

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission

Sept 21, 2010

At 8:00 a.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, Craig Neys, and Mark T. Klose answered roll call.

A moment of silence was observed in memory of Commissioner Doug Kaiser.

On the agenda was a joint budget hearing scheduled with Logan and Stutsman Counties. Because there was no quorum from Logan County, the joint Logan/Stutsman County Commission Meeting was rescheduled for 4:00 p.m. on October 5, 2010.

The public hearing on the issuance of Recovery Zone Facility Revenue Bonds for IRET Properties for the construction of new movie theatres in the Buffalo Mall was held. No one appeared in opposition to the project. Jon Arntson, Bond Attorney representing the project owner, stated that the project would finance the construction of six new movie theatres with stadium seating and digital sound and that the resolution approves and authorizes the issuance of the bonds. He pointed out that the Commission was not creating any indebtedness or liability to the County by authorizing these bonds. Neys made a motion seconded by Ova to adopt the resolution authorizing the issuance of the bonds. Roll call vote – Ova, Marks, Neys and Klose voted aye.

Don Readel and Ken Daus presented a proposal to save the pavement on Stutsman County 42 west of Buchanan. Daus stated that the citizens had collected \$44,800 to pay for approximately 50 loads more or less of material to patch and overlay the bad spots on the five (5) miles of road in question. The citizens would like the Commission to agree not to grind the road for at least 5 years. Klose stated that this Commission could not bind another Commission to the decision not to grind the road. Noel Johnson, County COO, mentioned that Daus had questioned the possibility of the County giving the road to the townships in the future. If that would happen, the County Commission would be out of the decision making process for that road. The townships involved were Plainview, Hidden, Jim River Valley and Buchanan. Marks would check into getting the bridge near Krapp's in Plainview Township cleared for gravel hauling and see if haul road agreements were in place. Marks made a motion seconded by Ova to approve the agreement with the elimination of item 6 (agree not to grind road for 5 years) and item 7 (Commission intentions for future) and that the material to be used (item 3) would be based on standard County Road Department policy. Roll call vote – Marks, Neys, Klose and Ova voted aye.

Johnson reviewed the election workers for the November 2, 2010 General Election. Absentee voting starts on September 23, 2010 and Early Voting begins on October 18, 2010. Marks made a motion seconded by Ova to approve the election workers for the November General Election. Roll call vote – Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks voted aye.

Ova made a motion to approve \$147.50 in taxable meals. Motion was seconded by Neys. Roll call vote – Klose, Ova, Marks and Neys voted aye.

Jan Thompson, County Treasurer, presented the treasurer's checks and auditor's warrants that had not been cashed for over a year. Ova made a motion seconded by Neys to enter the checks and warrants into the minutes for cancellation at the October 19, 2010 meeting. Motion carried.

Commissioner Marks commented on meetings that had been held with four neighboring counties to develop a joint effort to enforce load restrictions on county roads. A Deputy Sheriff would be hired and provided a vehicle and scales. Barnes County would be the home location for the Deputy and equipment. A joint powers agreement was being developed. The counties would each contribute \$20,000 per year. An effort would be made to change the law the next legislative session so any overweight fines could be kept for the counties.

COO Johnson reviewed the 2011 budget changes to date. Ova made a motion seconded by Marks to set up expenditure and revenue accounts in the Farm-to-Market Fund (Fund 33) to take the expenses out of the Road and Bridge Fund (Fund 15) and create line items in Fund 33 for employee, equipment and material expenses for recycling roads. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Neys seconded by Marks to approve the County picking up the projected 4% increase for employee health insurance costs for 2011. Roll call vote – Marks, Neys, Klose and Ova voted aye.

Ova made a motion seconded by Neys to approve a 1.1% COLA for 2011 for all employees and a step increase (2%) for all employees that were not at their maximum step and had a satisfactory annual employee evaluation. Roll call vote – Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks voted aye.

A motion was made by Marks seconded by Neys to approve the 2011 revenue budgets at \$17,967,675 and expenditure budgets of \$19,475,650 with a projected 2010 mill levy of 113.67 mills (up 0.77 mills from 2009). Roll call vote – Klose, Ova, Marks and Neys voted aye.

Advertisements would be submitted to the Jamestown Sun to fill the unexpired term of Commissioner Kaiser. Selection of the replacement would be made the first week in October.

Neys made a motion seconded by Ova to adjourn. At 9:21 a.m., the mid-month meeting of the Stutsman County Commission was adjourned.
