

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission— September 17, 2024

At 9:00 a.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Jerry Bergquist, Chad Wolsky, Joan Morris, Levi Taylor, and Mark Klose were present.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Jessica Alonge, Auditor/COO, presented updates and reminders for the 2024 general election.

Daniel Schwartz, Nexus Consulting, presented a discussion regarding the generator grant and an update on the installation of the generator for the Law Enforcement Center and Courthouse. The generator has been installed and is awaiting additional testing to ensure its reliability. Schwartz stated that he will work with Alonge to finalize costs for reimbursement, which are estimated to take 1-3 weeks after submission.

Jeff Mitchell, Chase Lake Landowner, presented a discussion regarding roads within Chase Lake Township and water and ice that has been disrupting the roads and culverts. Mitchell stated that there are roads that need gravel added due to them being saturated from the bottom up, roads widened in certain areas, and larger culverts needing to be implemented before spring. Jim Wentland, Road Superintendent, stated that he has been in contact with Fish & Wildlife about obtaining funds to help with the cost of the needed repairs.

Andrew Kirking, Emergency Manager/911 Coordinator, presented a request for out of state travel to send a dispatcher to Deadwood, South Dakota for the Dakota 911 Conference on September 30 to October 2. A motion to approve the out of state travel was made by Morris, seconded by Wolsky. Motion carried.

Jim Wentland, Road Superintendent, requested permission to advertise for motor grader bids before the end of the year to sign on with the 2024 pricing before the 2025 price increase. A motion to approve the advertisement of bids was made by Wolsky, seconded by Bergquist. Motion carried.

Jerry Bergquist, County Commissioner, and Mike Gunsch, Houston Engineering, presented an update on the Crystal Springs Watershed Initiative and Steering Committee. Gunsch stated that the committee has secured a \$40,000 commitment on the project and that there are ongoing discussions for additional funding contributions. BNSF stated that they are within discussions about potential contributions along with the \$20,000 in-kind contribution that has already been committed. Gunsch has completed the WEB grant application and is awaiting a sponsor certification which will need to be completed upon grant approval. After the Commission has approved the funding, Gunsch will proceed with the feasibility study and has been gathering data during the interim period of awaiting grant approval. Kirking has been working with Gunsch on hazard mitigation plans for potential eligibility for additional funds. Bergquist stated that the Crystal Springs Bible Camp is a 501(c)(3) organization which would allow them to accept tax-deductible contributions to help fund for the project. The Department of Water Resources will reimburse 45% of the total cost. The local share is estimated to be \$99,900.

Jessica Alonge, Auditor/COO, requested appointment of the 2024 General Election Inspectors for Election Day and office staff for Absentee voting. A motion to appoint the pollworkers was made by Morris, seconded by Bergquist. Motion carried.

Alonge requested to reschedule the November 5, 2024, Commission and Park Board meetings due to it being the same day as the General Election. The meeting is tentatively rescheduled to November 12, 2024, at 1:00 p.m.

At 9:42 a.m., the Commission recessed for the County Park Board meeting.
