

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission – September 20, 2016

At 4:00 p.m., Chairman Klose called the mid-month meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Mark T. Klose, Craig Neys, Dale Marks, Dennis Ova, and David Schwartz answered the roll call.

Connie Ova, Jamestown/Stutsman Development Corp. CEO, presented the commission with a dues request for the South Central Dakota Regional Council. The amount and split between the City of Jamestown and Stutsman County increase 3% from last year’s request. Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Ova to pay \$13,273.00 to SCDRC for the 2017 dues. Roll call vote: Ova, Marks, Schwartz, Neys and Klose vote aye. Motion carried.

Ova notified the Commission that there were errors found on the RTS Shearing loan and requested permission to send RTS Shearing a final bill for the amount due. Ova made a motion to allow the final bill to be sent to RTS Shearing, seconded by Neys. Motion carried.

Tyler Perleberg, Stutsman County Tax Director, received verbal notification that one of the local assessors would no longer be handling township assessments. Midway sent in a contract to hire Stutsman County to handle the township appraisals. Neys made a motion to accept the contract with Midway Township, seconded by Marks. Motion carried.

Perleberg informed the Commission of a new commercial business in Lenton Township known as the Boondocks LLC. The business moved an old barn to Lenton Township and completely remodeled to use as an event center. Perleberg received an application for a property tax exemption on improvements from Julie Michel. In 2004 the Commission decided to allow that type of exemption. Perleberg stated that the barn did not have a value placed on it since it was used for Agricultural purposes prior to being moved and renovated. Perleberg did seek an opinion from State’s Attorney Fritz Fremgen and he had the opinion that it could be allowed based under the language that was used. Perleberg also reached out to the ND Association of Tax Directors and roughly 90% of the responses were to allow the exemption. The exemption qualifies for improvements only at 100% for 3-5 years. Schwartz made a motion, seconded by Marks to allow 5 years with 2 years expired since the barn was in fact moved onto the property in 2014 but was never valued with the exemption taking effect in 2017. Roll call vote: Marks, Schwartz, Neys, Klose and Ova vote aye. Motion carried.

Neys made a motion to approve the poll workers as presented, seconded by Schwartz. Motion carried.

Ova made a motion to appoint Dale Marks to Canvas Board as the Commission representative and Cheryl McPherson as the recorder’s representative and approve the listing of Canvas Board member, time, date and location as presented, seconded by Neys. Motion carried.

The appraisal hearing for Tax Foreclosure Properties is tentatively set for November 1, 2016 during the 4:00 p.m. Commission meeting. The Auditor’s office will verify that the date meets the century code requirements.

Marks made a motion, seconded by Ova to approve the mid-month bills and taxable meals. Roll call vote: Schwartz, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks vote aye. Motion carried.
