

Official Proceedings of the Stutsman County Commission

October 6, 2009

At 4:00 p.m., Chairman Klose called the regular meeting of the Stutsman County Commission to order. Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, Doug Kaiser, Craig Neys and Mark T. Klose answered roll call.

A motion was made by Ova seconded by Kaiser to approve the minutes of the September 2009 meetings. Motion carried.

Neys made a motion seconded by Kaiser to approve the gaming request of Ducks Unlimited at 281 Stop in Pingree. Motion carried.

Ova made a motion seconded by Marks to approve the out-of-state travel request of Wendy Thompson to attend a Correctional Health Care Conference in St. Cloud, Minnesota. Roll Call Vote – Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose voted aye.

The hearing on the proposed 2010 county revenue and expenditure budgets was opened. Noel Johnson, County COO, reviewed the changes from 2009 to 2010, the projected 2009 mill levies, the projected 2010 ending balances by fund and the major budget increases. Kaiser made a motion seconded by Neys to approve the 2010 budgets - \$ 19,159,372 expenditures; \$ 18,078,416 revenues; \$ 6,473,734 projected 2010 ending fund balances; \$6,681,670 total levy or 112.91 mills. Roll call vote – Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose and Ova voted aye.

Darrell Wollan, Jamestown City Assessor, presented abatement requests from the City of Jamestown for value reductions due to flood damage. Ova made a motion seconded by Kaiser to approve the following value reductions for 2009 – 74-1810280 from \$140,200 to \$130,800; 74-2383320 from \$181,000 to \$166,900; 74-2383480 from \$209,200 to \$208,200; 74-2383560 from \$188,100 to \$183,600; 74-3374700 from \$64,400 to \$59,100; 74-3460780 from \$39,300 to \$34,600; 74-3460860 from \$43,800 to \$42,300; 74-3463160 from \$69,200 to \$66,200; 74-4155000 from \$41,500 to \$36,300; 74-5617700 from \$88,200 to \$86,300; 74-5703000 from \$203,500 to \$190,800; 74-5760100 from \$61,800 to \$52,700; 74-5761000 from \$60,700 to \$55,100; 74-5810200 from \$146,300 to \$141,600; 74-5810800 from \$164,100 to \$154,000; 74-5861300 from \$250,100 to \$238,800; 74-5861400 from \$236,300 to \$233,100; 74-5861600 from \$172,000 to \$160,900. Roll call vote – Kaiser, Neys, Klose, Ova and Marks voted aye.

Eunice Sahr, County Agent, requested extra hours for an employee to help cover the office due to an employee's illness. Neys made a motion seconded by Marks to increase Deb Hatlewick's hours on a week by week basis as needed. Roll call vote – Neys, Klose, Ova, Marks and Kaiser voted aye.

Fritz Fremgen, State's Attorney, gave his monthly report. An Attorney General's Opinion had been requested on whether or not our Home Rule Charter could stretch to non-home rule charter counties through a joint powers agreement (RE - overweight ordinance). Meetings were scheduled to review the overweight ordinance that was drafted a few years ago.

Mike Zimmerman, County Highway Superintendent, gave his monthly report. Five people were working on FEMA Project Worksheets (PW's). There were 244 sites in 2007 compared to over 1,300 sites this year. All County ER (Emergency Relief) projects would be bid for completion in 2010. The graveling crew would not have time to gravel any townships north of Interstate I-94 this fall.

Zimmerman presented a priority list of paved roads for possible recycling. The list was based on the matrix system, historical patching expense, safety and potential liability. Tony Roorda questioned whether or not the matrix system had been updated the past 3 years, whether or not consideration was given for probable additional traffic to the Spiritwood Energy Park, and cost factors for maintaining the gravel roads after recycling. Don Readell expressed concerns over recycling machine costs. Commissioner Marks commented on the prohibitive costs to upgrade all the County's paved roads. Johnson explained how special assessment districts are created - boundaries are established, costs projected and the cost to each individual (benefit) within the project, hearing on assessment district – if too many are against the project then it is killed.

Zimmerman reported that Gavilon Grain LLC d/b/a Peavey Company was going to abandon the new approach and they would be widening the existing approach at the top of the hill.

Judy Graves disagreed with Zimmerman's patching costs. She indicated that the numbers were exaggerated by 25% and the numbers were not accurate. Patching costs should not be the only criteria. The county should use proper criteria (traffic counts, distance to closest parallel, safety, location, maintenance costs, etc.) for prioritizing roads. The County should establish a road board with public

representation to assist with developing a 5 year road plan. A recycling machine should not be purchased without a 5 year plan.

Shirley Krapp, Spiritwood Lake City Auditor, requested reinstalling a fish control system on the culvert drainage system for the lake located under County Highway 63. The City and the cabin owners association would maintain the fish screens that would be installed by the ND Game & Fish Department through the "Save Our Lakes" program. The Commission requested a written agreement to clarify the installation and maintenance issues to avert any possible blame or liability for potentially raising the level of the lake.

Ray Greenwood, Homer Township Supervisor, requested a loan from the County to assist with paying a FEMA related bill until reimbursement from FEMA was received by the township. Marks made a motion seconded by Ova to approve a loan of \$31,000 at 5% annual interest from the General Fund Sub-account. Roll call vote – Klose, Ova, Marks, Kaiser and Neys voted aye.

At 6:18 p.m. the County Commission meeting was recessed for the County Park Board meeting.

At 6:26 p.m. Chairman Klose called the Stutsman County Park Board meeting to order. Park Board members present were Mark Schlecht, Dennis Ova, Dale Marks, Doug Kaiser, Craig Neys and Mark T. Klose. Bob Woodward was absent.

Ney made a motion seconded by Ova to approve the minutes from the September meeting. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Ova seconded by Neys to approve payment of the monthly bills. Roll call vote – Schlecht, Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose voted aye.

Bids were opened for remodeling the Lakeside Campground bathhouse – Schumacher Construction - \$110,024, Scherr Construction - \$165,600. Marks made a motion to award the contract to the low bidder pending a review by Lorenz, Fremgen and Johnson. Roll call vote – Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose and Schlecht voted aye.

Johnson updated the Board on the meeting of the concession building committee. The Pelican Point concession building would be located south of its old site at an elevation of 1,457' to prevent any future flooding. Several building options were considered ranging from a manufactured home to a building built on site. Marks made a motion seconded by Schlecht to proceed with a 28 foot by 50 foot building foot print with a 4 foot perimeter foundation and a floating concrete slab for relocating the garage. Roll call vote – Marks, Kaiser, Neys, Klose, Schlecht and Ova voted aye.

A motion was made by Ova seconded by Marks to transfer Lot 57 West Side Jamestown Reservoir from Robert & Guynell Klein to Kevin Walski contingent on all required transfer items being completed. Motion carried.

Dennis Lorenz, County Park Superintendent, gave his monthly report. He presented the campground receipts to date for Lakeside Marina and Pelican Point Landing. Receipts were down \$11,500 at the

Marina and down over \$40,000 at Pelican Point. Neys made a motion seconded by Schlecht to waive the County's share of the campground revenue at Pelican Point Landing. Motion carried.

Lorenz reported that most winterization projects had been completed and they would complete buttoning everything up for the season.

A motion to adjourn was made by Neys and seconded by Kaiser. At 7:00 p.m. the October 2009 County Park Board meeting was adjourned.

At 7:01 p.m. the regular Commission meeting was called back to order with all Commissioners present.

Marks made a motion seconded by Ova to approve payment of the monthly bills. Roll call vote – Ova, Marks, Kaiser, Neys and Klose voted aye.
