

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission

September 16, 2008

AT 8:00 a.m. the joint meeting of the Stutsman County Commission and the Logan County Commission for the hearing on the Central Valley Health District's 2009 budget was called to order by Stutsman County Auditor, Noel Johnson. Roll call was answered by Elmer Batsch, Jack Erbele and John Wald, Logan County Commissioners and Blanche Schumacher, Logan County Auditor by speaker phone; and by Stutsman County Commissioners Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, Doug Kaiser, Craig Neys and Mark T Klose. Also present was Robin Iszler, Director of the Central Valley Health District.

Nominations were opened for Chairman of the joint meeting. A motion was made by Batsch and seconded by Neys to nominate Mark Klose as Chairman. Motion carried.

Ms. Iszler reviewed the District's 2009 budget. Both County's budgets were based on 5 mills. Stutsman County's share of the budget was \$570,977 and Logan County's share of the budget was \$52,178.

A motion was made by Batsch and seconded by Ova to approve the 2009 budget. Roll call vote – Batsch, Erbele, Wald, Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose voted aye.

A motion was made by Neys and seconded by Erbele to adjourn. At 8:08 a.m. the joint Logan County – Stutsman County meeting was adjourned.

At 8:09 a.m. the mid-month meeting of the Stutsman County Commission was called to order by Chairman Klose. Roll call was answered by Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, Doug Kaiser, Craig Neys and Mark T. Klose.

Mike Zimmerman, County Highway Superintendent, requested permission to advertise the statutory requirement for fall mowing along County and Township roads. Kaiser made a motion that was seconded by Marks to authorize the ad. Motion carried.

Zimmerman reported fall graveling was continuing and that gravel crushing would begin soon. Zimmerman requested permission for out-of-state travel for road department personnel to attend the regional road conference in Rapid City, SD on October 29th and 30th. Marks made a motion that was seconded by Neys to allow the out-of-state travel. Motion carried.

Kaiser made a motion that was seconded by Marks to authorize Chairman Klose to sign the right of way maintenance compliance certification for all roads that had used Federal Aid. Motion carried.

The work continued on notification to land owners that right of way encroachment along county roads would be enforced. ND DOT and the Federal Highway Administration require no encroachment on road right of ways. The land owners would be informed of the requirement that the right of way would have to be restored back to its original condition and seeded back to a mixture of grass that met DOT guidelines.

Jim Fletchell, Land Surveyor for Interstate Engineering, Inc., requested that the County participate in the cost to survey the road right of way along the paved County road adjacent to the property owned by Roger and Shirly Krapp in Spiritwood Lake City. Also present were Roger and Shirly Krapp. There was no recorded document for the road right of way for the County Highway. The Krapp's were willing to deed a 50 foot strip on either side of the center line of the County Road provided the County pay the

\$750 survey cost. Marks made a motion that was seconded by Kaiser to pay the \$750 survey cost in exchange for the right of way and to authorize Chairman Klose to sign a quit claim deed to the Krapps to clear up the title to the adjacent land. Roll call vote – Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose voted aye.

Connie Ova, JSDC CEO, requested approval to sell to Ag Country Farm Credit Services Lots 1, 2, & 3, Block 2, I-94 Business Park Addition to the City of Jamestown for \$138,407 or \$0.85 per square foot. Marks made a motion that was seconded by Ova to approve the sale. Roll call vote – Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose and Ova voted aye.

Ms. Ova requested that the Commission approve funding for HVAC replacement and repair for their building. South Central Dakota Regional Council, Jamestown Chamber of Commerce and JSDC would share in the \$30,000 estimated cost. The JSDC Board of Directors recommended approval of the request. Kaiser made a motion that was seconded by Neys to approve \$3,960 in County funds. Roll call vote – Kaiser, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks voted aye.

Ova made a motion that was seconded by Kaiser to set polling hours from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. for the November 4, 2008 General Election; to appoint the following election workers and to pay \$8.00 an hour to the clerks, judges and greeters and to pay \$9.00 an hour to the inspectors. Motion carried. Inspectors: Precinct 1 – Linda Snyder; Precinct 2 – Elaine Timm; Precinct 5 – Gerald Eissinger; Jamestown Vote Center - Noel Johnson, LeAnn Fuchs, Gayle Frey, Gloria Harr, Tom Sklebar; Absentee Precinct – Noel Johnson. Judges: Precinct 1 – Debra Diede, Democrat and Elizabeth Koenig, Republican; Precinct 2 – Pat Neva, Democrat and Marlene Ekren, Republican; Precinct 5 – Donald Gienger, Democrat and Ellen Rau, Republican; Jamestown Vote Center - Ann Marks, David Hanson, Elaine Hanson, Carolyn Exner, Kate Spanjer, Democrat and Colleen Conley, Marlene Axtman, James Naves, Mary Werner, Joyce Heinrich, Republican; Absentee Precinct – Barb Erickson, Democrat and Andrew Kudrna, Republican. Clerks: Precinct 1 – LeAnn Uehran and LaVonne Clark; Precinct 2 – Eileen Vigasaa and Elaine Soupir; Precinct 5 – Janet Patton and Esther Graf; Jamestown Vote Center - Randi Meisch, JoAnne Moeller-Andersen, Darlene Johnson, Lucille Olson, Pam Wolff, Patty Fisher, Judy Perleberg, Darlene Michel, Megan Dally, Carrie Curtis, Linda Chadduck, Josh Smaage, Sandy Eckelberg, Tiffiney Dick, Alice Pekarski, Renee Valenta; Absentee Precinct - Judy Graves and Lori Carlson. Greeters: Jamestown Vote Center - Jim Exner, Jim Thompson, Gerhardt Lange, Gary Olson.

COO Johnson reviewed the items remaining to finalize the 2009 County budgets. Marks made a motion that was seconded by Neys to approve \$625 in County Park funds for Spiritwood Lake City to assist with garbage and utility costs paid by the City for the County Park property. Motion carried.

Kaiser made a motion that was seconded by Neys to budget \$500 for the Ypsilanti Betterment Club to assist with costs to maintain the park that is owned by Stutsman County. Motion carried.

Johnson presented various cost scenarios for different wage options. Johnson projected that the mill levy would decrease from 109.96 to 109.60 mills for 2009. The 2009 budgets included \$1.08 million in capitol improvements, \$150,000 for increases in fuel and energy costs, \$65,000 for technology upgrades, a \$55,000 increase to fund Federal and State mandates, and \$450,000 in employee wage adjustments and health insurance increases. The County's reserves would decrease from \$6.7 million to \$5.9 million.

Marks made a motion that was seconded by Neys to approve the option to fully implement The Archer Company's wage proposal which included a 4% COLA and to give a step increase January 1, 2009 to all employees that had a satisfactory annual job performance evaluation. Roll call vote – Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks and Kaiser voted aye.

Neys made a motion that was seconded by Kaiser to approve \$190.00 in taxable meals. Roll call vote – Klose, Ova, Marks, Kaiser and Neys voted aye.

A motion was made by Ova and seconded by Kaiser to pay the mid-month bills. Roll call vote – Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys, and Klose voted aye.
