Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission – September 17th, 2015

At 8:00 a.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, David Schwartz, Craig Neys, and Mark T. Klose answered the roll call.

Neys made a motion, seconded by Schwartz to approve rezoning requested by the Courtenay windfarm from Agricultural to Industrial. All aye, motion carried.

Schwartz made a motion to approve the Beer and Liquor license for Oviatt LLC dba Corner Bar at the Stutsman County Fair Beer Gardens, seconded by Ova. All aye, motion carried.

Tyler Michel, Assistant Highway Superintendent, requested cement treated base for gravel roadway north of the DSA Ethanol Plant approximately ½ mile. Road department will do some of the work to cut down cost. Quote was just under \$61,000 and testing won't support the fly ash, if not done soon the project will have to wait until next year. Suggestion made to use state aid account to fund the ½ mile stretch & help alleviate traffic from Spiritwood. Ova made a motion, seconded by Marks to approve the request as presented. Roll call vote: Ova, Marks, Schwartz, Neys and Klose vote aye. Motion carried.

Casey Bradley, County Auditor/Chief Operating Officer, requested a nomination of a commissioner as the North Dakota Association of Counties' conference delegate that will be held October 25-27th in Bismarck. Ova nominated Schwartz, seconded by Neys. All aye, motion carried.

Josh Smaage, Information Technology Director, states he has had a total of seven applicants for the Assistant job. Smaage is requesting increasing the pay to \$54,000-55,000 to draw more interest from outside cities. Bradley suggested approving the pay increase to draw more interest in the position. Schwartz made a motion to increase the pay, seconded by Neys. All aye, motion carried.

David Bratton, Veteran Service Officer, requested to close the Veteran Service Office so that he and Rita Morris can attend training out of town. Bratton will run ads in the local newspaper of the office closing. Ova made a motion, seconded by Marks to approve closing the office for training. All aye, motion carried.

Bradley informed the commission that they will need a nomination for a State Fair delegate. Ova made a motion to nominate Neys, seconded by Schwartz. All aye, motion carried.

Jamestown Regional Airport requested additional funding; utilize the loan fund of \$776,977 balance and request an additional 0.2 mills on the mill levy and spread the loan over five years. The levy would only affect the areas outside city limits. Jim Boyd, Airport board member, stated the Regional Airport had planned a large project with the FA paying 90% and an additional entity picking up another 5% and the remaining 5% coming from local government. Boyd states they are requesting \$65,000 one-time loan for wetlands mitigation to reduce the amount of birds in the northeast area and increase flight safety. FAA wants the projects completed in the year 2016. Neys made a motion, seconded by Marks to approve a \$65,000 loan. Roll call vote: Marks, Schwartz, Neys, Klose and Ova all vote aye, motion carried.

State's Attorney, Fritz Fremgen, requested an additional attorney due to the work load he currently is carrying and the overtime he has worked to keep up with the workload. Marks states with an increase in the amounts of felonies and misdemeanors he can see funding an additional attorney to alleviate some of the extra workload. Marks made a motion to fund an additional attorney. Motion died for lack of a second. With new legislation changes, felonies will be handled differently and money is being spent due to mental health cases being contracted out to other attorneys. Schwartz informed the commission that Fremgen accepted an additional job teaching at the University of Jamestown and that could explain the extra hours needed to stay current with the workload. Schwartz made a motion to place the State's attorney position on the next ballot in June 2016 to let voters decide if the position should be an elected position or an appointed position, seconded by Neys. Roll call vote: Schwartz, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks vote aye, motion carried.

South Central Dakota Regional Council had a meeting Monday September 16, 2015 with dues on the agenda. Bradley informed the commission that SCDRC had not submitted their budget until 4:30pm on September 16, 2015. South Central Dakota Regional Council requested \$34,824 which has a 3% increase. SCDRC has not finalized the GRE loan and stated Stutsman County has not submitted the corresponding land

documentation. Schwartz questioned the deficit spending that has been an ongoing problem for years, Bradley stated they have not submitted any resolution for their deficit spending. SCDRC is currently delinquent on 5-6 loans and by law Stutsman County is a member but not required to pay dues. The CDBG is currently the only grants the county is required to use SCDRC for. Marks made a motion to keep the budget for SCDRC at \$33,810 and no 3% increase, motion died for lack of a second. Schwartz made a motion to remove South Central Dakota Regional Council funding, seconded by Neys. Roll call vote: Neys, Klose, Ova and Schwartz vote aye, Marks vote nay, motion carried to remove SCDRC funding.

The request to increase health insurance 5% on the employers share had been made, Klose feels uncomfortable adjusting the employer's share questioning how it can be stopped once in motion. Wage and Benefit committee requested a 3% COLA and 5% increase to health insurance, Department heads requested a 4% COLA and no increase to the health insurance. Commission will leave the wages and health insurance increase as presented in the budget, 3% COLA and 5% increase in the county share of health insurance.

The budget hearing will be held on October 6th, 2015 at 6:00pm in the Commission room. The mill levy increase is under 0% so the County does not need to send out notice of increase letters. The final hearing to rezone the county land in Spiritwood Lake City will take place at 7:30pm on October 6th, 2015 because of the potential time conflict Tyler Perleberg, Tax Director; will be attending the Spiritwood Lake City meeting.

UTC has made the request to lease the JSDC building at \$36,000 per year for rent with a 2% increase March 1^{st} , 2016 and March 1^{st} , 2017 with the option to purchase. Schwartz made a motion to approve the request made by UTC, seconded by Ova. All aye, motion carried.

Ova made a motion to approve mid-month bills and taxable meals, seconded by Schwartz. Roll call vote: Klose, Ova, Marks, Schwartz and Neys all vote aye, motion carried.
