

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission

September 1, 2009

At 4:00 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, Doug Kaiser, Craig Neys and Mark T. Klose answered roll call.

A motion was made by Ova seconded by Kaiser to approve the minutes of the August 2009 meetings. Motion carried.

Jerry Bergquist, 9-1-1 Coordinator/Emergency Manager, reviewed the advantages and disadvantages of participating in the National Flood Insurance program. The County's participation would give homeowners the opportunity to purchase flood insurance. Marks made a motion seconded by Ova to enroll in the National Flood Insurance Program. Motion carried.

Shawn Lange and Larry Readell, Township Supervisors, requested relaxation of the rule prohibiting private contractors from accessing county gravel pits. The County did not have time to gravel the non-FEMA spots in all the townships this year. Access to the pits would allow the townships to hire contractors to get the work completed. Mike Zimmerman, County Highway Superintendent, requested strict guidelines to monitor the pits. Marks made a motion seconded by Ova to allow access to the county pits for this year only with strict oversight by the County Highway Superintendent. Motion carried.

Eldridge Township had submitted an application for a \$10,000 loan from the county for non-FEMA related road maintenance. Neys made a motion seconded by Ova to approve the loan from the General Fund Sub-account. Roll call vote – Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose voted aye.

Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney, gave his monthly report. The wind turbine ordinance had been filed. He was working on the over-weight ordinance. He would request an Attorney General's Opinion on whether or not non-home rule Counties could retain overweight fines if they provided the personnel and equipment for enforcement.

Zimmerman requested acknowledgement of the FEMA payment policy. For large projects, reimbursement payments are made based on percentage of completion. Ova made a motion seconded by Neys to acknowledge the FEMA repayment policy for projects exceeding \$64,200. Motion carried.

Zimmerman presented historical patching costs for County paved highways. For the past six years, patching costs have ranged from \$140 per mile to \$3,900 per mile for different road segments. In 2009, his department had spent over \$225,000. Recycling paved roads back to gravel would cost about \$20,000 per mile. He estimated a potential savings on annual patching costs of up to \$150,000. Costs for a contractor to recycle roads would be about \$8,000 per mile plus \$1,200 per move. A new recycling machine would cost about \$400,000 or \$76,000 per year on a 5-year commitment.

ND DOT had approved Emergency Relief (ER) projects 1 through 11. Ova made a motion seconded by Neys for Interstate Engineering to prepare engineering contracts for all approved ER sites. Motion carried.

Kaiser made a motion seconded by Marks to amend an earlier motion "to crush up to \$50,000 at the Brown pit in Sharlow Township" to read "to crush up to \$50,000 in additional gravel". Motion carried.

Neys made a motion seconded by Marks to increase the maximum lodging reimbursement rates to \$63.00 similar to the ND State lodging rates. Roll call vote – Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose and Ova voted aye.

At 5:08 p.m. the County Commission meeting was recessed for the County Park Board meeting.

Stutsman County Park Board Meeting

At 5:13 p.m. Chairman Klose called the Stutsman County Park Board meeting to order. Park Board members present were Mark Schlecht, Bob Woodward, Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, Doug Kaiser, Craig Neys and Mark T. Klose.

Woodward made a motion that was seconded by Ova to approve the minutes from the August meeting. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Kaiser and seconded by Schlecht to approve the payment of the monthly bills. Roll call vote – Woodward, Schlecht, Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose voted aye.

Harold Laraway, Spiritwood Lake City resident, reported on access issues for cabins located north of Sandy Beach. He requested closing the section line access road to his cabin so he could have the right of way and peace and quiet. He was instructed to file a request to close the section line with the Auditor's office. A public hearing would be held on the request after publication and notification to adjacent property owners.

Dennis Lorenz, County Park Superintendent, gave his monthly report. At Ypsilanti Park, most of the damage had been repaired. Commissioner Marks reported that the wash outs had been filled and the old out house had been removed. The ND Game & Fish and the Dakota Anglers had committed to funding a new toilet.

At Parkhurst, the flood-damaged shelters were being demolished and they were trying to salvage material to build 2 to 3 small shelters. At Pelican Point Landing, the rental cabins were back in their locations. Different options for replacing the concession building were being considered. Possible options were to build on site, to modify a mobile home or to move a log building onto the site. The camp ground committee would pursue options.

Johnson reported that the Bureau of Reclamation would provide \$200,000 to assist the Park Board with the cost of flood recovery provided the County could match the funds. Johnson indicated that the County Commission had approved \$200,000 for the matching funds.

Lorenz presented four (4) options for relocating the Marina at the Reservoir. The most cost effective option would relocate the building above and directly north of its former location.

Lorenz indicated that weed spraying would be completed this fall. The Bureau of Reclamation would reimburse the Board for the cost.

A motion to adjourn was made by Schlecht and seconded by Woodward. At 5:57 p.m. the September 2009 County Park Board meeting was adjourned.

At 5:58 p.m. the regular Commission meeting was called back to order with all Commissioners present.

Kaiser made a motion seconded by Ova to approve payment of the monthly bills. Roll call vote – Kaiser, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks voted aye.
