

August 7, 2007

At 2:00 p.m. the special budget meeting of the Stutsman County Commission was called to order by Chairman Klose. Roll call was answered by Douglas Kaiser, Craig Neys, Dennis Ova, Dale Marks and Mark T. Klose.

Tom Olson, County Extension Agent, reviewed his budget. Expenditures were expected to exceed revenues again this year. His budget was paid by local, State and Federal funds. Increased costs and lower State and Federal cost share funds had created the deficit spending.

Sandy Bendewald, Stutsman County Social Services Director, projected a \$227,000 deficit for the 2008 Social Services budget. The County's share of the Social Service's budget had been increasing and was now 80% compared to 70% a few years ago. The State and Federal share had decreased. The Department's operating costs had not gone up. The only two operating increases were in employee health care and travel. Program costs were up \$41,000 and the program income was down.

Jason Falk, Sergeant/Investigation's, gave a presentation on the Stutsman County wages for the Sheriff's Department. Also present were Chad Kaiser, Bradley Kapp, Damion Hoyt, Troy Kelly, Elizabeth Kapp, and David Orr. The comparison indicated that the County wages had fallen behind and that there was a pay disparity with other equivalent Counties. Several of their department's employees would be retiring in the future and unless the County was competitive, it would be difficult to attract employees. The statistics indicated that their department had less deputies compared to similar counties. This was also a cost savings to the county.

Dave Orr, County Sheriff, reviewed his budget. The budget was about the same as last year and he was anticipating receiving about the same amount of grant money.

Tracy Trapp, LEC Administrator, projected a \$186,000 deficit in the Law Enforcement budget and a deficit in the LEC building fund. His budget included \$160,000 in software upgrades and another \$240,000 in capital projects. The Commission requested a priority list for the capitol improvement projects.

Chuck Meikle, Bill Wilson and Mike Williams appeared on behalf of the Fair Board. They responded to questions about reconfiguring the beer gardens at the fairgrounds to keep underage individuals away from the alcohol. There were some problems at the fair this year and putting up a dividing fence was an alternative. Mr. Meikle complimented Deputy Sheriff Chad Kaiser on his professionalism dealing with the situations at the fair this year. The Board was in the process of completing an emergency plan at the fair. The plan was required and funded by Homeland Security.

Jerry Bergquist, 9-1-1 Coordinator/Emergency Manager, reviewed the 9-1-1, Disaster Emergency Services and Dispatch budgets. He was budgeting to complete the 9-1-1 mapping for the City of Jamestown. The accuracy standards would conform to only those necessary for 9-1-1 purposes. If the City wanted more accurate standards, they would have to participate in the cost. He was budgeting for an assistant. He had worked up to 1,000 hours of overtime the past several years. This had been done at no cost to the county as he was an overtime exempt employee. In the dispatch budget, he was adding two part time employees. This was necessary only if the police officer in dispatch would continue to be called away to handle emergencies and leave only one dispatcher to handle the emergency situations. The City would be consulted to pay for the part time dispatchers if they were necessary.

Mike Zimmerman, County Highway Superintendent, reviewed his budget. The projections indicated a \$380,000 deficit for next year. His budget was similar to last year, but last years' budget was balanced by deficit spending \$400,000 from the County Highway Aid fund. Another year of these deficits would drain all of that fund's reserves. The Commission reduced the chip sealing expense from \$306,000 to \$206,000 and increased the transfer from the County Highway Aid fund from \$1,200,000 to \$1,300,000. Zimmerman had included a \$200 per month per person raise for himself, Mickey Nenow and Rita Jarrett as compensation for them doing the work that the County Engineer had done. The County Engineer had retired and he had not been replaced. The Commission questioned the justification of this proposal.

A motion was made by Neys and seconded by Kaiser to adjourn. At 4:22 p.m. the special budget meeting of the Stutsman County Commission was adjourned.

At 4:29 p.m. the regular monthly meeting of the Stutsman County Commission was called to order by Chairman Klose. Roll call was answered by Douglas Kaiser, Craig Neys, Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, and Mark T. Klose.

A motion to approve the minutes of the July meetings was made by Ova and seconded by Marks. Motion carried.

Warren Tobin, Veteran Service Officer, representing the County Wage and Benefit Committee presented a proposal for employee wages and benefits for 2008. Their analysis indicated that the county was 7.6% behind in wages compared to cost of living indexes since 2002. The committee had surveyed the county employees and recommended the following; update the salary scale as per the county contractor and personnel committee's recommendation, as long as it includes the current cost of living; continue to pay health care premiums, and absorb any increased costs associated with the health care program; and move all employees a pay step according to the Stutsman County Policy Manual on the employee's anniversary date.

