney, was not present to give his monthly report.

Bradley requested approval for the cost share for the RFP for Stutsman County/City of Jamestown Jail

Committee. The RFP is due by August 31st, 2015 in which the committee will review and interview between the first and second week in September and will be brought back for approval. Estimated \$60,000 cost with a 50/50 split between City and County. Schwartz made the motion to approve the cost share of the RFP, Marks seconded. Money will be pulled from the General Fund of the Non-Departmental more than likely. Roll call vote: Marks, Schwartz, Neys, Klose and Ova.

At 5:02 p.m., the Stutsman County Commission Meeting recessed for the County Park Board Meeting.

There has been a request made to transfer the permit rights of 2998 West Lakeside Road Cabin 20, contingent upon paperwork being completed. Ova made a motion to approve of the transfer, seconded by Woodward. Motion carried.

Sandy Eckelberg, Accounts/Property Coordinator, spoke on behalf of Mike Kesler, requesting a reduction on the electrical bill due to running the fans more this year from issues at Lakeside Marina. In 2014 \$235.00 and 2015 \$203.00 his charge is actually less and this year's bill has 6 extra days on the bill with average temps the same for both years. Neys made a motion to deny the request, Schwartz seconded. Motion carried.

Request was made to erect a Veterans Memorial sign at Spiritwood Lake. Sandy beach area was donated in 1921 as a WWI Veterans Memorial and the commission had approved at a prior meeting to purchase the sign. Marks made a motion, seconded by Ova to erect the sign at the designated area at Spiritwood Lake. Motion carried.

Eric Nordstrom brought questions regarding the Spiritwood permit; he is interested in purchasing the Spiritwood Inn and is asking for clarification on the lease and permit. The archaeological society has given an opinion on where the best option would be to expand the campground. Eric would like to know where he can reside and what type of residence he can put up. Permit allows the caretaker to have residence but does not specify what type of residence and will have to go through the Historical Society where the residence is allowed. Stutsman County cannot guarantee a zoning change or building permit from the city of Spiritwood.

Request to rezone the Spiritwood Lake Park from Agricultural to Recreation. Schwartz made motion to request the zoning change with Spiritwood Lake City, seconded by Ova. Motion carried.

Pelican Point Landing currently has some road washout and septic issues; Dennis Lorenz the road washes out the eastside and has tried to keep it filled. The best solution since there aren't ditches in the area, maybe clean out trees and place culverts to help control water flow. Road is a township road in Buchanan township, road tips to the east, Albers suggested tipping the road to the west to avert the water. Trees would have to be removed then the County Road department could do the blade work and bill the township. Request a commitment letter authorizing the work to be billed back to the township.

Eckelberg updated on dredging the island channel, discussion at the last meeting to apply for a grant to fund the dredging by the island. The total cost amounts to \$550,000.00 to complete everything, Eckelberg is asking the board if they would like to proceed with funding being a 75/25 split and can check on additional funding from other entities. Neys made the motion to have the Road department clean out the areas by the docks, seconded by Woodward. Motion carried.

Dennis Lorenz, Park Superintendent, gave his monthly report; storm took out a bunch of trees, septic issues at Pelican Point happened after Dennis forgot to send the pump truck to empty out the tanks. Drain field was not wanted by the Bureau of Reclamation but would like to get through the rest of this year and look at fixing next year. Cost would be roughly \$3,000 plus labor cost to add in another tank.

At 6:13 p.m., a motion to adjourn the Stutsman County Park Board meeting was made by Woodward, seconded by Ova. Motion Carried.

At 6:13 p.m., the Stutsman County Commission Meeting reconvened.
