At 4:00 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, David Schwartz, Craig Neys, and Mark T. Klose answered the roll call.

Ova made a motion, seconded by Schwartz to approve the minutes of the July 2014 meetings. Motion carried.

Connie Ova, Jamestown/Stutsman Development Corp., requested Flex PACE Interest buy-down for Row Homes of Jamestown ND. The company, Metroplains, purchased the former Essentia Health clinic and plans on building affordable housing units in its place. The request for \$43,000.00 is an 80/20 split with Stutsman County paying \$8,600.00. Schwartz made a motion to approve the request for Flex PACE interest buy-down, seconded by Neys. Roll call vote: Ova, Marks, Schwartz, Neys, and Klose vote aye. Motion carried.

Connie Ova presented the Partners in Marketing ND Commerce Fund that allows up to \$25,000.00 per biennium for each community as a grant. Ova requested the full \$25,000.00 which is a 90/10 split with Stutsman County's share being \$2,500.00. JSDC would like to use \$10,000.00 to actively market land south of the SEPA/Klose land to attract more developers and use the remaining \$15,000.00 for workforce recruiting. Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Marks to approve the matching funds. Roll call vote: Marks, Schwartz, Neys, Klose and Ova vote aye. Motion carried.

DeAnn Brunner, JSDC, requested the adoption of the JSDC 3 year Strategic plan which has been approved by the JSDC board and the City Council. The 3 year Strategic plan allows the JSDC to utilize the Partners in Marketing grant and to access the funds. Ova made a motion, seconded by Schwartz to adopt the JSDC Strategic Plan as presented. Motion carried.

Klose informed the commission of more space needed and the co-mingling of the juveniles and adults in the court systems. Jim Fettig, Maintenance Supervisor, has been approached by numerous employees regarding the lack of space for Juvenile Court. Fettig has researched moving the Juvenile court to another facility but currently the cost would be too high. The courts would be paying 80% if the remodeling qualifies for the Courthouse facility grants and would also take 100% of the cost to furnish the offices. Currently there are two new hires that are sharing meeting rooms due to the lack of space. Klose would like to form a committee to explore all options out there and utilize as much space as possible. The new committee will consist of Connie Ova, Sandy Bendewald, Casey Bradley, Jim Fettig, Howie Peuser, Katie Andersen, Dale Marks, and Christina Rittenbach. Klose questioned if it would be possible to move one of the county offices over to the old library building to free up space for the over-crowded departments. Fettig does not suggest moving any county offices into the old library building because of the high cost. Schwartz made a motion to advertise the county library building for bid, seconded by Neys. Motion carried.

Fettig has the Juvenile Court renovations budgeted for and also a courthouse facility grant paying \$40,000.00 to purchase new lighting. Juvenile court will be equipped with LED lighting which can last up to ten years which will be a cost saving for utilities because of the efficiencies gained from the lighting. Construction would not start until mid-summer of next year but the application for grant money is due this December, meeting is in January, and money would be disbursed as early as February. Fettig also states that carpet bids for the main floor have been lower than the budgeted amount. The low bid to replace main floor carpet came in at \$29,461.49 and currently has \$30,000.00 budgeted. Schwartz made a motion to approve the purchase of carpet, seconded by Ova. Motion carried.

Fritz Fremgen gave his monthly report stating his department had nineteen years of files to scan and currently eleven have been done so far. The only change reported was the slight increase in felony cases in Stutsman County.

Chad Kaiser, Sheriff, updated the commission of his three new hires, April, Anders, and Matt that recently started within the past month are all doing very well.

Mickey Nenow, Highway Superintendent, presented the commission with his monthly report stating his department is moving along with graveling roads, culvert work and also finishing up County Road 67 last week but still needs rocking. County Road 44 East of Kensal is currently being bladed and getting ready for rocking.

