Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission – September 2nd, 2014

At 4:00 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dale Marks, David Schwartz, Craig Neys, and Mark T. Klose answered the roll call. Dennis Ova was absent.

Neys made a motion, seconded by Marks to approve the minutes of the August 2014 meetings. Motion carried.

Sandy Eckelberg, Account/Property Coordinator, on behalf of Jerome Koenig of the Woodworth Wildlife Club, requested Stutsman County to sponsor them for a Garrison Diversion Grant. The Woodworth Wildlife Club is building a vault toilet at Big Mallard Marsh which is north of Woodworth and will approximately cost \$10,200. The Garrison Diversion Grant will cover 25% of the cost and the club will request funds for the other 75% from Game and Fish. Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Marks to approve to sponsor the Woodworth Wildlife Club contingent upon the club securing funds for the project. Motion Carried.

Neys made a motion, seconded by Schwartz to approve the beer and liquor application for Scott Anderson dba/Cork and Barrel Liquors for the Beer Gardens at the Fair Grounds. Motion Carried.

Connie Ova, JSDC, requested approval of a roof replacement for the Economic Development Building. Greenberg Roofing informed JSDC the roof is beyond the point of repair and needs to be replaced. Greenberg Roofing estimated it would cost \$88,267 and would be a 90/10 percent city/county split. The county's portion would be \$9,000. Greenberg Roofing will also be able to get the roof fixed in September. Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Neys to approve the request as presented. Roll call vote: Marks, Schwartz, Neys, Klose voted aye.

Renee Valenta, Interim Treasurer, presented her resignation letter and informed the commissioners her last day will be September 19, 2014. Valenta introduced Jessica Rosenberg, Deputy Treasurer, to the commissioners.

Dennis Ova arrived at 4:05 p.m.

Valenta requested to delete two signatures and add one signature for the county's bank accounts. Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Marks to approve the request as presented. Roll call vote: Ova, Marks, Schwartz, Neys, Klose voted aye.

Dustin Bakken, Tax Director, requested approval of an application for tax abatement for Parcel # 03-3430000. The abatement application is for the year 2012. Ova made a motion, seconded by Marks to approve the request. Motion Carried.

Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney, presented his monthly report. Fremgen informed the commissioners the attorney, Porsborg, modified requests in the case with the Correctional Center vs. Brodrick Jenkins. The State's Attorney's Office is continuing to scan all DUI's, felonies, and sex crimes for the last ten years. Currently, \$8000 has been spent and has \$8,000 left to spend for this project.

Fremgen is requesting one additional FTE for a legal secretary in the State's Attorney's Office for the budget year of 2015. Fritz presented information to the commissioners. No action was taken with the request of an additional secretary.

Mickey Nenow, County Highway Superintendent presented his monthly report. Nenow requested approval for a utility permit from Great River Energy to bore under the 93<sup>rd</sup> Avenue road. Ova made a motion, seconded by Neys to approve the permit as presented. Motion Carried.

Mickey stated Highway 68 project which is north of Medina is completed and is waiting for final inspection. Highway 62 is having the final lift added and then it will be ready for chip seal. The Road Department will start gravel crushing on Thursday or Friday. The road crew is still graveling roads and putting in culverts where needed. They will start rocking once some of the crops are harvested.

Jerry Bergquist, 9-1-1 Manager/Coordinator, requested acceptance of supplemental Fiscal Year 2013 Emergency Management Performance Grant funds. Bergquist used the funds to replace a cell phone and to purchase a copier in the amount of \$1800. The grant is a 50/50 percent grant. Ova made a motion, seconded by Schwartz to accept the grant as presented. Motion Carried.

Bergquist informed the commissioners the last dispatcher position has been filled. Breanna Boehm started today.

Darin Goter, Assistant Jail Administrator, is requested approval of an agreement between Jamestown Community Correction Program and Stutsman County. Dell Horn was present and informed the commissioners the agreement is for Community Service and Stutsman County will reimburse the program at a rate of \$1.00 per hour. Marks made a motion, seconded by Schwartz to approve entering in the agreement with Jamestown Community Correction Program as presented. Motion Carried.

Linda Chadduck, Deputy Auditor, informed the commissioners the county received one bid for the old Senior Citizens Center Building from Richard Geigle and is in the amount of \$40,000 with a \$4,000 cashier's check for earnest money. The county has \$17,000 remaining on the balance of the roof. It is the consensus of the commissioners to table the sale of the old Senior Citizen's building.

Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Ova to establish the early voting precinct for October 20, 2014 to November 3, 2014 from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and Saturday, November 1, 2014 from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Motion Carried.

At 4:45 p.m., the Stutsman County Commission Meeting recessed for the County Park Board Meeting.

Dennis Lorenz, County Park Superintendent, presented his monthly report. Lorenz informed the commissioners the concrete was poured Thursday for the 16 x 80 foot boat ramp at James River Boat Club. Dennis ordered buoys through a Sheriff's grant. The buoys have arrived.

Lorenz informed the commissioners regarding complaints about a camper which is located at the back of Spiritwood Lake. The campers have been moving from spot to spot every fourteen days. Dennis spoke with the Sheriff about the complaint. Sheriff Kaiser told Dennis there is nothing he can do regarding the campers unless the county adopts an ordinance. The commissioners suggested for Dennis to visit with Casey Bradley, Auditor/COO, about adopting an ordinance for Spiritwood Lake.

Dennis stated he has been having trouble with the utility tractor. It has been leaking transmission oil in the engine. The commissioners requested Lorenz to contact the Road Department to see if they can fix it.
