

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission

September 4, 2007

At 4:00 p.m. the regular monthly meeting of the Stutsman County Commission was called to order by Chairman Klose. Roll call was answered by Douglas Kaiser, Craig Neys, Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, and Mark T. Klose.

A motion to approve the minutes of the August meetings was made by Kaiser and seconded by Ova. Motion carried.

Dave Orr, County Sheriff, requested permission to seek bids for a sheriff's vehicle. The cost was in his budget. Ova made a motion that was seconded by Neys to allow Sheriff Orr to solicit bids for a vehicle. Motion carried.

Kaiser made a motion that was seconded by Marks to request Sheriff Orr to officially close County Highway 68 south of Cleveland where the high water has created unsafe road conditions. Motion carried.

Ernie Williams, Sinclair Township Board Supervisor, requested a \$31,000 loan from the County to help pay for raising the grade between sections 31 and 32 in Sinclair Township. FEMA would only pay for 9 inches of fill and gravel. This would not get the road out of the water. A Township loan policy would be drafted for FEMA qualified projects for the current Presidential Disaster Declaration. Kaiser made a motion that was seconded by Ova to borrow Sinclair Township \$31,000 at 5% annual interest out of the General Fund sub-account. Roll call vote - Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose voted aye.

Mike Zimmerman, County Highway Superintendent, and Steve Thompson, Interstate Engineering, updated the Commission on the time lines for the grade raises on County Highway 67 south of Cleveland and North of Gackle. A recommendation from the Corp of Engineers on the wetlands was required before the project concept report could be finalized. October 29<sup>th</sup> was the earliest possible starting date for the projects. It was probable that the projects may not get done until next spring. The Commission would call a special meeting pending future developments.

Jan Thompson, County Treasurer, reviewed the legislative change that reduced the tax foreclosure process from 5 to 3 years. Counties had the authority to grant interest and penalty holidays to alleviate any burden on the taxpayers because of the time reduction. Total delinquent taxes were about \$1.8 million with another \$170,000 in accumulated interest and penalty. The State was giving up to a \$500 income tax credit provided the 2006 property taxes were paid. Marks made a motion to allow an interest and penalty holiday for one and one-half months to allow citizens to clean up their taxes. The motion died for lack of a second.

Thompson presented the following county warrants that were older than one year to enter into the minutes for cancellation at the next Commission meeting.

Sandy Bendewald, Stutsman County Social Services Director, requested allowing employees to donate leave to a new employee that will be taking an extended leave for illness. Ova made a motion that was seconded by Kaiser to allow employees to donate vacation or sick leave per the employee policy manual. Motion carried.

Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney, gave his monthly report. He would request the public administrator to review the procedures and statutes regarding guardian ad litem fees that are paid by the county.

Jerry Bergquist, 9-1-1 Coordinator/Emergency Manager, representing the County personnel committee, presented the recommendation of The Archer Company. Archer was the County's wage and benefit consultant. They recommended a review of the pay plan every five years. The County's plan had not been reviewed since 2002. Archer's recommendation was to compress the county's pay plan by increasing the lower graded jobs 20+% and to increase the upper graded jobs 3% for a cost of living and a cost of labor adjustment. Other entity's pay scales such as counties and the state had been reviewed and compared to the current Stutsman County pay plan. To implement the Archer recommendation, the personnel committee recommended a 2% COLA plus one step and movement to one-half of the Archer recommendation. Noel Johnson, County COO, presented costs for the wage increases, projected fund balances and a projected reduction of one mill in the total county mill levy. Commissioner Klose requested a breakdown of costs: an itemization for the increase in employee health insurance, the cost for a 2% COLA, the cost for a step increase and the cost to implement the Archer plan.

At 5:25 p.m. the Commission meeting was recessed for the Park Board meeting.

Sandy Eckelberg, Accounts and Property Coordinator, informed the Board that the Limpy Jack Trail Grant request had been approved by the ND Department of Parks and Recreation. The funds would be used to develop an extension of the Fort Totten Trail in the Arrowwood National Wildlife Refuge, to be known as Limpy Jack's Leg.

Eckelberg reported that the four cabin owners that had not made application for a sewer inspection to Jim Michel, Environmental Health Practitioner, as of the last Park Board meeting had all made contact and their sewers had been or were in the process of being inspected.

Ron Naze, Lot 9 East Side cabin owner, questioned his sewer status classification. He did not have the necessary one acre for a drain field since the elevation had been changed from 1,430 feet to 1,444 feet for septic system area calculations. He had no running water and no septic system. He had a year around permit. There were three sewer system classifications and none of them applied to his situation. Nellie Degen, cabin owner, indicated that she had contacted the State and they indicated that his system would be compliant "as is" until his status changed. It was suggested that there should be a 4<sup>th</sup> category for this type of primitive cabin. Central Valley Health would be contacted so the status could be reviewed.

Eckelberg reviewed a request by a cabin owner for a refund of permit fees because they wanted to revert from a year around cabin to a seasonal cabin. In 2004, cabin owners were given one final opportunity to convert from seasonal to year around occupancy. The conversion decision was delayed while the cabin owners and the Board considered a central sewer collection system. An affordable plan for a central system never materialized so the Board established October 1, 2007 as the deadline for conversion. The party that requested conversion did not own the cabin in 2004 and had purchased it as a year around permit in 2005. A motion was made by Schlecht and seconded by Ova to deny the refund request. Motion carried.

Eckelberg gave the monthly report. The Bureau of Reclamation had allocated \$73,670 in cooperative agreement funds. The Parkhurst Horse camp was about 90% complete. Camping receipts were down at Lakeside Marina, up at Pelican Point Landing, and up overall compared to this time last year.

Nellie Degen, cabin owner, requested that the Board assist the cabin owners by changing from the 1,444 elevation back to the 1,430 foot mark that had been used up until 1997. This would help with septic system area compliance. It was not fair to have one standard for seasonal cabins and another for year around cabins. Eckelberg indicated that the original standard had been 1,454 feet and it was negotiated down to 1,444. Park Board member Woodward commented that the cabins were never meant to be occupied year around. In the 1960's all cabins had out houses. The policy allowing year around occupancy had changed on a trial basis in the 1970's and it had been changed to allow anyone to have a year around permit only recently. Commissioner Ova would check with Central Valley Health about the elevation change request.

A motion to adjourn was made by Neys and seconded by Woodward. At 6:19 p.m. the September 4, 2007 Stutsman County Park Board meeting was adjourned.

At 6:20 p.m. the Stutsman County Commission meeting was called back to order with all Commissioners present.

Kaiser made a motion that was seconded by Marks to pay the monthly bills. Roll call vote - Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose, and Ova voted aye.