Casey Bradley, Auditor/COO, informed the commission of change order #3 for Paving Improvement District 2012-01 for the GRE project. The change order is to remove fill and raise the materials up one and a half feet rather than digging down. The change order amounts to \$73,444.16 with a \$500,000.00 contingency. Ova made a motion, seconded by Schwartz to approve change order #3 for Paving Improvement District 2012-01. Motion carried.

Bradley inquired which commissioners are planning on attending the North Dakota Association of Counties conference October 12-14 in Bismarck ND and to also appoint a delegate from the commission board. Ova made a motion to nominate Dave Schwartz as the delegate, seconded by Neys. Motion carried.

Ova made a motion, seconded by Schwartz to nominate Casey Bradley for North Dakota Association of Counties awards. Roll call vote: Schwartz, Neys, Klose, Ova, and Marks vote aye. Motion carried.

Jerry Bergquist, 911 Coordinator/Emergency Manager, requested approval for out of state travel for Christi Jarland and Jeffrey Godfrey. The Dakota 911 conference is being held in Mitchell South Dakota September 18-16 and Christi Jarland is the President of the ND Association of Public safety Communication Officials and

has to attend the conference. Neys made a motion to approve the out of state travel for both employees, seconded by Marks. Motion carried.

Bradley informed the commission of an IT Award that will be presented to Josh Smaage, IT Director, by Senator John Hoeven. Smaage is receiving the award for IT Innovator of the year for his work on Stutsman County's website. Bradley asks that anyone wishing to attend the awards ceremony to notify the Auditor's office so tickets can be purchased in advance for the August 20th awards program.

Bradley requested an amendment to the capital assets policy to change the estimated life on infrastructure currently at 7-50 years and setting it at 50 years across the board. Marks made a motion to make the change on the infrastructure estimated life to 50 years, seconded by Ova. Motion carried.

Bradley requested to unappoint Jamie Anderson to perform marriage ceremonies since she has moved to South Dakota to pursue a different career. Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Ova to appoint Linda Chadduck to perform marriage ceremonies. Motion carried.

At 5:03 p.m., the Stutsman County Commission Meeting recessed for the County Park Board Meeting.

Ken Gardner, Jamestown High School Cross Country head coach, requested permission to build a cross country running course north of Parkhurst campgrounds and south of 30th ST SE. Currently the high school and college meets have been held on various locations including golf courses but would like a more permanent solution. The area they are requesting is not used other than for general wildlife and there are no areas where runners would have to be crossing roads so it increases the safety for runners. Meets are usually held late September to late October leaving the campgrounds open for more parking. The high school and college would help maintain the area and mow three to four times a year during the summer months. Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Marks to approve the use of the land as presented. Roll call vote: Klose, Woodward, Houge, Ova, Marks, Schwartz, and Neys voted aye. Motion carried.

Jack Uehran came to the commission with questions regarding the house he currently occupies at Spiritwood. Uehran recently received a contract from the lease holders requesting a signed contract agreeing to pay \$71.00 per month to keep the house on the lease holders land. Uehran had signed over all of his rights to the property which in return was leased to the current lease holders. Bradley states that he has to come to an agreement with the current lease holders since the county cannot dictate any agreements between them.

Bradley updated the board on the letter of resignation that had been turned in by Natalie Telken, current concessionaire at Pelican Point Landing. Telken states they will be terminating the contract at the end of the 2014 camping season due to health reasons. Telken offered the county to buy the purchase of assets they have made since taking the contract in the spring of 2013. The board states that they are not interested in buying any of the assets but any bidders can contact the Telken's if they have interest to buy out the assets. Ova made a motion, seconded by Schwartz to advertise for the Pelican Point Landing concessionaire. Motion carried.

Dennis Lorenz, Park Superintendent, gave his monthly report stating his department has been staining tables and cabins and he plans on building a shelter over the open slab at the Marina. Lorenz updates the commission that the Bureau put an advertisement for bid to do the mowing and spraying and awarded the bid to a company out of Crookston for \$50,000.00.