Noel Johnson, County COO and Jim Fettig, Courthouse and Memorial Buildings Maintenance Supervisor, had reviewed the bids for the renovation of the restrooms at the Memorial Building for ADA compliance and recommended awarding the contract to Hillerud Construction, Inc. at a base bid of \$81,925, and to accept alternate number one at a cost of \$2,595. They also recommended adding automated flush valves for the toilets at an estimated cost of \$900. Ova made a motion that was seconded by Marks to accept the base bid and alternate number one bid of Hillerud Construction, Inc. and to add automated toilet flush valves to the project contingent upon CDBG release of funds. Roll call vote - Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose all voted aye.

Neys made a motion that was seconded by Kaiser to approve the CDBG grant administration contract with SCDRC and to appoint Kim Murray as the Grant Administrator. Motion carried.

Jerry Bergquist reviewed the amount of public assistance funding local governments in Stutsman County had received. Since 1993, local governments had received \$5.5 million dollars from Presidential Disaster Declarations. Most of the money was for infrastructure and a small percentage for individual assistance.

Gina Guthmiller, JSDC Business Development Specialist, presented the JSDC budget. The administration expense had been increased for the County's share of property tax on their facilities. This money may not be necessary. The Attorney General was reviewing their property tax status.

Del Horn, Jamestown Community Corrections Director, requested \$15,000 for the Community Corrections program for 2008. Community Corrections had provided about 3,200 hours at 50 different sites in Stutsman County. The State had budgeted \$100,000 statewide for the program. He estimated that Stutsman County's share of that budget would be about \$10,000. The \$50 offender fees should be \$138 to properly fund the program.

Steve Thompson, Interstate Engineering, presented the project concept reports for the two inundated areas of County Highway 67 north of Gackle and south of Cleveland. Cost estimates for grade raises were \$1.05 million. The County share of this cost was estimated at \$217,000. Cost estimates to realign the road south of Cleveland would increase the cost by \$270,000 with this extra cost all at the County's expense. Several options were discussed. Mr. Thompson was asked to get answers to several questions and the Commission would schedule a special meeting to review the answers.

A motion was made by Marks and seconded by Kaiser to hire Beaver Creek Archaeology to complete the cultural resource studies for the Highway 67 projects. Roll call vote - Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose and Ova all voted aye.

Mike Zimmerman, County Highway Superintendent, gave his monthly report. A motion was made by Kaiser and seconded by Marks to authorize Zimmerman to hire Atlas Incorporated, Bismarck, ND to crush chips on an as needed basis up to 20,000 tons at \$12.60 per ton. Roll call vote - Kaiser, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks all voted aye.

Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney, gave his monthly report. Better control was necessary at the beer gardens at the Fair. The Commission had licensing authority over the vendor. Several people in his department were working two jobs. Better wages were needed. It was becoming an attitude problem.

Ray Nohrenberg indicated that there was a gravel pile in his area that a contractor would be hauling on a local road that would be damaged by the hauling. The Commission indicated that this was a township road and he should contact the Township Board.

No appointment was made for a Commission representative to the Central Dakota Tourism Partnership.

A motion to approve the beer and liquor application for Casey Dodgson d/b/a Buffalo Lanes for the Beer Gardens at the Fair Grounds was made by Ova and seconded by Neys. Motion carried.

At 5:45 p.m. the Commission meeting was recessed for the Park Board meeting.

Park Board Chairman presented a plaque to Nathan Selchert, President of Dakota Anglers, to recognize the Dakota Anglers for their contributions to park projects. In the past 10 years, the Dakota Anglers had donated over \$17,000 for restrooms, boat docks and ramps, fishing piers and other improvements at Pipestem Dam, Spiritwood Lake and Jamestown Reservoir.

Jim Michael, Environmental Health Practitioner, presented his report on the sewer inspections at the Jamestown Reservoir. Also present was Jim Dodd, Regional Environmental Health Practitioner. Those individuals whose system had failed would have 120 days to correct the problem.

Nellie Degen, Cabin Owner, requested that the Board send out a letter to inform the cabin owners of the status of their system. Ova made a motion that was seconded by Marks to send a letter to the cabin owners along with a copy of Mr. Michael's report. Motion carried.

Dennis Lorenz, County Park Superintendent, reviewed the Park Department's 2008 proposed budget. A new concessionaire facility was planned for Pelican Point Landing. The project would be funded with grant dollars. The two new vault toilets had been installed at the Reservoir. The concrete access would be poured later after the fill had settled. The horse camp at Parkhurst was progressing. Water lines would be installed next week and the dump station installed after the water lines. The disc golf course on the island at the Reservoir was almost complete. The State tournament would be held on the island over Labor Day weekend. Mr. Lorenz presented statistics on the Marina and Pelican Point campground receipts.

A motion to adjourn was made by Ova and seconded by Woodward. At 6:17 p.m. the August 7, 2007 Stutsman County Park Board meeting was adjourned.

At 6:18 p.m. the Stutsman County Commission meeting was called back to order with all Commissioners present.

Marks made a motion that was seconded by Ova to pay the monthly bills except \$800.00 to Interstate Engineering, Inc. from 15-128-6384. Roll call vote - Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks and Kaiser voted aye.
