

Official Proceedings of Stutsman County Commission – August 15, 2017

At 4:47 p.m., Chairman Klose called the Stutsman County Commission Meeting to order. Dale Marks, Dave Schwartz, Denny Ova, Mark T. Klose and Craig Neys answered the roll call.

Jim Fettig and Howie Pueser, Maintenance Supervisor's, requested permission to replace the cooling tower. The current tower is still working, but may fail in the next few years. Shane Eskelson from Trane was available for questions about the project. Final price and contract for the project is \$198,550.00, without bonding. The bond price is \$5,695.00. Total cost with the bond would be \$204,245.00 and \$206,250.00 was budgeted. Fettig believes bonding is required if the project cost is over \$150,000.00. Shane spoke on behalf of Trane and indicated they do not have bonds typically on short-term projects. Trane is a twenty-billion dollar company and has been in North Dakota since 1960 so risk is low. Shane also indicated that a bond may not be required since this project is part of a US Communities Contract. Nicole Meland, Interim Auditor, stated according to Century Code any public improvement project over \$150,000.00 should be bonded, but can double-check with Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney. Marks questioned if there would be any blind-sided costs since the contract lists a section of "does not include". Fettig says this was all discussed beforehand and does not believe there will be changes. Schwartz made a motion to approve the contract with Trane for \$198,550.00 and leave the bond out until another meeting if it is required, seconded by Neys. Roll call vote: Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks and Schwartz voted aye. Motion carried.

Robin Iszler, from Central Valley Health District, presented the Central Valley Health District Budget Request for 2018. The increase for revenue will be \$56,665.00. The total budget for 2018 would be \$1,157,635.00. Expenses will decrease by \$2,063.00. Iszler did present a 5-year comparison. The final step would be for Stutsman and Logan County to meet and certify the budget.

Corry Shevlin, JSDC, spoke regarding closing the section line and re-dedication. JSDC would be dedicating 66 feet on the E1/2 of Section 28. This would be done in order to close a portion of the section line for ND Soy to build their plant. Scott Legge owns the W1/2 of Section 28 and stated he doesn't have an issue with closing the section line; his only concern is to be able to access his field during harvest. Members of the board from Spiritwood Township also addressed concerns about access to any adjacent property. Daren Peterka, Interstate Engineering, discussed options regarding access. There is an area that is currently unpassable due to water but there are some options on how to address that issue. Any costs associated with the project would be paid by ND Soy per

their signed letter of intent. The topic was tabled until additional information is obtained on how the road will be constructed.

Nicole Meland, Interim Auditor/COO, requested DiSC Training for Auditor's Office. This training consists of a personality test that is a tool used for discussion of employees behavioral differences. The test would lay out their personalities in one of four groups and discusses how they learn, how they work with others and how others view you. The DiSCover Yourself & Others Workshop would be held on October 25, 2017. The main floor of the courthouse would need to be closed for 4 hours. Meland believes it would be a good tool, considering how new everybody is in their positions, and help employees work together in areas we have been having difficulties. Dawn Kaiser would do the training. For 12-15 people the total fee is \$2,500.00, which is reasonable and in the budget. Neys made a motion, seconded by Ova to approve the request for the training course for the employees. Roll call vote: Klose, Ova, Marks, Schwartz and Neys voted aye. Motion carried.

The 2016 Audit report is complete. There were no written issues, just a verbal comment about missing a receipt on one of the credit card statements. Department Heads were reminded to have documentation for every charge on the credit cards. They thanked Stutsman County staff members for being courteous and friendly. The Audit was done at the end of May.

The Library Lease Agreement was changed to a 20-year agreement with a 12-month opt-out by either party at a rental cost of \$1.00 per year. Marks made a motion to approve the presented library lease agreement, Schwartz seconded. Roll call vote: Ova, Marks, Schwartz, Neys and Klose voted aye. Motion carried.

Eric Nordstrom requested a letter of support from Stutsman County with regards to the Spiritwood Lake beach clean-up. This letter will be presented to the City of Spiritwood. Ova made a motion, seconded by Neys to approve writing a letter of support to Nordstrom for the clean-up project. Motion carried.

Senator John Grabinger contacted Commissioner Klose with regards to dredging underneath the bridge and bay at the Reservoir. Game and Fish didn't officially say they would pay for the cost but there is a possibility. The cost estimate is \$10,000.00 plus hauling costs. Ova made a motion to send in the permit request, seconded by Marks. Motion carried.

Ashley Tanata, Accounts/Property Coordinator, requested approval of Special Permit for the Hitchin' Post. Ova made a motion, seconded by Schwartz to approve the permit. Motion carried.

A request for approval of three special permits for the Corner Bar was made. Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Ova to approve all three special permits. Motion carried.

Approval of an Application for Beer License and Application for Liquor License for the Corner Bar was requested. Ova approved the requested licenses, seconded by Neys. Motion carried.

Neys made a motion, seconded by Schwartz to approve the mid-month bills and taxable meals. Roll call vote: Marks, Schwartz, Neys, Klose and Ova voted aye. Motion carried.
